Hon. A. E. Rice, President of the Senate:

SIR: Herewith I return to you, unapproved:

S. F. No. 3. Entitled an act to amend chapter ninety-eight (98) of the General Statutes of one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, relative to offenses against the public peace.

I do not sign this bill for the reason that some of its provisions seem to be inconsistent with principles that are primary in the form of government provided by our state and national constitutions in subordinating civil to military powers.

SIR: I have approved and signed:

S. F. No. 79. An act to increase the number of Judges of the Second Judicial District of this state and to prescribe the duties of the same.

S. F. No. 37, An act to repeal chapter three hundred and sixty-five (365) of the Special Laws of one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven (1887), entitled An act to regulate and fix the compensation of the Clerk of the District Court of the county of Kandiyohi.

S. F. No. 89, A joint resolution requesting Congress to pass a law granting pensions to every honorably discharged Union soldier and sailor who was confined in rebel prisons.

S. F. No. 107, An act relating to the clerkship of the Board of Education of the Independent School District of Duluth.

S. F. No. 157, An act to regulate the catching of fish in Buffalo and Pulaski lakes in Wright county, and to repeal chapter two hundred and sixty (260) of the Special Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-five (1885) relating to the catching of fish in certain lakes in said Wright county, as to said Buffalo and Pulaski lakes mentioned therein.
