New Urban Gardening Outreach Program

A new program is being initiated at CWMI in response to interest from community gardening groups in urban areas of New York State to provide more complete information about the levels of contaminants in urban soils. Typically, urban garden sites are located on abandoned properties that might have a history of contamination. At the same time, increasing interest in creating green and food-producing spaces within cities means that we need to find ways to assess contamination and minimize the exposure of gardeners to soil contaminants. We will be working with community gardening groups to test soils and provide gardeners with information on how to use test results to make decisions about best gardening practices. Contaminants in Soils and Residuals

CWMI is working on simpler and more interpretable soil tests for trace elements and toxic metals in soils and residuals. Quick field tests have been developed for copper, zinc and lead by Dr. Murray McBride (see: http://cwmi.css.cornell.edu/quicktest.pdf).
