UNITED STATES COMMISSIONERS AND MAGISTRATE JUDGES: AN INTRODUCTION

In 1793, Congress authorized the federal circuit courts to appoint discreet persons learned in the law to set bail in federal criminal cases. The appointees were formally named commissioners in 1817, by which time they could also take affidavits and conduct depositions in civil cases. In 1842, Congress authorized the commissioners to issue arrest warrants and hold persons over for trial. Over the years, their duties continued to grow to include, among other things, resolution of seamen's wage disputes, conduct of extradition hearings, enforcement of the internal revenue laws, and issuance of process to enforce the 1866 Civil Rights Act.

In 1896, Congress changed the title of the position to United States Commissioner. The United States Commissioners were appointed for a four-year term, but were subject to removal by the district court at any time. United States Commissioners received fees pursuant to a schedule which was not adjusted until 1946. Despite this, some United States Commissioners earned two to three times the salary of a district judge during prohibition. This eventually led to the institution of a fixed salary in 1946.

In 1968, Congress enacted the Federal Magistrates Act. The Act abolished the office of United States Commissioner and created the office of United States Magistrate. By July 1, 1971, the new magistrate system had totally replaced the former commissioner system.

The Federal Magistrate Act of 1979 greatly expanded the authority of magistrates to include the conduct of civil and criminal misdemeanor trials. The 1979 legislation also created a system for the merit selection of magistrates.

Thereafter, pursuant to the Civil Justice Reform Act of 1990, the title of the office was changed to United States Magistrate Judge.
