

TO APPROPRIATE MONEY FOR MAINTENANCE OF PUBLIC PARKS AND FOR ADDITIONS THERETO; FOR THE CREATION OF NEW PARKS; FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT AND MAINTENANCE OF FISH HATCHERIES AND VARIOUS OTHER SEMI-STATE ACTIVITIES, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES. ---

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter named, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the purposes specified in the following sections of this Act, to be available, where not otherwise stated, for each of the fiscal years ending July 31, 1918, and July 31, 1919.

The State Treasurer shall pay all warrants so made upon him by the State Auditor out of said appropriation, and any portion of the latter remaining after said Commission shall have made its report, as next hereinafter directed, shall be returned to the fund from which this appropriation is made.

Said Commission shall make a full report of its doings to the Governor, when the disbursements herein authorized have been made, and shall accompany with the made with vouchers, specifying, with reasonable particularity, the various purposes for which the same have been used.
