What you learned working on this objective or workflow:

Did anything unexpected (good or bad) happen?

The content drafting process for the modules became a valuable best practices conversation amongst team members and helped consolidate knowledge from years of working with harassment issues. We anticipate seeing some improvement in our own alignment on cases because of it.

On the downside, we experienced a lack of community interest in the module design despite early expressions of interest. We are trying a different approach involving interactive prototypes to see if we can inspire further feedback in this quarter.

What would you do differently if you had to do it again?

We would provide more time for the first draft content phase. The support team and its workflows have become far better defined, and it is clear that we need to retain more flexibility to deal with unexpected opportunities and challenges.

Did you struggle with anything?

Content drafting was delayed by Board reports and early planning for upcoming AP. However, ground was largely made up by mid-December.

What you learned working on this objective or workflow:

Did anything unexpected (good or bad) happen?

#EduWiki social media campaign unearthed some tension between the Education Collab (the lead implementers of the campaign) and some local affiliates (not represented in the Collab). This resulted in several good conversations to reflect on the role of the Collab and how an activity like this could be better coordinated with local affiliates in the future.

What would you do differently if you had to do it again?

Increased involvement of affiliates and Collab members in designing and implementing a local campaign is essential.

We are engaged in a conversation with the Collab to determine if these types of campaigns are part of their mandate to support global programs, and how to ensure involvement of any interested affiliates.

Did you struggle with anything?

This gray area (in Collab scope) required conversations with the Collab members and with several affiliates around the world. The conversations aimed to identify possible scope creep of the group and refocus on the original purpose of the Collab. Some were hard, but all were worthwhile!

What you learned working on this objective or workflow:

Did anything unexpected (good or bad) happen?

Good) We approved our first round of access signups using the *Wikipedia Library Card* Platform, without support from Engineering! Our partners are responding well to the coming switch to proxy access, including *automatic bundled access without requiring individual signups*. We counted our “collection” and it has over 80,000 unique journals not including books! Use of TWL pages continues to be very high, nearly 350k views in Q2 alone, and that doesn’t include usage of publisher sources.

Mixed) We thought we pushed hard on negotiations with Academia.edu to include their free-to-read papers in OABot; however, the open access community is pushing back on the collaboration with a for-profit repository--we need to reevaluate.

Bad) There is little sign of new programmatic activity in the 22 existing Wikipedia Library branches outside of English. We just backfilled our global support role with a contractor after Alex Stinson moved to GLAM, but there is disappointingly little momentum nonetheless.

What would you do differently if you had to do it again?

Prioritize the hire for Global Coordinator so it happened at the beginning of the quarter not the end. Initiate a thematic/usergroup for Wikipedia + Libraries sooner (now planned for Q3).

Did you struggle with anything?

Volunteer engagement beyond English Wikipedia is still challenging; we need to be more distributed. Lack of documentation for Wikimedia Labs made deploying the Library Card Platform more complicated than it needed to be for our dev.

What you learned working on this objective or workflow:

Did anything unexpected (good or bad) happen?

Structured Data on Commons grant proposal took off! The outcomes of that are very good, and an unexpected win for an important tech need. At the same time, it necessarily shifted focus away from other GLAM priorities.

What would you do differently if you had to do it again?

Avoid scheduling travel in multi-week blocks: it disrupts ongoing workflows and communications too much.

Did you struggle with anything?

Early notification and communications for #1lib1ref were a bit delayed because of unplanned workloads and current events.

Missed a number of volunteer engagement opportunities in the GLAM-Wiki space, such as talking to program leaders and raising awareness of community-led projects (because core strategic GLAM support for technical advocacy and knowledge documentation took precedence). We're not yet resourced to do both, unfortunately.
