

# VPIRG's 2017-2018 Legislative Scorecard

VPIRG produces a scorecard of key votes at the conclusion of each legislative biennium. You can use this year's scorecard to find out how your representatives in the Vermont House and Senate voted on important public interest issues including – climate solutions, energy efficiency, toxic chemical protections, data privacy, net neutrality and more.

## S.8 - Tax Transparency and Ethics Reform

This law made Vermont the first state to require tax transparency from statewide candidates. The same legislation also created a modest state ethics commission, prohibited certain "pay-to-play" activities, and put limits on the "revolving door" problem where state officials turn into lobbyists immediately after leaving office.

## H.R.15 - Climate Commitment Resolution

Introduced and voted on shortly after President Trump announced his intention to pull the US out of the Paris Climate Agreement, this nonbinding resolution condemned that action and stated the legislature's commitment to Vermont's stronger climate and clean energy goals – a 50% reduction in carbon pollution from 1990 levels by 2028 and 90% renewable energy (including heating and transportation energy) by 2050.

## H. 196 - Paid Family & Medical Leave

This bill would have provided up to 12 weeks of leave time for employees needing to care for a new child, or 6 weeks to care for a seriously ill or injured loved one. Workers would contribute to the program and receive 70% of their salary (up to two times the livable wage) during their time off. H.196 passed both chambers but was vetoed by Gov. Phil Scott.

## S.103 - Toxic Chemical Reform

This wide-ranging toxic chemical reform bill would, among other things, have given better information about children's products that contain potentially harmful toxins and have made it easier for Vermont's Health Commissioner to regulate a children's product if it presents a toxic threat to kids. The bill passed both the House and Senate but was ultimately vetoed by Gov. Phil Scott.

## S.103 - Toxics Chemical Reform – Veto Override

The legislature attempted to override Gov. Scott's veto of S.103, needing a 2/3 majority vote in both chambers to do so. The veto override succeeded in the Senate but fell four votes short in the House as several legislators who voted for the original bill decided to flip their vote, put party over the public interest, and sustain the governor's veto.

## H.410 - Appliance Efficiency Standards

This law puts in place efficiency standards for appliances that aren't currently covered by federal standards (e.g. computers and computer monitors). The 16 standards included in this legislation will cumulatively save Vermonters \$210 million by 2035 and be equivalent to taking, and keeping, nearly 6,000 cars off the road by 2025.

## H.624 - Protecting Vermonters' Voter Data

Passed in response to inquiries from President Trump's so-called Commission on Election Integrity, this law protects Vermonters sensitive data by preventing the state from releasing the voter checklist to a federal agency or foreign government.

## H.764 - Data Broker Regulations

This first-in-the-nation law will require data brokers – third party companies that buy and sell individuals' personal information – to register with the state and report their opt-out practices. It also requires these companies to maintain a minimum data security standard and makes it a crime to obtain an individual's information for malicious purposes. Finally, this law removes the fees that consumers currently have to pay to put a security freeze on their credit after a company like Equifax experiences a breach.

## S.197 - Medical Monitoring for Toxic Victims

This bill would have provided modest relief for toxic chemical victims by making it possible for them to seek medical monitoring – paid for by the polluting entity – so they could identify and treat diseases as quickly as possible. S.197 passed both the House and Senate, but was vetoed by Gov. Phil Scott who sided with corporations over chemical victims.

## S.260 - Clean Water Funding

This vote was in favor of Clean Water legislation. Specifically, it was to approve key amendments offered by the Ways and Means Committee – which included several funding mechanisms designed to allow the clean water protections in the bill to be implemented.

## S.52 - Anti-Clean Energy Amendment

If passed, this amendment would have undermined Vermont's energy siting and planning law, Act 174, and its requirement that towns and regions help push towards Vermont's commitment to 90% renewable energy. The amendment would have functionally delayed the law's full implementation, and made it much easier for towns and regions to block renewable energy projects.

## S.135 - Retirement Security

Passed as part of a broader economic development bill, this legislation made Vermont the first state to move forward with a voluntary, state-run retirement program. Vermont's program will be available to employers with 50 or fewer employees. It will allow many small employers to provide retirement plans for the first time.

## S.289 - Net Neutrality for State Contracts

Passed in response to the Trump administration's disastrous repeal of net neutrality, this law ensures the state of Vermont only contract with net neutral internet service providers. This is a win for Vermont taxpayers, Vermont consumers and anyone who cares about preserving a fair and open internet.

## S.120 - Banning Corporate Campaign Contributions

For the first time ever, we succeeded in pushing the full Senate to pass a ban on corporate campaign contributions. This bill stalled in the House this year, but we will redouble our efforts next year so Vermont can join 22 other states and the federal government in banning such contributions.

## S.285 - Amendment - Keeping our Unclaimed Nickels

This amendment – which successfully passed the Senate - changed a broader universal recycling bill to finally end the giveaway of millions of dollars in unclaimed bottle deposits to the beverage industry, and instead put that money to work for Vermonters. S.285 became law and in 2019 Vermont's unclaimed nickels will be put toward clean water funding.

**P** = Legislator did not vote because he/she was **PRESIDING** over the chamber for that vote

**NOTE:** "A" "Abstain" "N/A" and "P" were not counted toward the total score listed for a legislator
