Honorable John A. Hartle Speaker of the House State Capitol Saint Paul, Minnesota Dear Speaker Hartle:

I am returning without approval House File 432.

I think there are a number of reasons which make it undesirable. For one thing, it would strike out the provision of the present law which allows persons receiving old age assistance to harvest wild rice without taking out a license for this purpose. I do not think that persons on old age assistance should be required to take out a license in order to harvest wild rice.

Changes which the bill makes in the license provisions would reduce the revenue available for administration of the rice harvest without providing for any method of replacing these funds.
