


### OVERVIEW

In February 2020, a total of 10,907 movements were observed across Ethiopia's five flow monitoring points (FMPs). This represents a 5% increase in daily average movement in comparison with January 2020 when an average of 359 movements per day were observed. A total of 7,885 movements were observed leaving Ethiopia, of which 3,977 (50%) were going to the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia (KSA). 3,022 movements were entering Ethiopia, of which 2,313 (77%) were observed coming from Sudan.

For incoming movements, bus/truck was the most often cited means of transportation with 78.3% responses, 9.3% traveled on foot, while 8.7% travelled by taxis or cars, 2.4% traveled by boat, and 1.3% used other means of transport. Similarly, most outgoing movements relied on buses or trucks (65%), while 11.9% took place by train and 10.3% used taxis or cars. 8.6% of the movements took place on foot, 1.1% utilized motorbikes and the remaining 2.9% used other means of transport.

The majority of the observed population was male (68%), while 32% was female. 8% of those moving were children, out of which close to three quarters were boys.




### VULNERABILITY PROFILE




### MOVEMENT ILLUSTRATION




### NATIONALITIES OF PEOPLE ON THE MOVE
