The following communication was received from His Excellency the Governor:

Hon. Frank A. Day, President of the Senate:

DEAR SIR: I have the honor to herewith return S. F. No. 291,

without my approval.

This measure relates to a single corporation, the Minnesota Baptist State Convention, created and organized under the laws of this state. The constitution of Minnesota expressly provides that the Legislature shall enact no special laws creating corporations or amending, renewing, extending or explaining the charters of corporations. This bill flatly violates this provision of the constitution and cannot become a valid law.

I am, therefore, constrained to withhold my signature.
