BOARD MINUTES - 10 JUNE 2019

1. Apologies and Conflicts of Interest

- 1.1 There were no apologies for this meeting.
- 1.2 The Chairman opened the meeting by congratulating Dame Elan Closs Stephens on her award in the Queen's Birthday Honours List.

2 Annual Report

- 2.1 The Board had received a draft of the Annual Report for initial discussion.
- 2.2 The Board considered the narrative sections of the Annual Report and suggested a number of draft amendments. The Board agreed that it would be important to discuss the metrics used in future reports with Ofcom as currently they were predominately representative of linear viewing rather than on-demand viewing, which was becoming an increasing feature of audience behaviour.
- 2.3 The Board noted that the C&AG will qualify his audit opinion on regularity in relation to the BBC Group financial statements for 2018/19 in relation to the BBC's approach to the settlement of outstanding historical tax liabilities arising against presenters where they engaged with the BBC through personal service companies.
