#### **Major Changes**

- While most major weapon acquisitions in recent years were from the USA, Iraq announced in October 2012 a multi-billion dollar weapon acquisition deal with Russia.
- The Iraqi government ordered, and is gradually receiving weapons and equipment for its evolving armed forces. The Iraqi ground forces received 140 M1A1 MBTs, as well as some artillery pieces – both M109 self propelled and M198 towed howitzers.
- The air force ordered 18 F-16 C/D combat aircraft, and a further contract for 18 additional F-16 aircraft is under negotiation. The air force also received all of its An-32 transport aircraft from Ukraine and is scheduled to receive its first C-130J transport aircraft from the USA by the end of 2012. The air force is also receiving utility helicopters from USA and France, some of them being lightly armed.
- The navy is receiving light patrol boats and some transport ships.
