2018 Senate Votes

Senate Vote 1

S.F. 2849: Right-to-view ultrasound

Floor: Amendment

Right-to-view ultrasound legislation passed the Committee on Health and Human Services Finance and Policy on a voice vote on March 27. The full Senate then reviewed the legislation on May 1. Sen. Matt Klein, DFL-Mendota Heights, offered an amendment to weaken the proposal's underlying law, the Woman's Right to Know (WRTK) informed consent statute. The amendment would have made all aspects of the WRTK law optional based on the physician's subjective opinion (see Journal of the Senate, pg. 8498). This amendment was clearly intended to undermine WRTK. Thankfully, the Klein amendment lacked the votes needed to pass 32-35 (pro-life win).

Senate Vote 2

S.F. 2849: Right-to-view ultrasound

Floor: Passage

Following defeat of the Klein amendment, the Senate voted on final passage of the ultrasound right-to-view bill. The legislation was passed 37-30 (pro-life win).

Following passage in both the House and Senate, Gov. Mark Dayton vetoed S.F. 2849 / H.F. 3194.
