AMENDMENTS TO THE CHARTER OF THE UNIVERSITY OF READING

1. In **Article V The President of the Council and the Vice-President of the Council:**
 - (a) In the heading *delete* "Vice-President" *substitute* "Vice-Presidents";
 - (b) in Clause (1) *delete* "a Vice-President of the Council" *substitute* "Vice-Presidents of the Council".
2. Delete **Article VII The Treasurer and other Officers.**
3. **Renumber** Articles VIII to XXIV as VII to XXIII.
4. In **Article XIII Statutes of the University** as renumbered, in Clause (2) Line 7, *delete* "Treasurer".

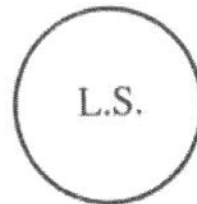

The following report from the Committee of Council for the Affairs of Jersey and Guernsey was today read at the Board:

“In accordance with Your Majesty’s General Order of Reference of 22nd February 1952 the Committee have considered a letter from the Greffier of the States of Jersey transmitting an Act passed on 10th December 2010 entitled the Social Security (Amendment No. 19) (Jersey) Law 2011:

“The Committee have considered the Act and have agreed to report that it may be advisable for Your Majesty to approve and ratify it.”

Her Majesty, having taken the report into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve and ratify the Act (a copy of which is annexed to this Order) and to order that it, together with this Order, shall be entered on the Register of the Island of Jersey and observed accordingly. Her Majesty’s Officers in the Island, and all others whom it may concern, are therefore to take notice of Her Majesty’s Order and to proceed accordingly.

Representations were duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Secretary of State for Justice that, subject to the exceptions below, burials should be discontinued forthwith in:-

- 1) All Saints Churchyard, West Haddon, Northamptonshire (as shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto);
- 2) St James Churchyard, New Bury, Farnworth, Metropolitan District of Bolton;
- 3) St Mary's Churchyard, Liss, Hampshire;
- 4) The Churchyard of St Mary Magdalene, Keyworth, Nottingham.

In pursuance of the Order in Council made on 16th March 2011 these representations have been published and taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council.

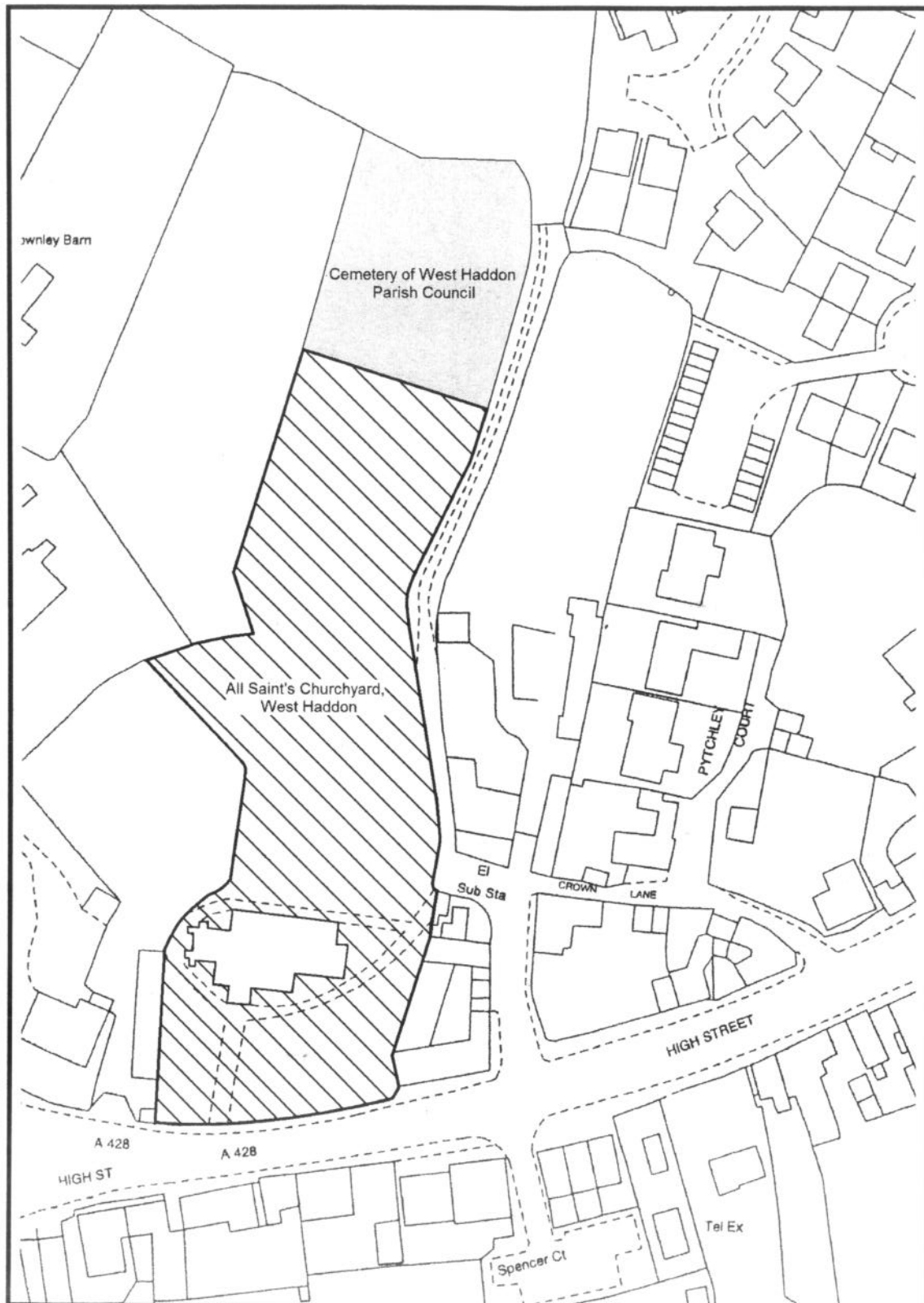
Accordingly, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 1 of the Burial Act 1853, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that burials shall be discontinued forthwith in the places listed above, subject to the following exceptions:-

- (a) in the places numbered 1, 2, and 3 above, in any existing earthen grave in the churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons previously buried in that grave, but no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than one metre below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave; and

- (b) in the places numbered 1 and 4 above, in any grave space in which no interment has previously taken place, the burial may be allowed of any person for whom, or any member of the family for which that grave space has been reserved and appropriated, with the exclusive right of burial there, but no part of the coffin containing the body shall be less than one metre below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

The Secretary of State for Justice, after giving ten days' notice of his intention to do so, has, under the Burial Act 1853 as amended, made representations to Her Majesty in Council that, subject to the exceptions below, burials should be discontinued in:-

- 1) St Wilfrid's Churchyard, West Hallam, Ilkeston, Derbyshire;
- 2) Blackwood Hall Graveyard, Luddenden, Halifax, Metropolitan Borough of Calderdale (as shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto);
- 3) St Endellion Churchyard, St Endellion, Port Isaac, Cornwall (as shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto);
- 4) Churchyards 1, 2 and 3, St Mary the Virgin, Ewell, Surrey (as shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto);
- 5) St Nicholas Churchyard, Godstone, Surrey (as shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto).

The exceptions are that:-

- (a) in the places numbered 1, 2, 3 and 4 above, in any existing earthen grave in the churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons previously buried in that grave, but no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than one metre below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave;

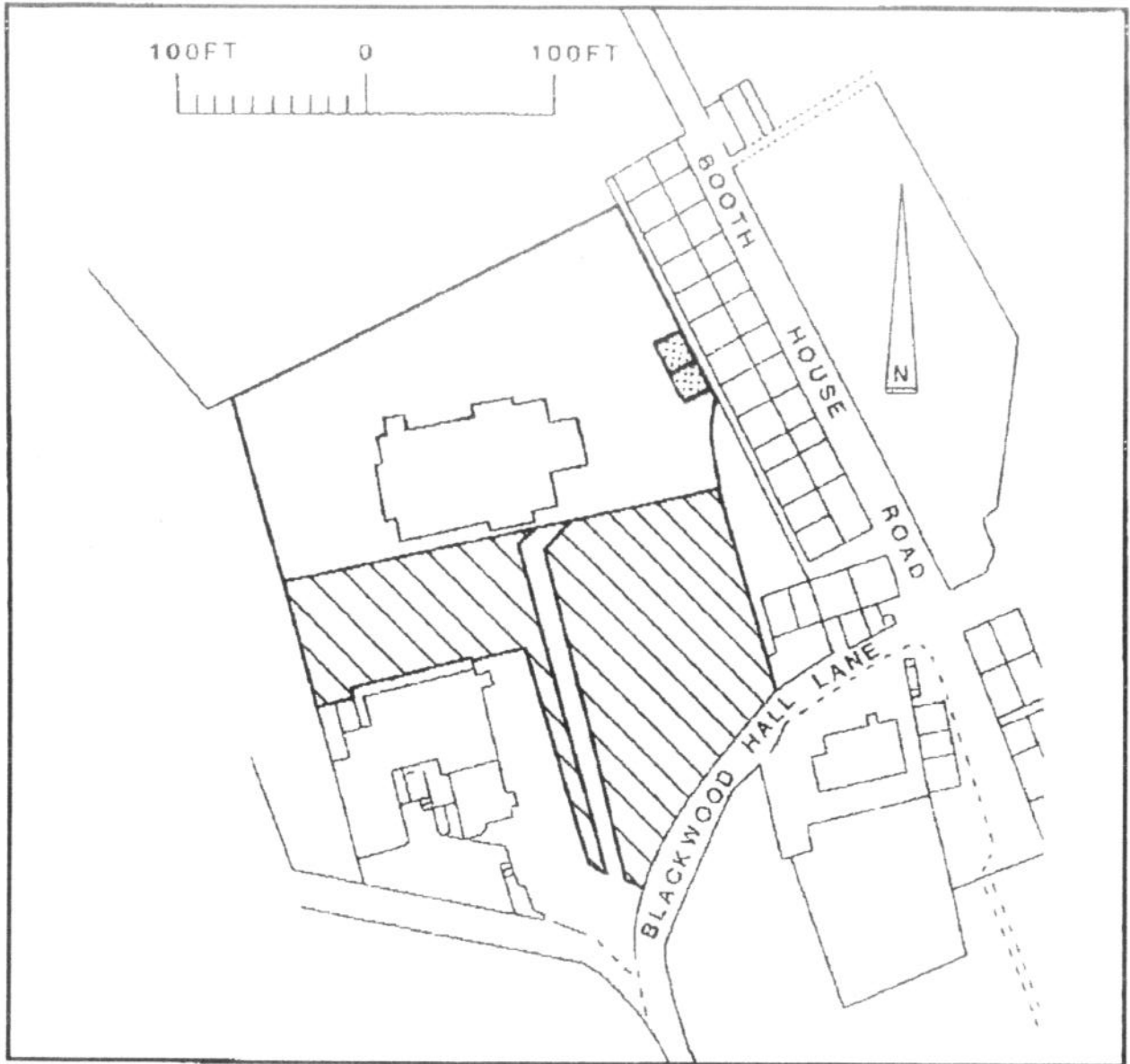
- (b) in the places numbered 1 and 3 above, in any grave space in which no interment has previously taken place, the burial may be allowed of any person for whom, or any member of the family for which that grave space has been reserved and appropriated, with the exclusive right of burial there, but no part of the coffin containing the body shall be less than one metre below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave; and
- (c) in the place numbered 4 above, in any vault or walled grave in the churchyard, burial may be allowed but every coffin buried in such vault or grave must be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

Her Majesty in Council is pleased to give Notice of these representations and to order that they be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on 21st June 2011.

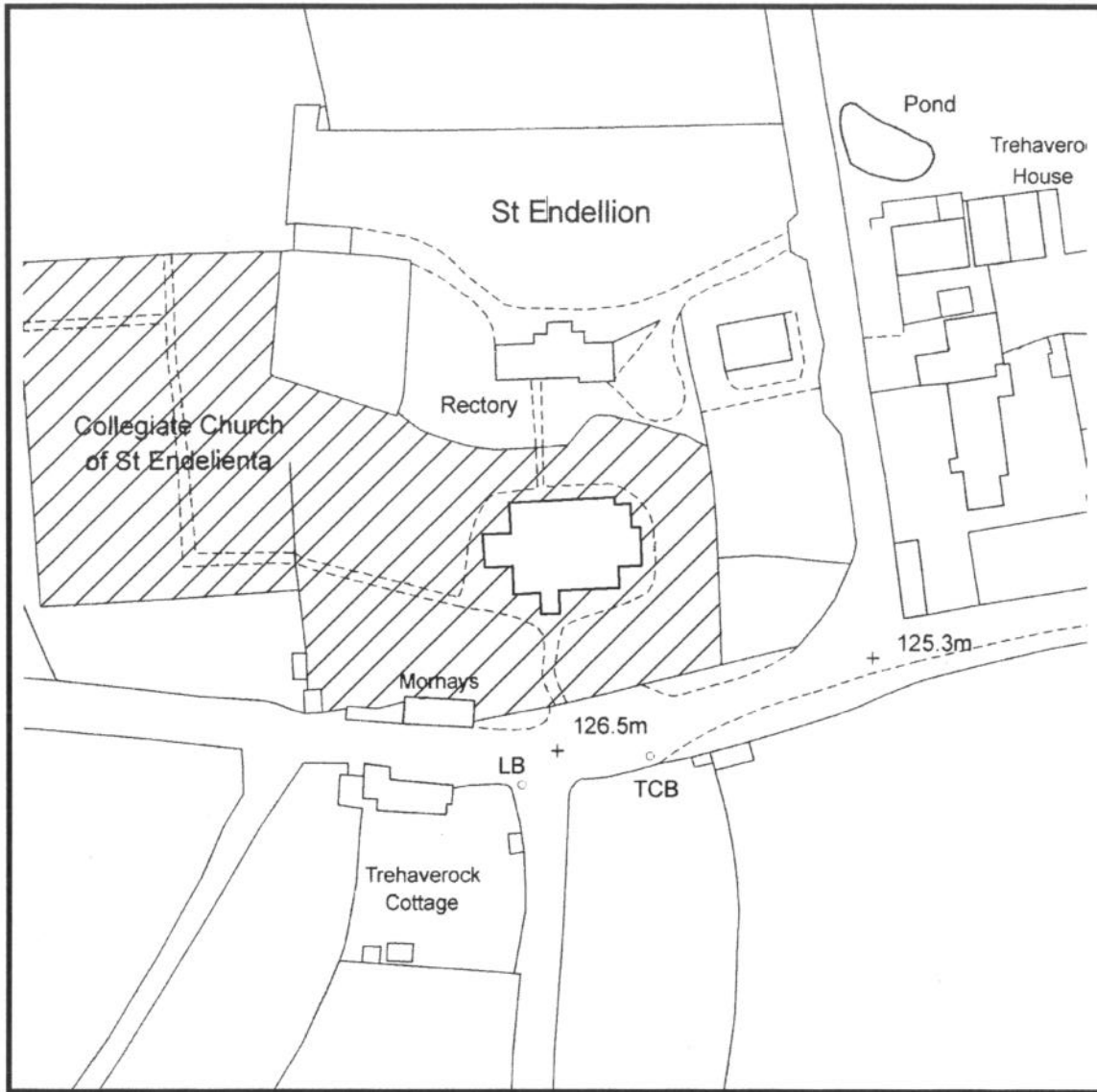

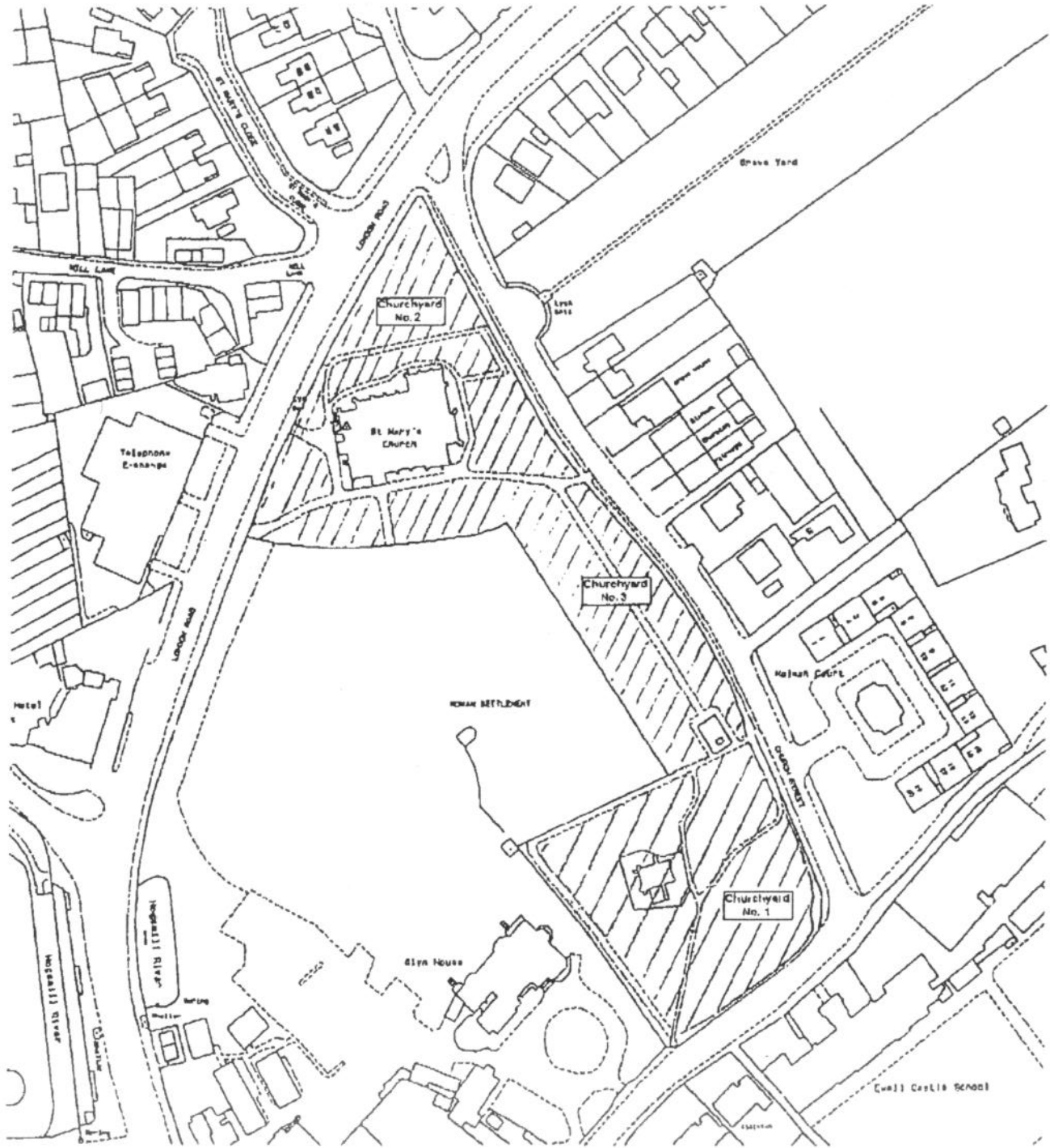
BLACKWOOD HALL GRAVEYARD,

CALDERDALE



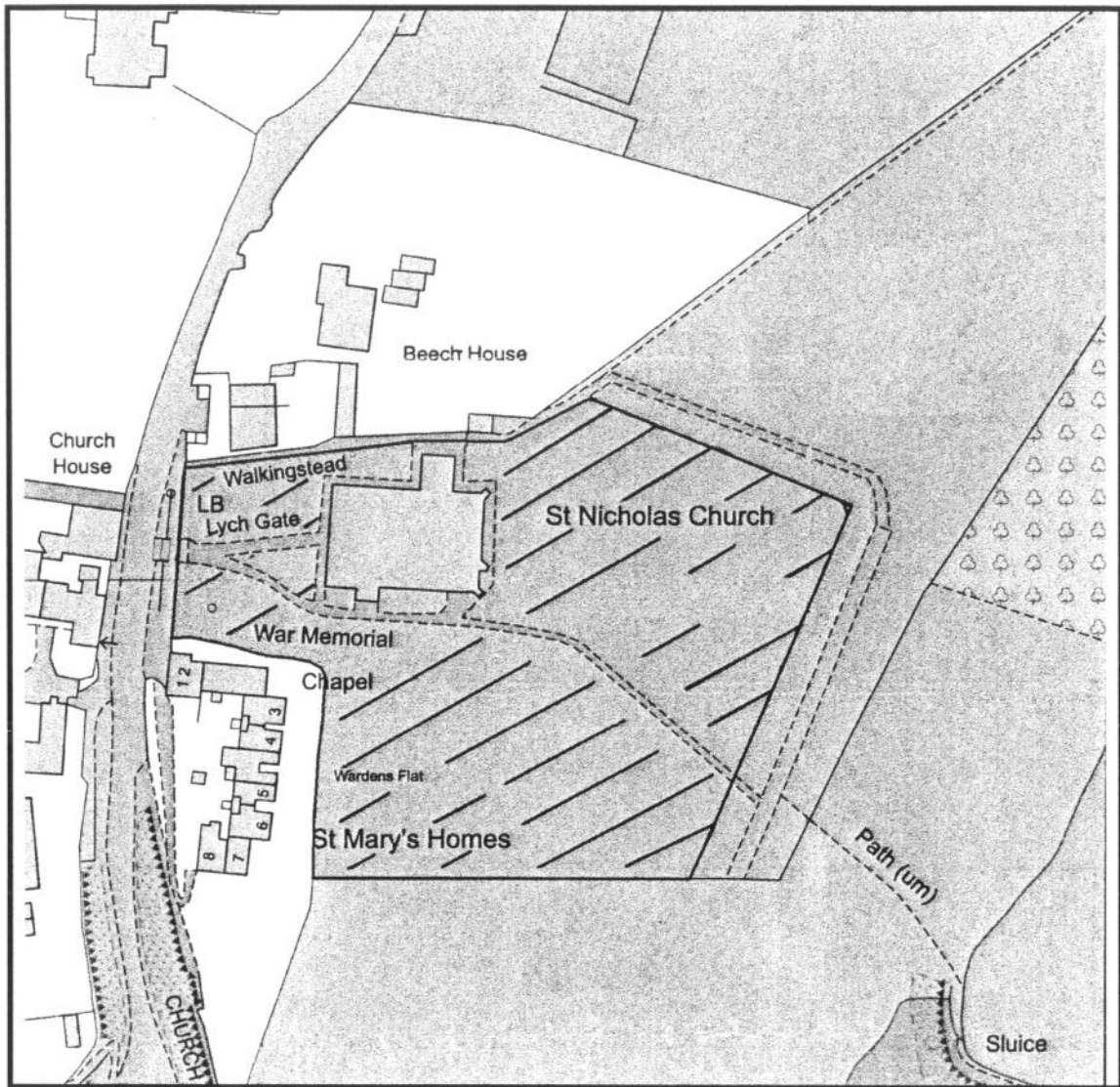
St Endellion Churchyard, St Endellion, Port Isaac, Cornwall
