The following communication was received from His Excellency the Governor:

STATE OF MINNESOTA. EXECUTIVE OFFICE Sr Paul, March La 1868

Hon. L. Fletcher,

Speaker House of Representatives.

SIR:—I herewith return without my approval

H. F. No. 64, An act to revive and continue an act entitled an act to appropriate the interest of the State in certain lands to aid in the construction of the Princeton and Anoka railroad company and to legalize the organization of said company, approved March 7, A. D., 1875.

This act revives and continues chapter 243 of the special laws of 1873 it is therefore in effect the re-enactment of that law. The law of 1570 is so uncertain as to the character of the lands designed to be conveyed by it, as to the location of such lands, and as to the nature of the lies or title of the State intended to be conveyed by it, that I deem it as duty to withhold my approval.

The act, as it seems to me, should be certain and definite as to each

and all of these points.
