The Honorable Don Samuelson President of the Senate

Dear President Samuelson:

I have vetoed and am returning Chapter 365, Senate File 2707, a bill modifying real estate task force funding provisions.

I am vetoing this bill because it will unnecessarily extend for another year a surcharge that will be borne by consumer homebuyers and sellers. I agree that improving the efficiency of government filings of real estate transactions as well as state coordination of this country/business effort is solid public policy. However, if the bill were not enacted, the task force would simply be required to complete its work within its original timeline and within its current budget. This too is good public policy.

For these reasons, I am vetoing the bill.
