

VOTING RECORD YOUR LEGISLATORS' VOTING RECORD ON SMALL BUSINESS ISSUES 2016 EDITION

Roll call votes by your state legislators on small-business issues are listed below. While the Voting Record does not reflect all elements considered by a lawmaker when voting, it is a valuable guide to evaluating your legislator's attitude toward small business. Note that the State Senate is not up for re-election until 2018 and this is an interim Vote Record for that chamber. Please thank those lawmakers who supported small business.

- 1. House Bill 4119 - Wage Garnishment Reform: Changes the way wage garnishments are processed to end the penalties imposed on employers for minor paperwork errors. A "YES" vote supports the small business position. Passed the House 110-0. Passed the Senate 37-0. Signed by the Governor as Public Act 14 of 2015.
- 2. House Bill 4052 - Prohibit Local Wage and **Benefit Ordinances:** This legislation prohibits local units of government from establishing their own minimum wage, paid leave and other employee benefits mandates on employers within their jurisdiction. A "YES" vote supports the small business position. Passed the House 57–52. Passed the Senate 22–16. Signed by the Governor as Public Act 105 of 2015.
- 3. House Bill 4499 - Civil Asset Forfeiture **Reform:** Reforms laws that allow governmental units to seize the private property of individuals suspected of criminal activity but where no conviction has been pursued or obtained. A "YES" vote supports the small business position. Passed the House 104-5. Passed the Senate 38-0. Signed by the Governor as Public Act 153 of 2015.
- 4. Senate Bill 500 – Unemployment Taxable Wage Base Calculation: Requires an annual, rather than quarterly, determination of the balance of the Unemployment Compensation Trust Fund for the purpose of setting the employer's taxable wage base. The taxable wage base is set at either \$9,500 or \$9,000 depending on the balance in the fund. A "YES" vote supports the small business position. Passed the Senate 26-9. Passed the House 60-46. Signed by the Governor as Public Act 240 of 2015.
- 5. Senate Bill 492 - State Franchise Law **Clarification:** Provides that state franchise law in Michigan recognizes that franchisors and franchisees are separate and distinct employers in response to a federal NLRB (National Labor Relations Board)

- ruling that could make a franchisor responsible for a franchisee's employees. A "YES" vote supports the small business position. Passed the Senate 27-10. Passed the House 59-46. Signed by the Governor as Public Act 266 of 2015.
- 6. Senate Bill 493 – State Franchise Law **Clarification:** See explanation for Senate Bill 492. Provides that state workers' compensation law in Michigan recognizes that franchisors and franchisees are separate and distinct employers. A "YES" vote supports the small business position. Passed the Senate 26–10. Passed the House 60–45. Signed by the Governor as Public Act 267 of 2015.
- 7. Senate Bill 616 - Targeted Tax Incentives: Will create tax exemptions and other incentives to benefit a specific business to encourage them to locate a data center in western Michigan at the expense of all other businesses and employers that will have to fund the targeted credits through their own taxes. A "NO" vote supports the small business position. Passed the Senate 21–15. Passed the House 61–45. Signed by the Governor as Public Act 251 of 2015.
- 8. House Bill 4713 - Require Showing of **Criminal Intent for Rule Violations: Requires** that a state agency pursuing a criminal conviction for a minor rule violation prove that the violator had criminal intent in breaking the rule. A "YES" vote supports the small business position. Passed the House 106-0. Passed the Senate 38–0. Signed by the Governor as Public Act 250 of 2015.
- Senate Bill 878 Deadline Extension for E911 9. **Compliance:** Extends the deadline on a Public Service Commission rule that would have required any small business with more than 7,000 square feet of space and a multi-line phone system to replace their phones if they do not meet new 911 requirements by the end of 2016. The bill moves the deadline date to the end of 2019. A "YES" vote supports the small

business position. Passed the Senate 36–0. Passed the House 107–1. Signed by the Governor as Public Act 244 of 2016, with immediate effect.

- 10. House Bill 5105 Extend the Health Insurance Claims Tax: This bill will extend the Health Insurance Claims Assessment (HICA) tax out to 2025 and increase the rate from .75 percent to 1 percent in 2017. Total cost to taxpayers would be \$330 million a year out to 2025 for a total tax of \$1.98 billion. A "NO" vote supports the small business position. Passed the House 83–23. The bill was later amended in the Senate to a different version and NFIB took no position on the amended bill.
- 11. House Bill 4629 Civil Asset Forfeiture
 Repeal Bond Requirement: See the explanation
 for House Bill 4499. This bill eliminates the requirement
 for an individual to post a bond in order to recover
 private property that has been seized by the
 government due to suspected criminal activity but
 where no conviction has been pursued or obtained. A
 "YES" vote supports the small business position.
 Passed the House 100–7. At the time of this record the
 bill remains in the Senate.
- 12. House Bill 5613 No State Rules Stricter than Federal: This bill will make it tougher for state agencies to develop rules that exceed what similar

federal rules or laws require. **A "YES" vote supports the small business position.** Passed the House 61–47. At the time of this record the bill remains in the Senate.

13. Senate Bill 3 – Prevailing Wage Repeal:

Repeals Michigan's Prevailing Wage Law that requires that workers on construction projects financed with state funds be paid union scale wages whether they are members of a labor union or not. A "YES" vote supports the small business position. Passed the Senate 22–15. At the time of this record the bill remains

in the House.

- 14. Senate Bill 853 Prohibit Local Governments from Banning Plastic Bags: Prohibits local governments in Michigan from banning or regulating plastic bags, cups or other disposable packaging and containers within their jurisdiction. A "YES" vote supports the small business position. Passed the Senate 25–12. At the time of this record the bill remains in the House.
- 15. Senate Bill 190 Require State Agencies to Pay Court Costs: This bill would require a state agency to pay the legal costs of the prevailing party when that state agency loses a lawsuit involving a regulatory issue. A "YES" vote supports the small business position. Passed the Senate 34–3. At the time of this record the bill remains in the House.
