SIR: I herewith return without my signature

H. F. No. 571, An act to legalize the incorporation of the Chaska Dairy Association and to declare such association to be a corporation.

I am advised, and it so appears to me from the title as well as the body of the bill, that this is really an act incorporating a private corporation, and therefore repugnant to both section thirty-three of article four and section two of article ten of the constitution of the State.
