COMFORTS PILOT'S MOM + ZIONIST LEADER PASSES

WASHINGTON—President Eisenhower took a few minutes off from his international problems at the White House this week to comfort a 72-year-old orthodox Jewish woman, the mother of his World War II pilot. She is Mrs. Max Freedman of Wilkes-Barre, Pa. Mrs. Freedman and her husband set out for Florida to visit their son, Jerome, the President's pilot, when Chief of Staff, some two weeks ago, but the husband died enroute. After the mourning period, the President contacted another son, Seymour, in Washington and invited Mrs. Freedman to the White House.

NEW YORK—Death at 63 came last Saturday to Dr. Hayim Greenberg, member of the Jewish Agency Executive and leading philosopher of the Labor Zionist movement, at his home here. On the Zionist scene for more than 35 years as an editor, essayist, orator and political theoretician, he played a leading role in the United Nations deliberations which led to the establishment of the State of Israel by winning over many of the Latin American delegates. He was born in 1889 in Bessarabia and came to this country in 1924.

NEW YORK—Speaking at the opening of the 1953 UJA of New York Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver assailed as "mischievous" the propaganda being spread by pro-Arab elements that the U. S. has especially favored Israel by pouring fabulous sums into the country. He pointed out that since its founding Israel has received \$276,000,000, half of which was in the form of a loan being repaid at 3 1/2% interest. In contrast, the U. S. has given a total of \$30,000,000,000 to countries receiving such aid in the first five post-war years.

American Notables

Founder of "Temporary Israel"

In Mordecai Manuel Noah, patriotism for the young Republic and loyalty to ancient Judaism were twin passions. Born in 1785, he listened to first hand accounts of suffering and victory from the veterans of the Revolution. In his native Philadelphia, he could watch Congress deliberating through the administrations of the first and second Presidents. His grandfather James Phillips would point out the venerable figures of Franklin and Washington walking the streets of the then national capital. Voracious reading in the libraries of America's intellectual center supplemented an inadequate education and prepared the boy for his future roles as orator, playwright, editor, judge, politician and office holder. As a young man he displayed ability, for in his 26th year, he was offered a consulship at Riga. But with Napoleon preparing to invade Russia, there was no point in accepting. Instead he went to Charleston, where his mother was buried. Philadelphia was on the decline since the national capital had moved to the muddy flats on the Potomac. Charleston seemed to offer a better opportunity to study law and enter politics, especially since it contained the leading Jewish community in the 17 States of the Republic. Here he quickly made sufficient impact to draw three challenges on the field of honor. In a duel he wounded his opponent and was thereafter known as the "Major." His speech making and journalism must have been valued at Washington. He soon received the appointment as U. S. Consul at Tunis.

Bundestag Ratifies Israel Pact

ISRAEL EXPOSITION OPENS AT BRADFORD ON FRIDAY

An economically strong Israel, integrated with the free world's trade, can thwart Russian aggression in the Middle East, Senator John F. Kennedy declared at a press preview of the Israel Exposition on Tuesday. "The exhibit is impressive," the Senator said, "because it shows Israel's ability and determination to overcome the great obstacle of converting from a pastoral to an industrial economy. This evidence of economic maturity gratifies those of us who put our faith in the young democracy at its start five years ago," he said. "Our faith was well placed, for American assistance has been put to good use." 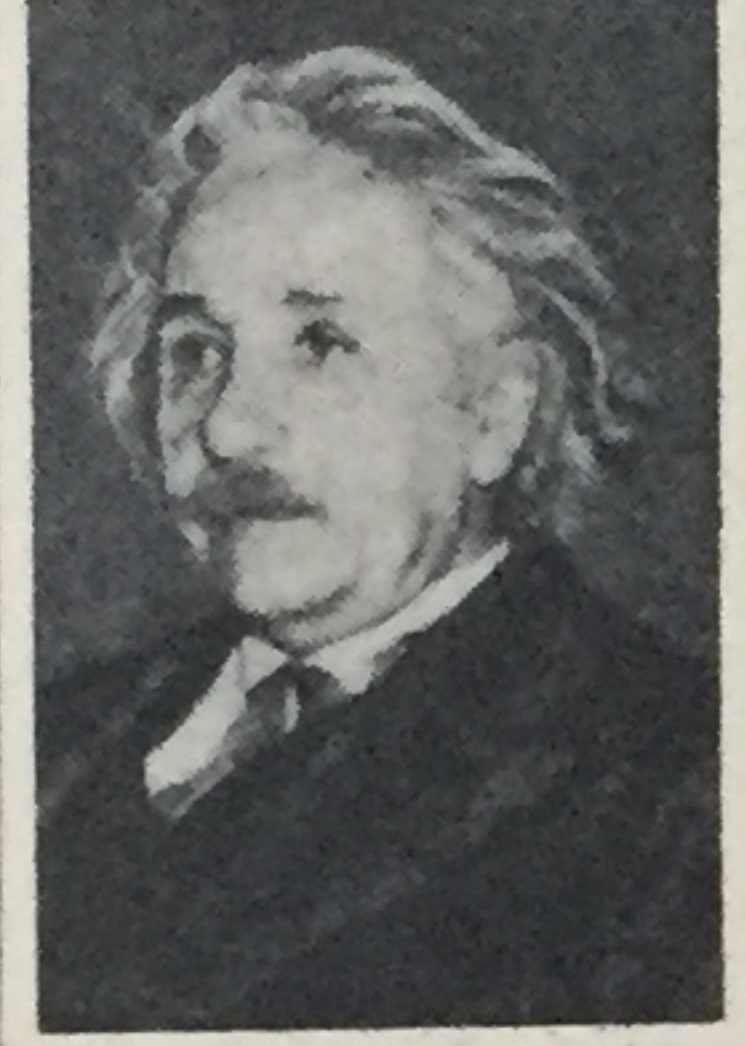

Advocate Editor To See the Pope

ABOARD THE S.S. ILE DE FRANCE—We are on the first leg of our trip to the State of Israel, scheduled to reach there in time for the first Passover Seder. In the weeks to come I shall pen some of my impressions of the various cities of Europe visited and what is taking place in the young democracy of Israel. This little country in the Middle East has become a focal point in international politics. We shall fly to Israel from Rome. Through the good offices of His Excellency, the Most Rev. Richard J. Cushing, Archbishop of Boston, we are looking forward to an audience with the Pope. Governor Christian Herter and Mayor John B. Hynes are sending, through us, special messages of friendship to Prime Minister David Ben-Gurion and gifts of historical import. We carry with us replicas of America's Declaration of Independence and other Americana, which denote the close spiritual relationship between the United States of America and the State of Israel. We anticipate with keenest pleasure seeing Israel from the heights of Gallilee down to the Negev and from the Sharon Valley to the border of Transjordan. Spain May Return Two Kidnapped Jewish Boys

PARIS (JTA)—Negotiations were going on with Spanish civil and religious authorities this week for the return of two Jewish boys, Gerald and Robert Finlay, who were spirited out of France to Spain by priests after the war orphans must be turned over to an aunt living in Israel. It was reported here that the return of the children to France appeared imminent. More than a dozen persons, including a number of clergymen and two nuns, have been arrested in the aftermath to the children's disappearance. West Germany to Make Restitution For Nazi Depredations Against Jews

BONN (Special)—The West German Government's reparations agreement with the State of Israel was ratified last night by the Bundestag (lower house of Parliament) and now goes to the Bundesrat (upper house) for its final reading. Since the Bundesrat unanimously approved the pact at an earlier reading, its adoption there will only be a formality. Thus the Federal Republic has undertaken to make partial restitution for the crimes committed by the Nazis against the Jewish people. The agreement provides payments to Israel totaling \$714,000,000 and additional payments of \$110,714,000 that Israel is to transmit to world Jewish organizations to reimburse them for expenses incurred in aiding Jewish refugees. The Federal Government also will allocate \$11,904,000 for distribution to victims of Nazi persecution who are domiciled abroad but who no longer are members of the Jewish faith and do not receive aid from Jewish organizations. The number of annual payments will be subject to negotiation between the West German and Israel Governments, but it is believed that the payments will be spread over a twelve-to-fourteen-year period. The ratification bill, which was submitted by the Adenauer Government received a substantial majority, but there also were a number of negative votes and absentions. Two hundred and thirty-eight Deputies voted for ratification, and thirty-four—Communists, extreme Rightists and some members See REPARATIONS (Continued on Page 9)

GOLDA MYERSON TO HEAD ISRAEL DELEGATION AT UN

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. (Special)—Golda Myerson, Israel Minister of Labor, will take over as head of the Israel delegation to the United Nations, it was announced here this week. She will replace Abba S. Eban, Israel Ambassador to the United States, who had filled both posts. Mr. Eban will remain in Washington. Mrs. Myerson, who was Israel's first Minister to Moscow, will guide the presentation of charges Israel is expected to make of anti-Semitism in the Soviet Union and the satellite states in the current General Assembly session. The debate on this question is expected to begin next week under the terms of a generally worded Polish proposal to consider measures to "strengthen peace and friendship among the nations." Israel's only woman Cabinet member, Mrs. Myerson was born in the Ukraine, brought to Wisconsin at the age of 8 and went to Palestine in 1921.

L. Kaganovitch: Short Biography

The reconstruction of the Soviet Government, following Stalin's death, resulted in Lazar Kaganovitch, the 59-year-old son of a Jewish shoemaker, being appointed to one of the highest posts in the Russian administration. With Malenkov as Premier, Kaganovitch has been appointed first Deputy-Premier—there are four Deputy Prime Ministers—or, to use the Russian terminology, Deputy Chairman of the Council of Ministers of the USSR. He is also one of the ten members of the reconstructed Presidium of the Communist Party. Kaganovitch was no relation of Stalin. It is not true, as some papers report, that Stalin married his daughter or his niece. His appointment and the honor given to him of heading the seven-member commission charged with making the arrangements for Stalin's funeral were due to the fact that he was the dead ruler's most trusted comrade. As first Deputy-Premier, Kaganovitch will be responsible for the supervision of Russia's heavy and light industries and also for materials supplied to the war factories. He will thus virtually control one of the most vital sections of Russia's industrial life. Lazar Kaganovitch is considered to be the best administrator in the Soviet Union and, while Stalin was alive, he was moved from place to place all over the country wherever executive ability, organizational skill and energy were needed. He played a leading role in the organization of the Red Army and in the building of the Moscow subway. See KAGANOVITCH (Continued on Page 9)

WASHINGTON (JCF)—The recent Arab suggestion that the departure of the Democratic Party means for Israel a disappearance of the "good old days," coupled with the emergence of something in the nature of a pro-Arab campaign in certain sections of the American press, is causing concern and a certain amount of bewilderment among Israel circles in the United States. The concern and bewilderment are of recent development.
