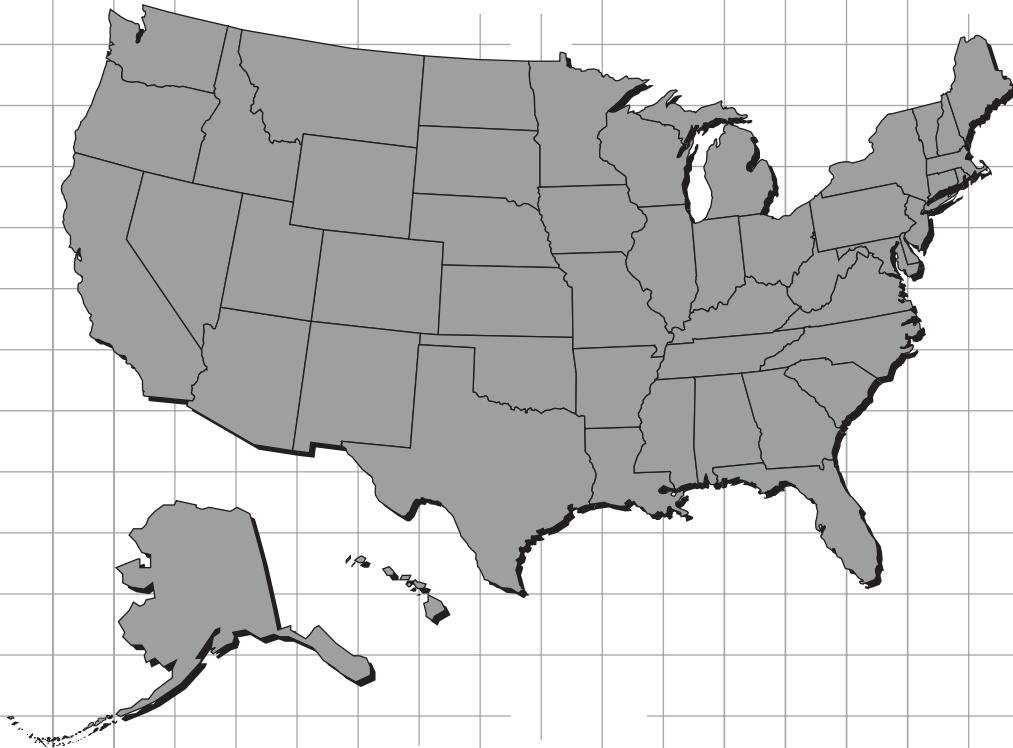

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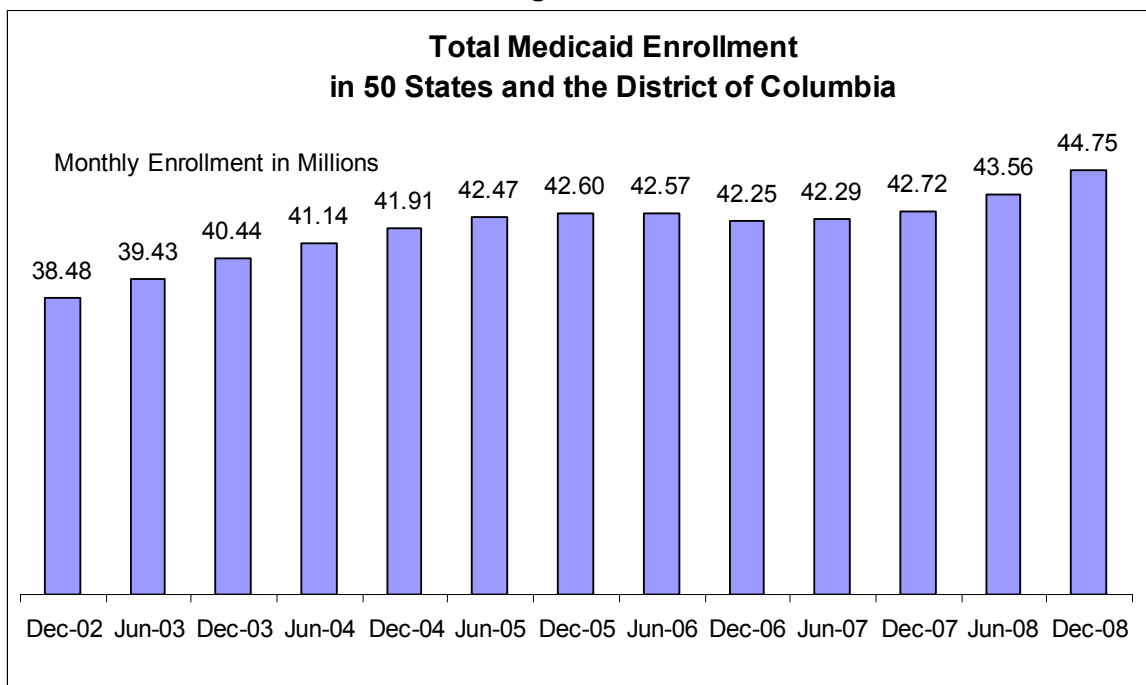
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Executive Summary

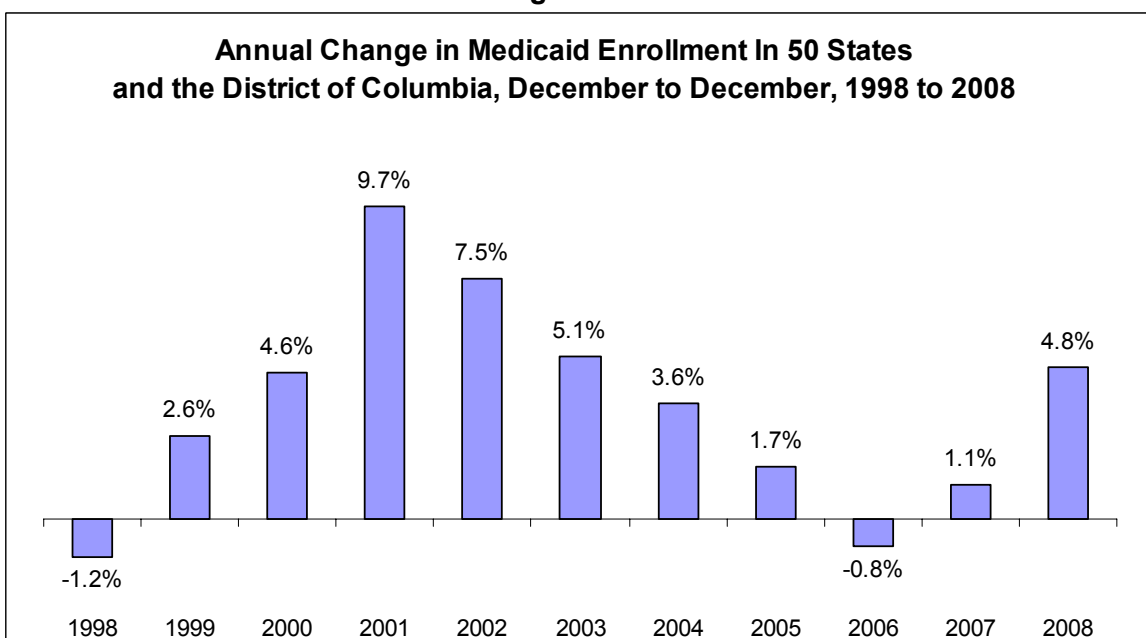
In December 2008, a year into the current economic recession, Medicaid programs enrolled 44.75 million individuals in the 50 states and the District of Columbia, a 4.8% increase from the previous December (Figures ES-1 and ES-2).¹

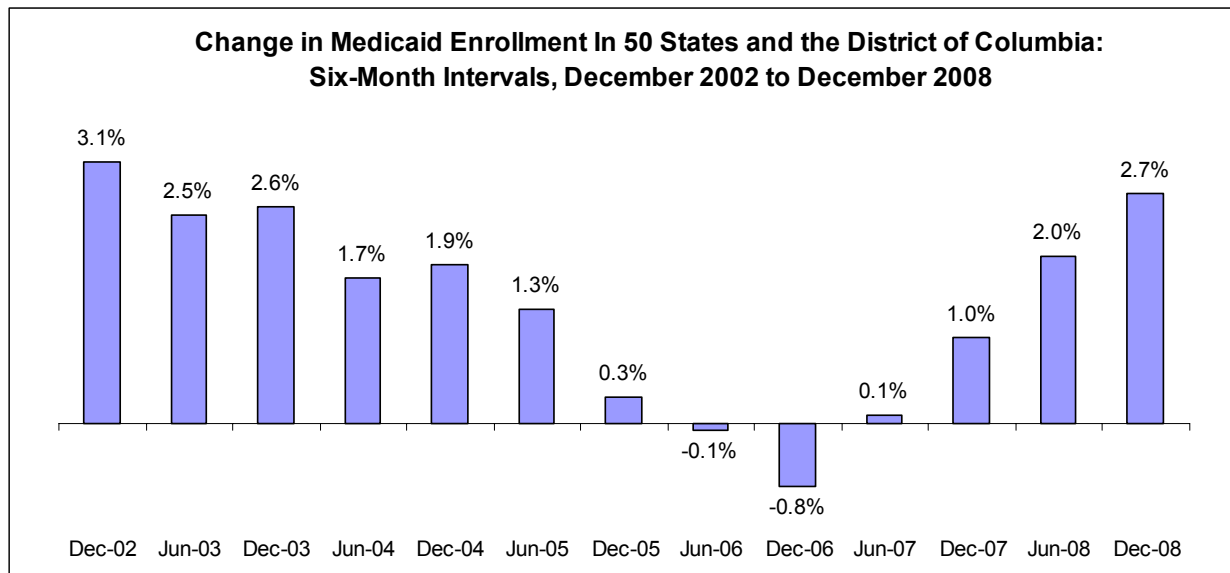

The current economic recession began in December of 2007. Medicaid directors indicated that the slowing economy was the primary factor contributing to increased Medicaid enrollment, as individuals lost jobs and employer-sponsored insurance and incomes declined. In some states, enrollment was also affected by modest policy actions designed to expand Medicaid enrollment to the growing number of uninsured individuals.²

In the first half of the year (December 2007 to June 2008), national Medicaid enrollment increased by 846,000 individuals (or 2.0%), followed by a 1.18 million (2.7%) increase from June 2008 to December 2008 (Figure ES-3). Higher Medicaid enrollment growth during the second six-month interval of this one-year period could be expected given the rise in the unemployment rate, from 4.9% in December 2007 to 7.2% in December 2008.³

From 2006 to 2007, enrollment of children increased at about the same rate as enrollment of adults (including parents, pregnant women, and aged and disabled individuals). However, from December 2007 to December 2008, enrollment growth for children was higher than for adults. Enrollment of children in Medicaid rose by 5.1%, while adult enrollment increased by 4.2% during this time period.

Enrollment of aged and disabled individuals in Medicaid increased by 3.4% from December 2007 to December 2008, according to data from the 46 states that could separate out this group. During this period, enrollment of families, children and pregnant women increased by 5.6% in these same 46 states. All but two states experienced enrollment increases in this population category. As national Medicaid enrollment rose by 4.8% from December 2007 to December 2008, individual state enrollment ranged from a 4.1% decline to a 16.8% increase.

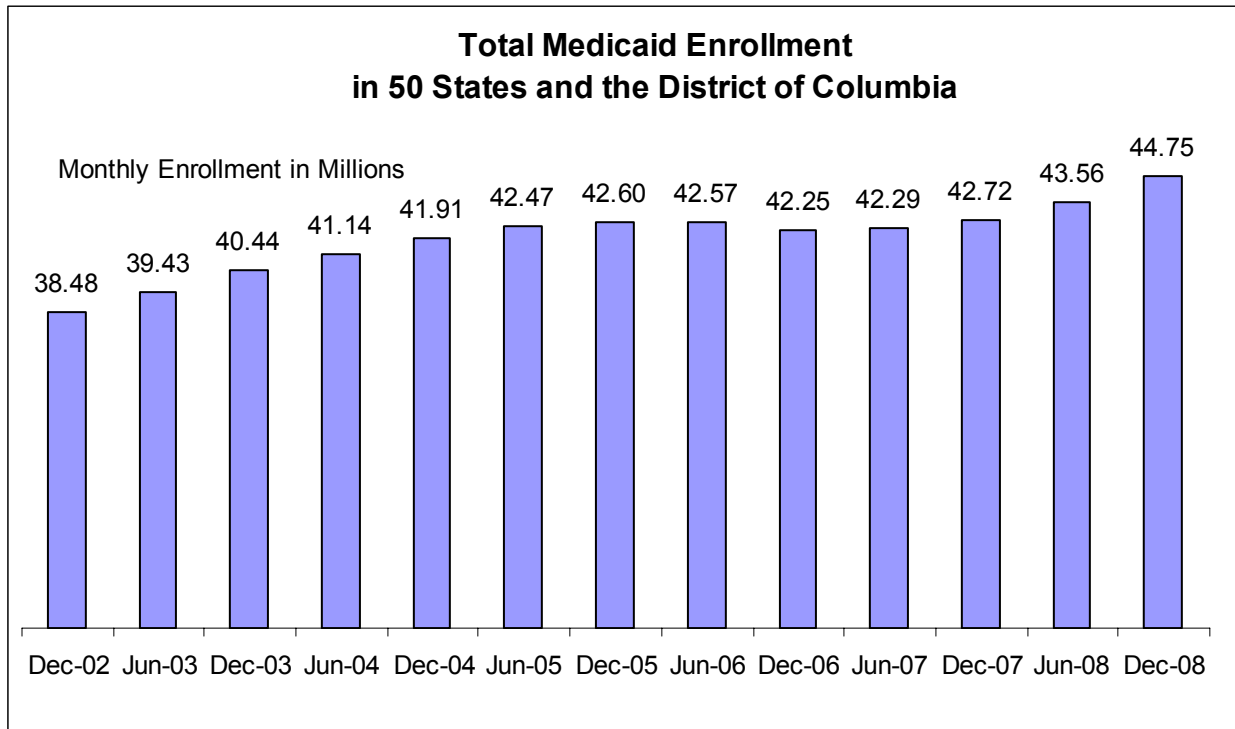
As the recession deepened, unemployment rose from 7.2% in December 2008 to 10.0% in November 2009.⁴ This increase in the unemployment rate leads to a projected rise in both the uninsured and the number of individuals eligible for and enrolled in state Medicaid programs after December 2008. The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) provided enhanced Medicaid matching funds to states from October 1, 2008 through December 31, 2010, which has been critical in helping states maintain Medicaid eligibility levels and enrollment. Despite fiscal challenges, some states expanded eligibility and simplified application and renewal processes for Medicaid enrollment in fiscal year 2009.

Total Medicaid Enrollment in the 50 States and D.C.

All 50 states and the District of Columbia provided data on the total number of individuals enrolled in their Medicaid programs for each June and December from June 1997 to December 2008. These data show that after declining from June 1997 to December 1998, total enrollment increased for seven consecutive years, declined slightly during 2006, and then increased again from December 2006 to December 2008.

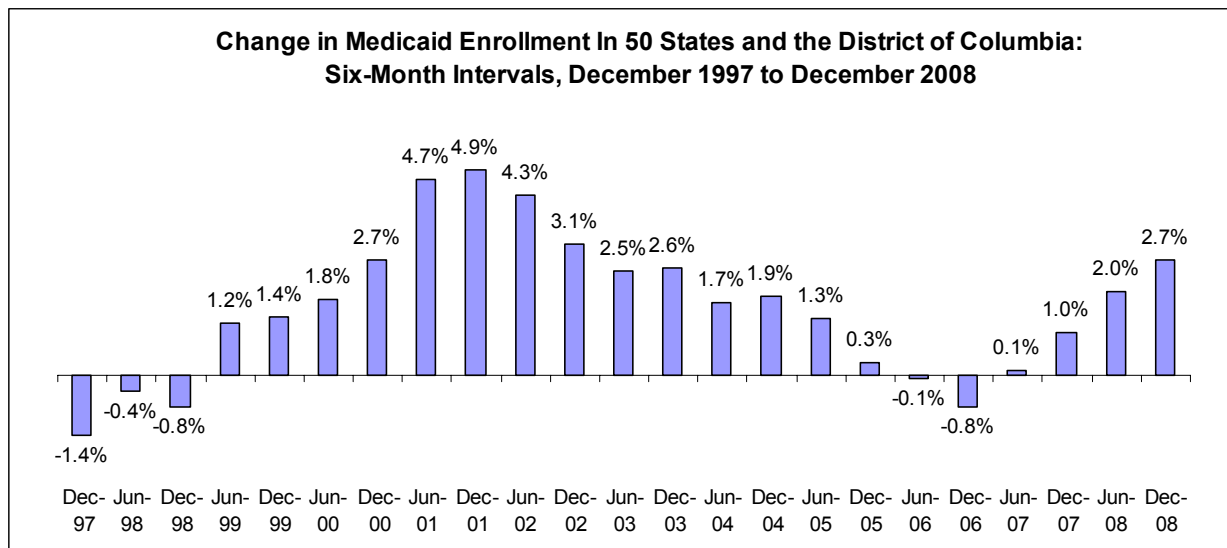
Since December 2006, Medicaid enrollment has increased in each six-month interval and has grown at an increasing rate. From December 2007 to December 2008, national Medicaid enrollment increased by 2.03 million. The enrollment of 44.75 million individuals in Medicaid in December 2008 represents an all-time high for Medicaid enrollment (See Figures 1, 2, and 3). As national Medicaid enrollment rose, individual state enrollment varied (Tables 1a and 1b).

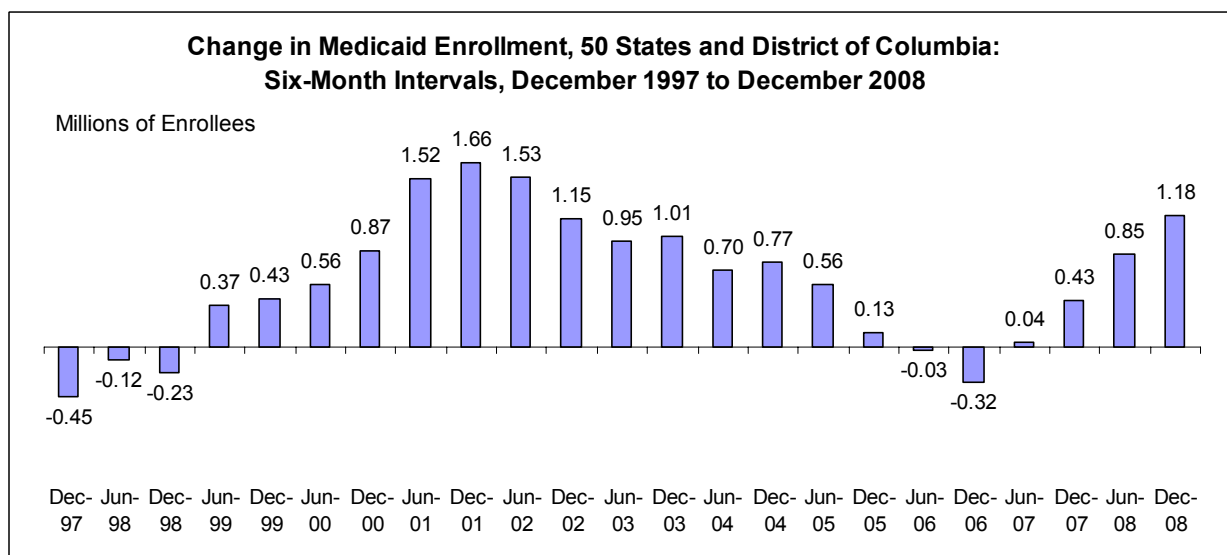

Variations in Medicaid Enrollment by State⁵

While national Medicaid enrollment increased by 4.8% from December 2007 to December 2008, enrollment growth varied widely by state (Table 1b and Figure 4). Forty-six states and DC experienced enrollment increases, while only four states had enrollment decreases. In separate studies by the Kaiser Commission on Medicaid and the Uninsured and Health Management Associates, each of these states reported the factors that contributed to enrollment changes in their states during this time period.⁶

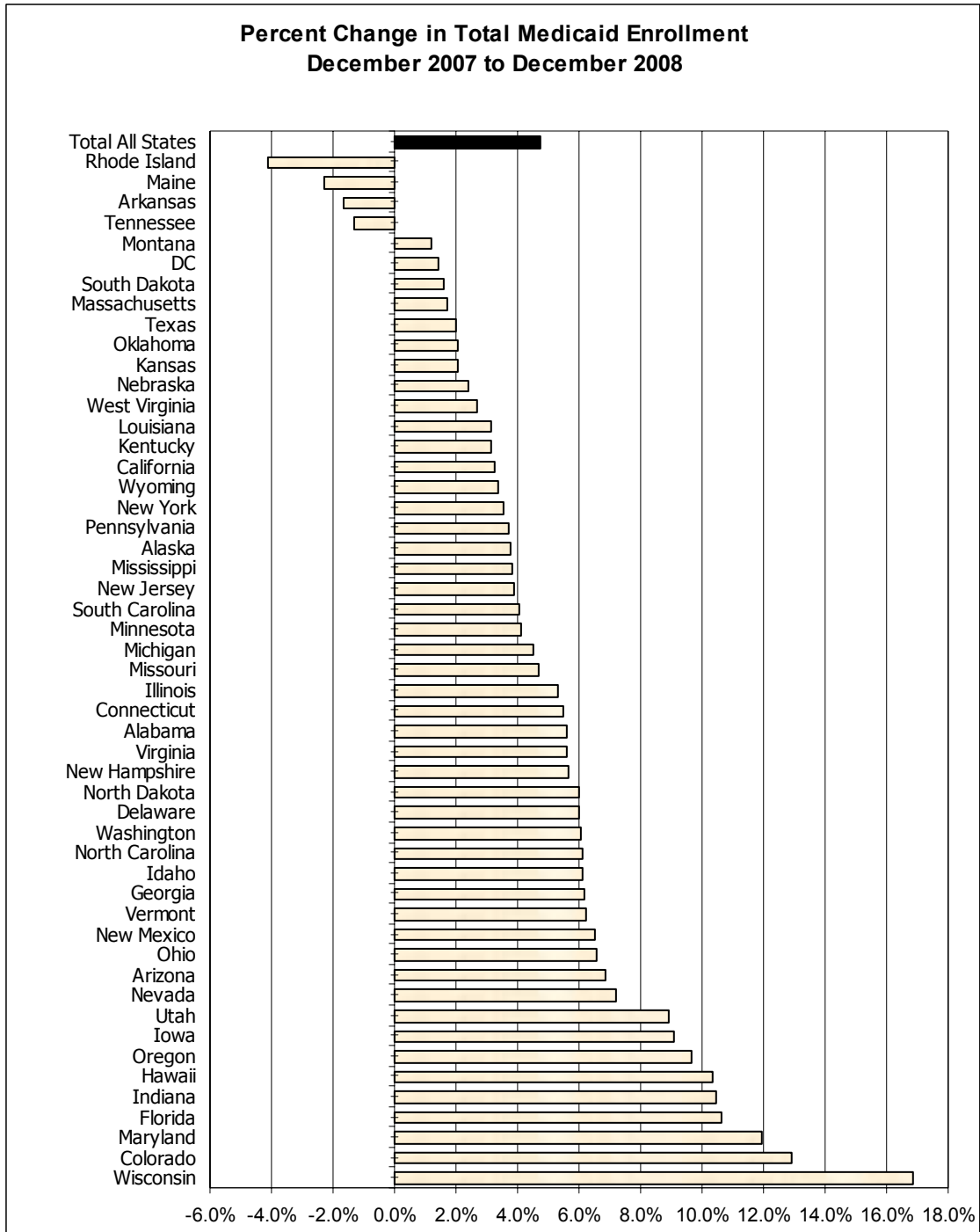
States with Enrollment Decreases: Four states- Arkansas, Maine, Rhode Island, and Tennessee- experienced a decline in enrollment from December 2007 to December 2008.

- **Arkansas** enrollment declined by 1.7% after decreasing in the first half of the year and then slightly increasing in the second half of the year. The enrollment drop occurred entirely among children, which state officials largely attribute to staffing issues.
- **Maine** enrollment declined by 2.3%, due to constriction of the state's childless adult Medicaid waiver.
- **Rhode Island** enrollment declined by 4.1%. State officials indicate that the decline was due in part to citizenship documentation and identification requirements of the Deficit Reduction Act of 2005 (DRA).⁷ The state also added premiums for children in families from 133%-150% of the federal poverty level and increased premium cost-sharing for other families. In October 2008, the state reduced income eligibility for parents from 185% to 175% of the federal poverty level.
- **Tennessee** enrollment declined by 1.3% from December 2007 to December 2008, entirely among adults. State officials attribute this decline to a policy change regarding a specific group of approximately 150,000 enrollees who used to receive Supplemental Security Income (SSI) but no longer do. After many years of litigation to prevent this population from being disenrolled, the state's Medicaid program was authorized to re-verify those individuals' eligibility for Medicaid. This re-verification process led to a decline in enrollment.

States with Enrollment Increases: Three states- Colorado, Maryland, and Wisconsin- experienced enrollment growth that exceeded approximately 12% from December 2007 to December 2008.

- **Colorado** experienced a 12.9% enrollment increase. Within this total, enrollment of children increased by 16.2%. State officials attribute this increase to both marketing and outreach efforts and the declining economy. Additionally, presumptive eligibility was implemented in January 2008 and the state simplified eligibility verification and renewal.
- **Maryland** experienced an 11.9% enrollment increase, with a large increase in child enrollment and a decline in adult enrollment. In 2008, legislation was passed directing the use of personal income tax forms to identify children who might be eligible for public programs. Outreach notices were sent to families to inform them about program eligibility.⁸ State officials cite the economy as another factor that led to the enrollment increase.
- **Wisconsin** experienced a 16.8% enrollment increase, with a large increase for both children and adults. While Wisconsin officials cite the economy as one factor in this increase, they indicate that program expansions were even more significant. BadgerCare Plus was implemented on February 1, 2008, which expanded coverage to all children, regardless of family income, and expanded coverage for parents.

Medicaid Enrollment Trends by Category

In addition to tracking trends in total enrollment, this study also collected data to show the distribution of enrollees by category of eligibility whenever states are able to provide these data.

Children versus Adults (All States)

All states provided data on enrollment of children versus adults for each June and December, starting with June 2006. States use slightly different ages to define who is a child or an adult, with the definition of adult typically beginning between age 19 and 21. In most states those enrolled in a child category are counted as children even if they are age 18 or older. (See notes in Appendix B for age definitions by state and other variations.) Since each state used consistent definitions and age splits from year-to-year, the information provides an accurate picture of Medicaid enrollment trends for children versus adults.

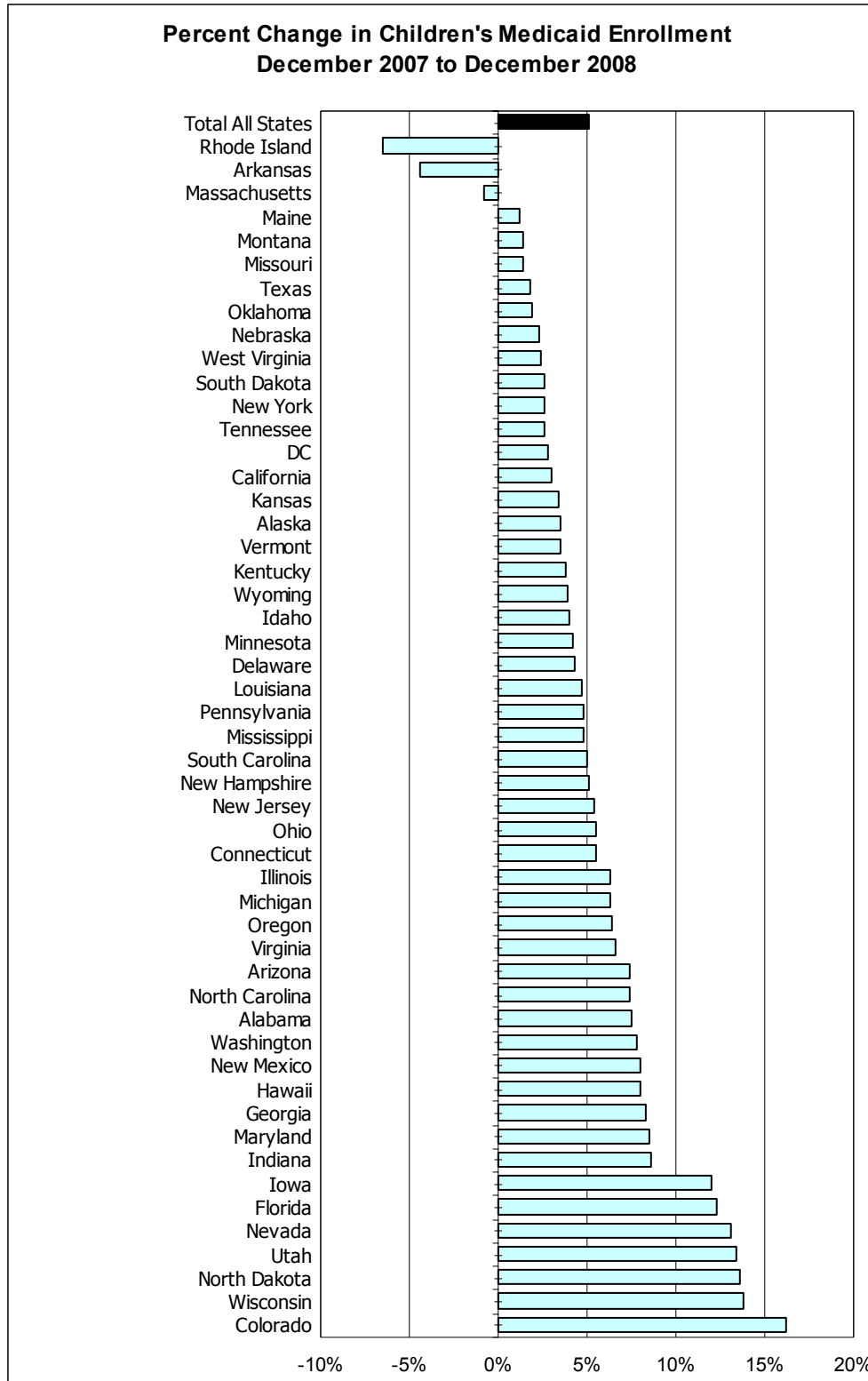
From 2006 to 2007 the enrollment of children increased at about the same rate as the enrollment of adults, but from 2007 to 2008 the growth rate for child enrollment was greater than for adults. Enrollment of adults in Medicaid was 4.2% greater in December 2008 than in December 2007, while enrollment of children increased by 5.1% over the same period (Table 2).⁹ As previously noted, total Medicaid enrollment increased by 4.8% from December 2007 to December 2008. Table 2 and Figures 5 and 6 show that for these two categories there was significant variation in the enrollment changes among the states from December 2007 to December 2008.

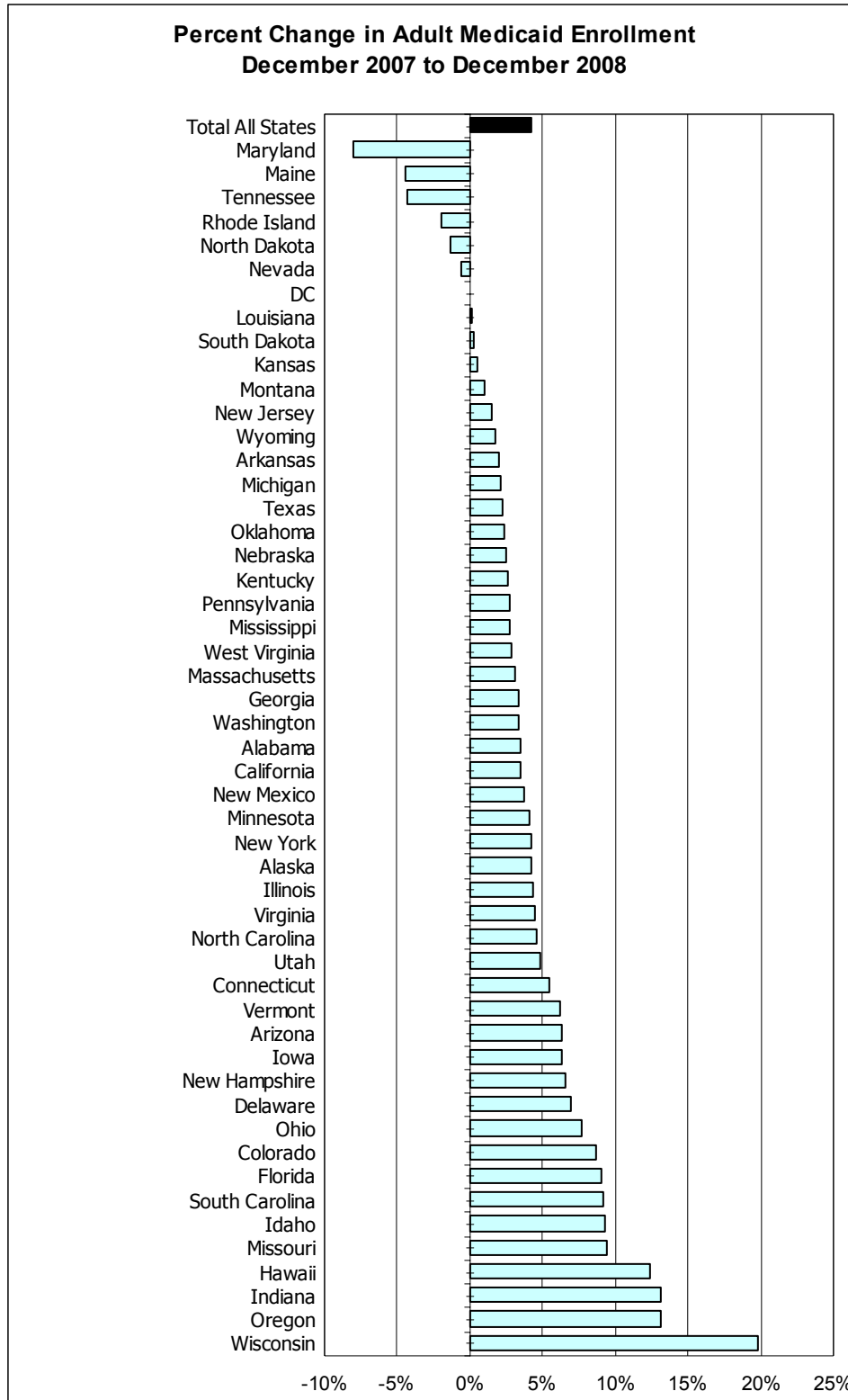

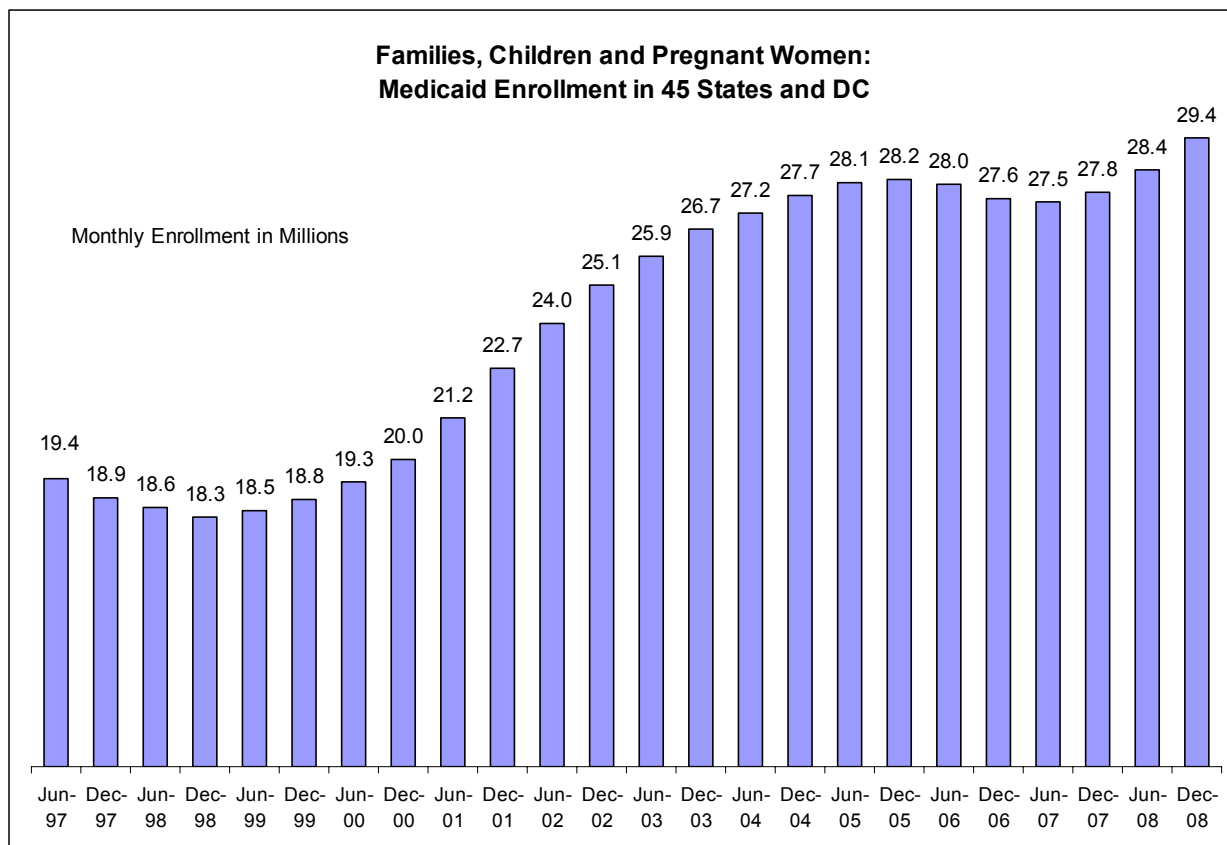

Families, Children and Pregnant Women (45 States and the District of Columbia)

Forty-five states and the District of Columbia, representing 92.0% of total U.S. Medicaid enrollment, provided data on the number of children, parents, and pregnant women enrolled in Medicaid from June 1997 to December 2008. After an initial period of decline, enrollment in this category increased in every six-month interval from December 1998 to December 2005 and then decreased from December 2005 to June 2007. From December 2007 to December 2008, enrollment in this category increased by nearly 1.6 million individuals (5.6%) to 29.4 million (See Figure 7 and Table 3).

Only two states, Arkansas (-4.5%) and Rhode Island (-6.0%), experienced enrollment declines in this category from December 2007 to December 2008 (Table 3).

Three states (Colorado, Maryland, and Wisconsin) experienced enrollment increases in this category that exceeded 16.0% during this time period. Five states had enrollment increases that exceeded 90,000 individuals. They were California (164,500), Florida (186,400), New York (110,600), Illinois (99,100), and Wisconsin (90,700).

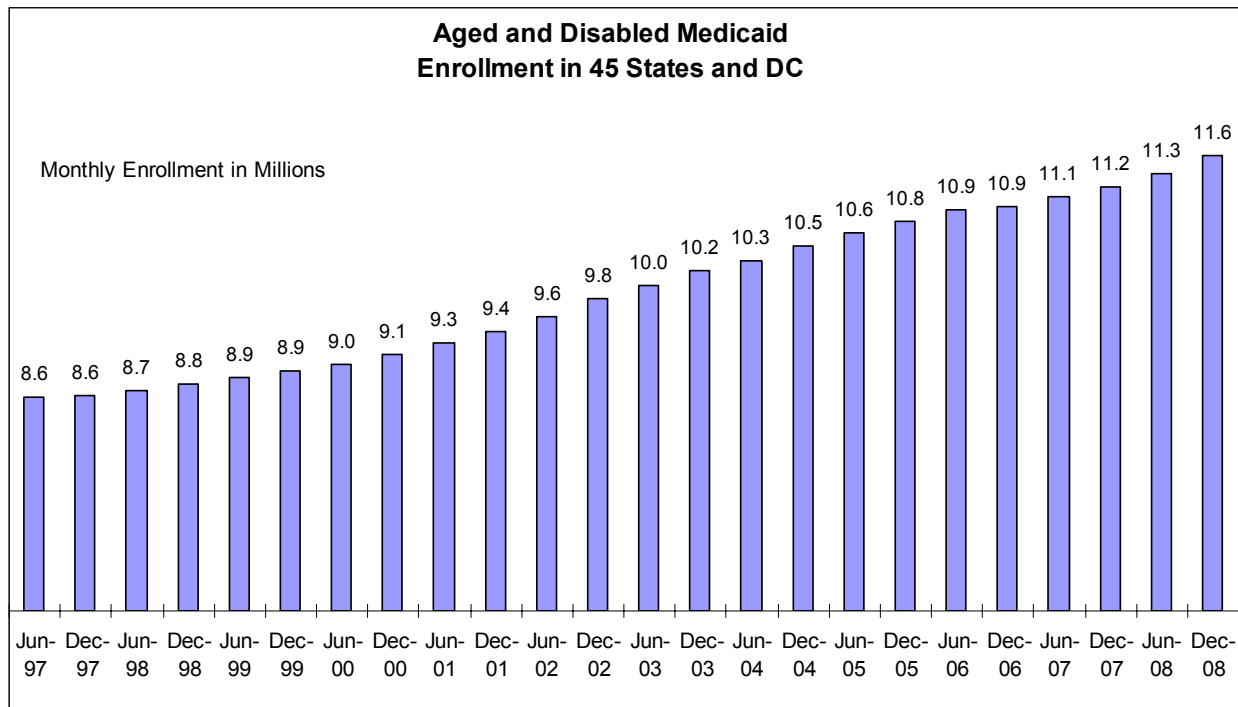

Aged and Disabled (45 States and the District of Columbia)

This category includes aged, blind, and disabled individuals with full Medicaid benefits or Medicaid with a deductible (“spend down”) and an estimated 1.88 million low-income Medicare beneficiaries who do not receive direct Medicaid benefits but are enrolled in the “Medicare Savings Program” component of Medicaid. This program provides varying levels of assistance with Medicare premiums, deductibles, and coinsurance.¹⁰ In December 2008, 11.6 million aged and disabled individuals were enrolled in Medicaid.¹¹

Forty-five states and the District of Columbia, representing 92.0% of total U.S. Medicaid enrollment, provided data on the number of aged and disabled enrolled in Medicaid from June 1997 to December 2008. While Medicaid enrollment of families, children and pregnant women has fluctuated, Medicaid enrollment of the aged and disabled has increased in every six-month interval covered by this study (Figure 8).

Table 4 shows that within the 3.4% average increase from December 2007 to December 2008, there is some state-to-state variation. However only three states (Idaho, Missouri, and Wisconsin) had an increase or decrease that was markedly different from the average.¹²

Appendix A: Enrollees with Limited Coverage

Medicaid coverage is generally comprehensive, regardless of eligibility category. However, certain Medicaid eligibility categories provide coverage for only limited services. Enrollment in these categories has been increasing. To the extent possible, these enrollees are excluded from the total Medicaid enrollment numbers in this report.

Family Planning Waivers

One limited coverage category is a family planning waiver in which women are enrolled in Medicaid for services related only to family planning. These waiver enrollees are not included in the Medicaid enrollment totals for this report. As of December 2008, 26 states had implemented family planning waivers, the most recent being Pennsylvania. The structure and size of these programs varies significantly. While new programs are being implemented, some programs have been scaled back in recent years, as can be seen in the table below.

Total enrollment in family planning waiver programs rose by 4.2% from December 2007 to December 2008. National enrollment in family planning waivers increased by approximately 100,000 individuals from December 2007 to December 2008. This increase is largely due to the recently implemented Pennsylvania waiver and to enrollment growth in Louisiana's waiver program.

The other states with approved family planning waivers that had been implemented as of December 2008 were New York and Oregon. While data from these states does not appear in the table above, enrollees in these two programs are also excluded from the Medicaid enrollment counts in this report. California temporarily changed the method for counting family planning waiver enrollment, which resulted in overstated enrollment in 2006 and early 2007.

Pharmacy Waivers

As of December 2008, approved Pharmacy Plus waivers in Illinois and Wisconsin covered nearly 284,000 senior citizens enrolled in Medicaid for pharmacy services alone. Maine and Vermont also have other Medicaid waivers that offer a pharmacy-only benefit to seniors. In December 2008, Maine's program had about 82,000 enrollees and Vermont's program had about 13,000 enrollees. The enrollees in all four states, a total of about 379,000 for all of the programs, are excluded from the Medicaid enrollment data in this report.

Medicare Savings Program

Another group of enrollees with limited coverage is Medicare beneficiaries who are enrolled in Medicaid for payment of some or all of their Medicare premiums, deductibles and coinsurance, but receive no additional Medicaid benefits. This component of the Medicaid program is known as the Medicare Savings Program. While this program exists in all states, separate data were available from only 27 states which represent 53.5% of total U.S. Medicaid enrollment. In these 27 states, this group of enrollees has increased by 184.7% over the eleven-year period from December 1997 to December 2008. Of particular note is the 33.7% enrollment increase between December 2005 and December 2006, most of which occurred between December 2005 and June 2006. This increase corresponds with the implementation of the Medicare Part D pharmacy program on January 1, 2006. Most of that increase occurred in two states, Florida and Mississippi. With the advent of the Medicare Part D prescription drug benefit, these two states dropped more extensive Medicaid coverage for individuals covered by both Medicare and Medicaid with incomes below the federal poverty level. Under the Medicare Savings Program these states continue to provide assistance with Medicare premiums, deductibles and coinsurance for these low-income Medicare enrollees.

Extrapolation of data from these 27 states to all states would indicate that there may be about 1.88 million Medicare Savings Program enrollees nationwide. Since so many states do not separately track these limited benefit enrollees, they are included in the Medicaid enrollment numbers in this report unless otherwise noted.

Appendix B: Children versus Adults Notes

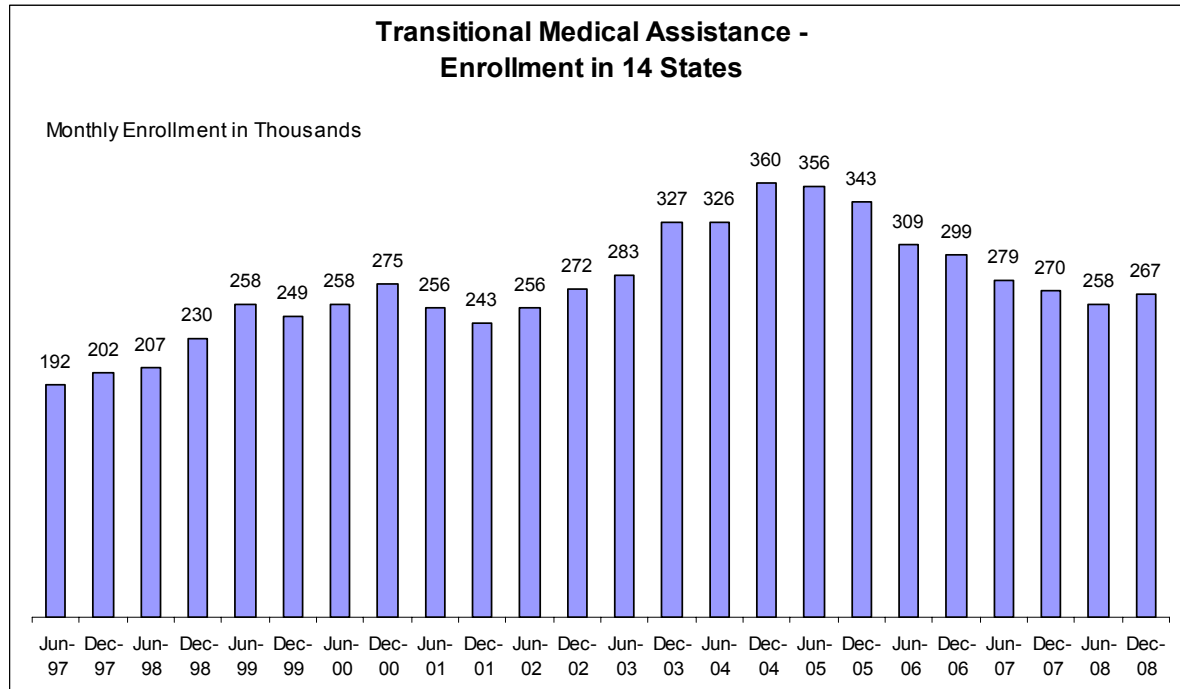
Several states provide data on Medicaid enrollment of children versus adults from a different data source than the source used to report total Medicaid enrollment by category. As a result, there are minor variations between total Medicaid enrollment in Table 2 and the total Medicaid enrollment in Table 1 for some states. The total difference for all states is only about 9,900 individuals. Disabled children are included in the Adult category for all states. Unless indicated otherwise, all non-disabled enrollees are included in the child category if their age is below the threshold noted below.

Family planning enrollees are not included in Table 2 for any state except as noted. CHIP children are not included in Table 2.

- **Alaska** - Enrollees under age 21 are considered Children.
- **Arizona** - Enrollees under age 20 are considered Children.
- **California**- Enrollees under age 21 are considered Children. Figures include a very small number of state-funded-only enrollees.
- **Colorado** - The count of Children includes an estimated 6.1% of Colorado's Non-Citizen Emergency Medical Only category (fewer than 5,000 individuals in December 2006).
- **Delaware** - Enrollees under age 19 are considered Children.
- **Florida** - Enrollees under age 19 are considered Children.
- **Hawaii** – Enrollees under age 21 are considered Children.
- **Illinois** - Enrollees under age 19 are considered Children. The source for the Children versus Adults split is *Illinois Department of Public Aid, Bureau of Rate Development and Analysis*.
- **Iowa** - IowaCare enrollees are included as adults since IowaCare serves primarily childless adults. Neither category (adult or child) contains “undefined” enrollees (fewer than 1,000).
- **Kansas** - Enrollees under age 19 are considered Children.
- **Kentucky** - Enrollees under age 20 are considered Children.
- **Louisiana** - Enrollees under age 21 are considered Children.
- **Maryland** - Enrollees under age 21 are considered Children.
- **Massachusetts** - Enrollees under age 18 are considered Children. Data includes some state-funded only enrollees.
- **Michigan** - Enrollees under age 18 are considered Children.
- **Minnesota** - Enrollees under age 21 are considered Children.
- **Mississippi** - Enrollees under age 21 are considered Children.
- **New Jersey** - Enrollees under age 21 are considered Children.
- **New York** - Neither category contains Family Health Plus and Other enrollees.
- **North Carolina** - Enrollees under age 21 are considered Children.
- **North Dakota** - Adult category includes all poverty related and categorically needy pregnant women, irrespective of age. Neither category contains Refugee enrollees (fewer than 50).
- **South Carolina** - Enrollees under age 19 are considered Children.
- **Tennessee** - Enrollees under age 20 are considered Children.
- **Wisconsin** - Enrollees under age 21 are considered Children.
- **Wyoming** - Neither category contains Refugee and Alien enrollees. All pregnant individuals are included in the Adults category.

Appendix C: Transitional Medical Assistance (TMA) (14 States)

This Medicaid category was created as part of national welfare reform to extend Medicaid eligibility temporarily for uninsured families that no longer qualified for income assistance from the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program or lose Medicaid eligibility due to increased income. Fourteen states provided data on trends in this enrollment group. Enrollment in this category fluctuates greatly over time, as seen in the following graph and table. From December 2004 to June 2008, there was a continuous decline in TMA enrollment, largely due to a decrease in TANF enrollment and therefore a reduction in the number of TANF case closures. However, TMA enrollment increased slightly from June 2008 to December 2008.

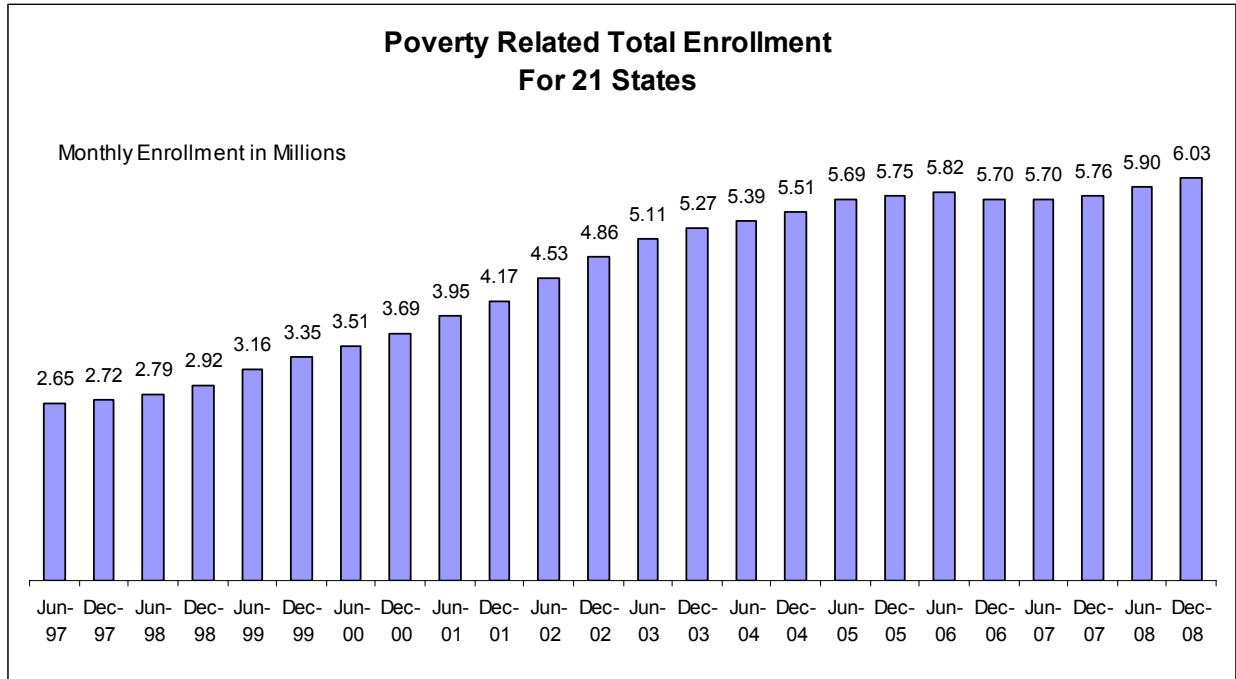

Appendix D: Poverty-Related Medicaid Enrollment (21 States)

This subset of the larger “families, children and pregnant women” category includes low-income children and low-income pregnant women. For these 21 states, enrollment in this group increased by 4.6% from December 2007 to December 2008. This is lower than the enrollment in the larger group of families, children and pregnant women, which was 5.6% for 46 states (Table 3).

Appendix E: Study Methodology and Data Issues

This study is based on data provided by each of the 50 states and the District of Columbia. Health Management Associates asked each state to provide the internal reports they use to track enrollment in the program. Each state's report included total enrollment and enrollment in certain eligibility categories. Report categories are not standardized across states. Where it was possible to do so, the state enrollment data were grouped to further examine trends in specific Medicaid eligibility categories.

The data tables and graphs in this document present "point-in-time" monthly Medicaid enrollment counts for the months of June and December of each year from June 1997 through December 2008. The data were provided to Health Management Associates by each state Medicaid program between September and December 2009.

To provide timely data and not overly burden state agency staff, states were asked to provide "off-the-shelf" reports on Medicaid enrollment. In other words, these are generally the same reports states use for their own purposes. Since each state uses different categories in internal enrollment reports, it is not possible to track enrollment detail for all 50 states and the District of Columbia. This report provides information on enrollment trends for categories of enrollees across as many states as possible, given the limitations of the source data.

Point-in-Time Values

National reports issued by CMS also use data provided by state Medicaid agencies. CMS reports show the total number of persons "ever-enrolled" in Medicaid during a quarterly or annual period. The "ever-enrolled" measure of Medicaid enrollment used in CMS reports differs from the "point-in-time" measure of Medicaid enrollment used here. CMS reports show the unduplicated count of persons enrolled at any time and for any length of time during the indicated reporting period. For example, in annual CMS reports, a person enrolled in Medicaid for one month of the year and a person enrolled for the entire year are each counted as one enrollee for that year. In contrast, the data reported in this report show enrollment in specific months. Given that each month individuals enroll and disenroll, the enrollment count in any specific month will always be less than the number ever-enrolled during a twelve month period. The extent to which the monthly number is less than the "ever-enrolled" number depends on the extent of monthly enrollment, disenrollment and re-enrollment activity.

Common Categorization of Enrollees

The initial expectation was that it would be possible to compare trends in most of the states for all of the categories used in the cross-state trends. As the data were received from the states, we found that none of these categories existed in every state. For this report we placed special emphasis on the split between children and adults and were able to secure this information from all but one of the states.

Medicaid Expansion CHIP Enrollees

Enrollees in Medicaid expansion CHIP programs have been excluded from this analysis. Many states provided separate tabulations of these enrollees, and these individuals were excluded from all data in this report. Other states included these enrollees in their Medicaid data and did not provide specific information on the number of children or adults in Medicaid expansion CHIP groups. For these states, HMA reduced the Medicaid enrollment by the number of Medicaid expansion CHIP enrollees reported to HMA for the separate Kaiser Commission on Medicaid and the Uninsured report on CHIP enrollment as of December 2008.

Level of Data Detail

A related issue is the great variety in the level of detail we received from the states. The number of distinct categories ranged from two to 166, with the exception of two states for which only totals were available for the first two years of data. The states with the greatest numbers of categories provided us with algorithms used by the state to aggregate the data. HMA applied these algorithms to the detailed data to create aggregations that are more meaningful.

Data Completeness

As a result of the processing time and possibility of retroactive eligibility, counts of Medicaid enrollment for a specific month may change over the following several months. The data in this study are based on state reports usually produced two to five months following the indicated month. Effort was made to use reports that reflect retroactive eligibility where they exist, and, for each period, to use reports that reflect the same adjustments. Nevertheless, it is possible that additional changes may have occurred subsequent to the counts provided for our use in this study.

Variation in Definitions of Medicaid Enrollment

States vary in how they count enrollment for a given month for their own purposes. Some states count the number of enrollees as of the first day of the month and never adjust the report. Some states count the number of enrollees as of the last day of the month and never adjust the report. Data for some states also include “retroactive” eligibles, i.e., individuals whose Medicaid eligibility is established at a later date, but whose coverage is retroactive to a prior point in time. When a person applies for Medicaid, federal processing standards allow the state up to 45 days to complete the eligibility determination process. In this process, for some Medicaid categories it is possible for a state to look at the period immediately prior to the date of application and determine whether eligibility criteria were met for a period of as many as 90 days prior to the date of application (and if eligible, to cover medical bills incurred in this period.)

States also vary in their treatment of “spend-down” enrollees. Some states include in their enrollment counts persons with excess income that qualify to “spend-down” to Medicaid eligibility whether or not they have incurred sufficient medical costs to become eligible for Medicaid in that month. Other states only include those individuals that have met their “spend-down” requirement. Since a primary goal of this report is to identify trends, these variations have been deemed acceptable, as long as a given state does not change its methodology over time.

The counts provided by the states reflect all persons with Medicaid eligibility for each month. Different eligibility categories have different levels of Medicaid coverage. Every person with Medicaid coverage was counted as an enrollee with the exception of family planning waiver enrollees and pharmacy plus waiver enrollees. No adjustment was made for other persons who are enrolled in Medicaid categories with less than full coverage. Therefore the count of persons on Medicaid includes a small number of individuals that are covered by Medicaid only for emergency services and persons with Medicare and Medicaid dual eligibility who are enrolled as Qualified Medicare Beneficiaries (QMBs), Specified Low-Income Medicare Beneficiaries (SLMBs) or Qualified Individuals (QIs) for whom Medicaid pays only a portion of Medicare premiums, co-payments and deductibles. (See Appendix A for a more detailed discussion of enrollees with limited benefits).

To the extent possible, persons in state-only health coverage programs that are not funded by the federal Medicaid program are excluded in the count of Medicaid enrollees.

While Health Management Associates asked the state Medicaid agencies for “off-the-shelf” reports used by the states to track Medicaid enrollment, some states chose to produce special reports for use in this report. In some of the states the single state agency for Medicaid does not determine Medicaid eligibility, so data were obtained from the eligibility agency.

¹ The “point-in-time” monthly enrollment counts in this report differ from enrollment counts in other reports that show the number of persons “ever-enrolled” at any time and for any length of time over a year. For example, in March 2007, the Congressional Budget Office reported that Medicaid would cover 62.2 million individuals in FY 2007, using an “ever-enrolled” methodology and counting individuals enrolled in Medicaid for a single benefit such as a Family Planning Waiver or Pharmacy Plus Waiver, or as residents of the U.S. Territories. For this report, we count individuals with full Medicaid benefits or Medicaid with a deductible (“spend down”), as well as low-income Medicare beneficiaries who receive varying levels of assistance with their Medicare premiums, deductibles, and coinsurance. This report excludes about 2.8 million single benefit enrollees, roughly 1 million Medicaid enrollees in the U.S. Territories, and 1.2 million children enrolled in Medicaid expansion CHIP programs funded through Title XXI. If all those groups were included, the point-in-time enrollment for December 2008 would be 49.8 million. It should also be noted that this report does include an estimated 1.88 million low-income Medicare beneficiaries who only receive Medicaid assistance with their Medicare premiums and/or cost-sharing.

⁹ Children are generally eligible for Medicaid at higher income levels than adults, and are less likely to be subject to asset tests in determining eligibility. As a result, when families lose insurance due to a lost job, children are more likely to be eligible for Medicaid than the parents.

¹⁰ Virtually all of the elderly and approximately one-third of the disabled Medicaid enrollees also receive assistance from the Medicare program. Some of these “dual-eligibles” have full Medicaid coverage that supplements their Medicare benefits. Others receive Medicaid support only for their Medicare premiums, deductibles and co-insurance. The estimate that there are 1.9 million Medicaid enrollees in the Medicare Savings Program who receive only Medicare cost-sharing is based on an extrapolation of data from 27 states. (See Appendix A for more details.)

¹¹ According to the Social Security Administration, new claims for disability benefits have been rising and are projected to continue to increase. This increase in claims is being attributed to the aging of the population and to the economic recession.

¹² Idaho recently restructured its Medicaid program to provide differential benefit packages targeted to the needs of particular populations. Idaho experienced an 11% increase in Aged and Disabled Medicaid between December 2007 and December 2008. Most of the increase occurred in the “Enhanced” component of the Idaho Medicaid program, which covers individuals with disabilities or special needs that do not have dual Medicare eligibility. Since the Enhanced plan offers additional services beyond the Basic program offered to families and children, individuals with disabilities or special needs have an incentive to be enrolled in this category rather than in other Medicaid categories.



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
