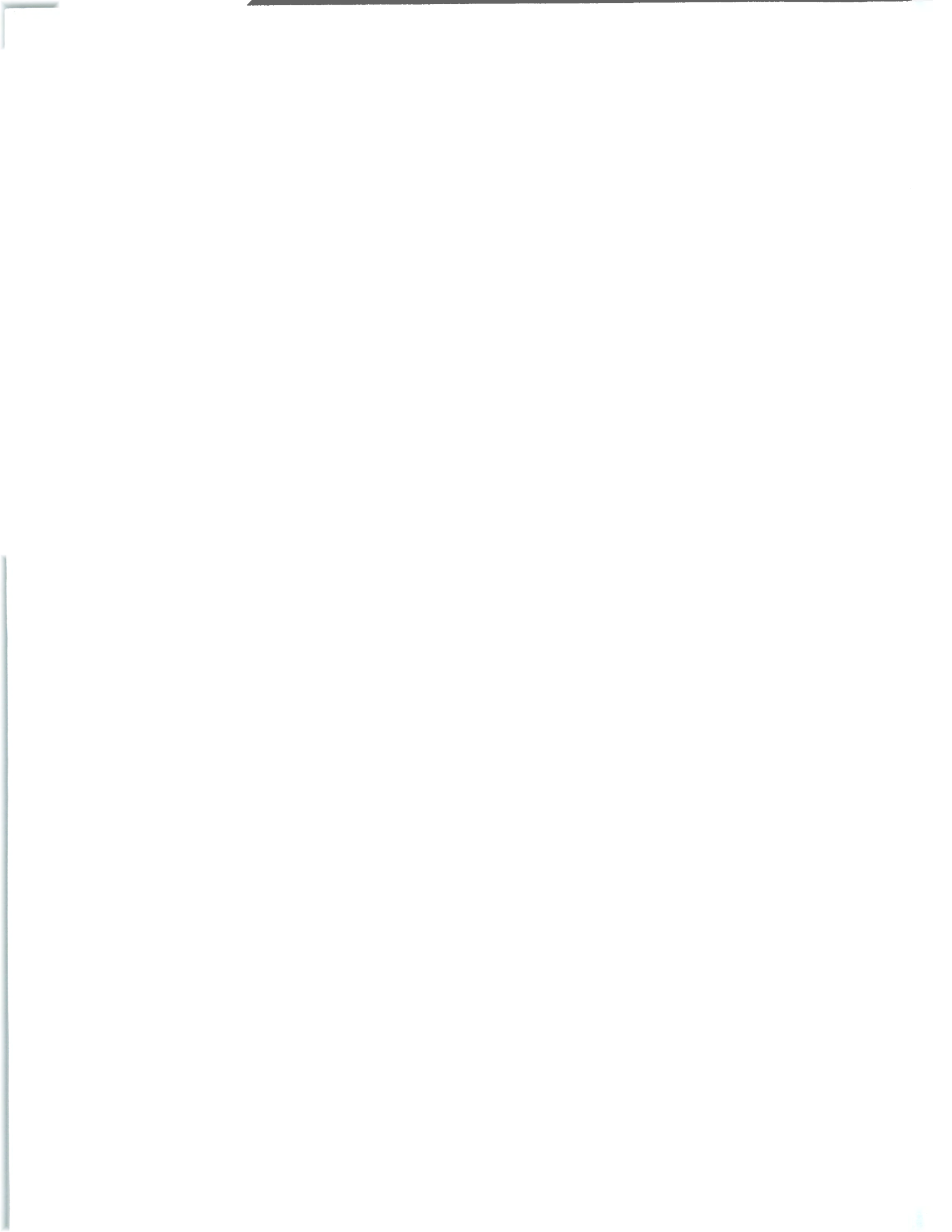
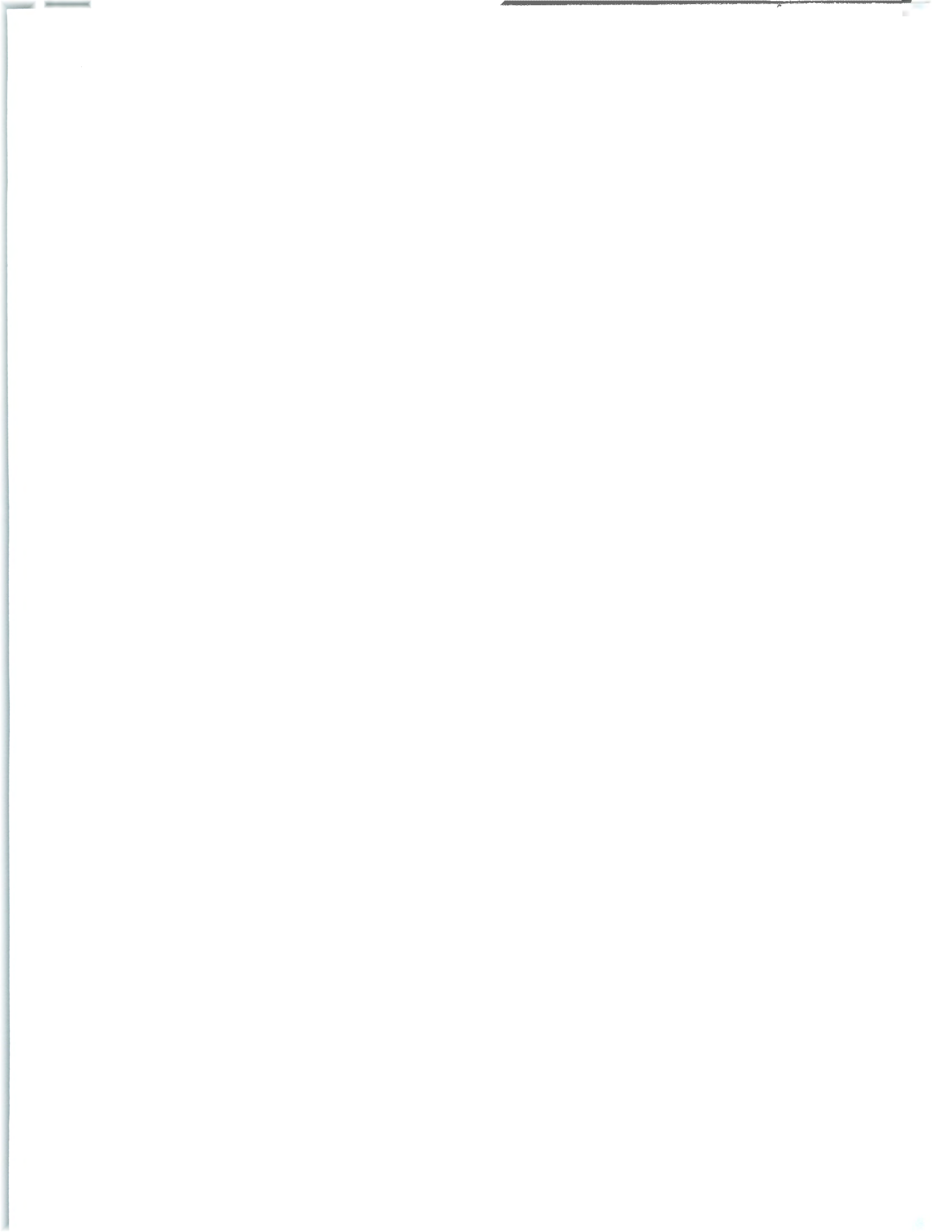

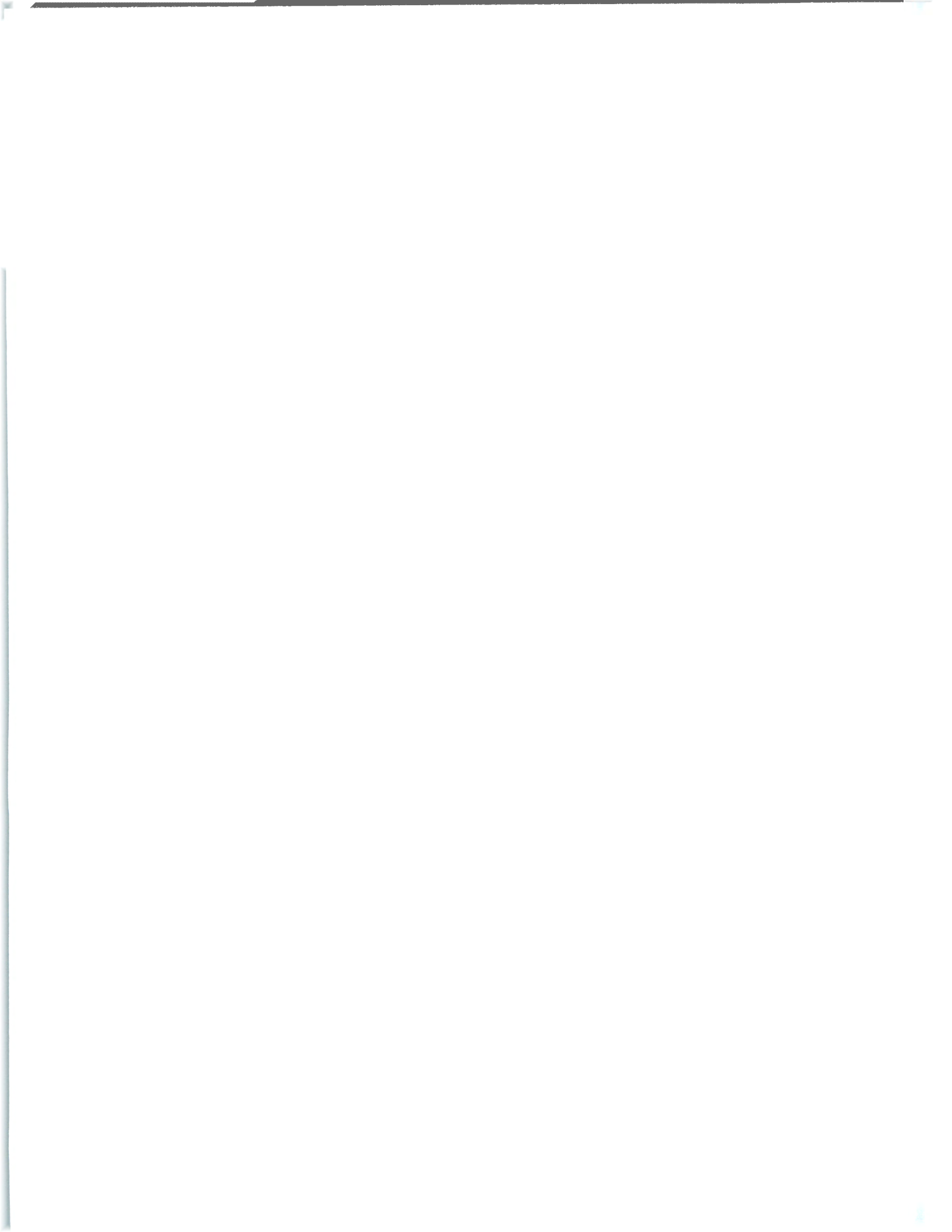

SYNOPSIS OF LAWS ENACTED BY CHAPTER

Chapter 1 **PUBLICATION OF CERTAIN CRIMINAL CASES ON A PUBLICLY AVAILABLE INTERNET WEBSITE**

Prohibits the Alaska Court System from publishing a court record of a criminal case on a publicly available website if 60 days have elapsed from the date of acquittal or dismissal and (1) the defendant was acquitted of all charges filed in the case, (2) all criminal charges against the defendant in the case have been dismissed and were not dismissed as part of a plea agreement in another criminal case, or (3) the defendant was acquitted of some of the criminal charges in the case and the remaining charges were dismissed. **(CSSSHB 11(JUD) am(efd am S))**

Effective Date: October 1, 2016

Chapter 2 **OPIOID OVERDOSE DRUGS**

Allows pharmacists to independently dispense opioid overdose drugs. Provides immunity from civil damages to certain persons resulting from an act or omission in prescribing or providing an opioid overdose drug to a person at risk of experiencing an opioid overdose or to a family member, friend, caregiver, or other person in a position to administer an opioid overdose drug to a person at risk of experiencing an opioid overdose. Allows a health care provider authorized to prescribe opioid overdose drugs to do so directly, by standing order, or protocol. **(HCS CSSB 23(JUD))**

Effective Date: March 15, 2016

Chapter 3 **AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF STATE ROYALTY OIL**

Gives legislative authorization and approval required for the sale and purchase of state royalty oil between the state, Tesoro Corporation, and Tesoro Refining and Marketing LLC. **(HB 373)**

Effective Date: April 22, 2016

Chapter 4 **MILITARY FAMILY DAY**

Establishes November 1 of each year as Military Family Day. **(HB 175)**

Effective Date: July 20, 2016

Chapter 5 **GOVERNOR'S COUNCIL ON DISABILITIES AND SPECIAL EDUCATION**
Removes responsibility for services for gifted persons from the duties of the Governor's Council on Disabilities and Special Education, and updates references to federal law. (HB 76)

Effective Date: August 2, 2016

Chapter 6 **ALASKA WILD SALMON DAY**
Establishes Alaska Wild Salmon Day on August 10 of each year to celebrate the enormous bounty that wild salmon bring to the state. (SCS HB 128(STA))

Effective Date: August 5, 2016

Chapter 7 **ARCADE-STYLE AMUSEMENT DEVICES**
Amends the definition of "gambling" to exclude playing an amusement device that confers only tickets, credits, allowances, tokens, or anything of value that can be redeemed for toys, candy, or electronic novelties offered at the same facility where the amusement device is located, or playing a claw machine that enables a person to receive merchandise directly from the machine. Changes a reference in the definition of "gambling device." Defines "amusement device" to include arcade-style games, pinball machines, countertop machines, novelty arcade games, sports-themed games, and other similar devices and clarifies that "amusement device" does not include casino-style games, draw games, slot machines, roulette wheels, craps, video poker, or any other game that is a contest of chance. (SB 157)

Effective Date: August 15, 2016

Chapter 8 **BOARD OF CHIROPRACTIC EXAMINERS AND THE PRACTICE OF CHIROPRACTIC**

Requires the Board of Chiropractic Examiners to adopt regulations establishing standards for the training, qualifications, scope of practice, and employment of chiropractic interns and chiropractic preceptors, for the designation of nationally recognized certification programs for chiropractic clinical assistants, and for the performance of patient examinations. Allows a licensee to perform physical examinations of children for sports and school activities and to employ chiropractic interns, chiropractic preceptors, and nationally certified chiropractic clinical assistants. Establishes limitations on the scope of practice for chiropractic interns, chiropractic preceptors, and chiropractic clinical assistants. Requires enrollment in or completion of a nationally recognized certification program to practice as a chiropractic clinical assistant. Changes the peer review committee to the utilization review committee. Provides that a person who practices chiropractic without a license or who fraudulently obtains or attempts to obtain a license or certificate is guilty of a class A misdemeanor. Provides that a chiropractic examination may be

conducted by a chiropractic clinical assistant or chiropractic intern under the supervision of a person licensed under this chapter. Adds definitions for "chiropractic clinical assistant," "chiropractic intern," and "chiropractic preceptor." (CSSB 69(FIN))

Effective Date: August 15, 2016

Chapter 9 **REPORTING WORKPLACE INJURIES**

Requires an employer to report an accident that results in an employee fatality or in an employee's in-patient hospitalization, an employee's loss of an eye, or an employee's amputation. (CSSB 148(L&C))

Effective Date: May 18, 2016

Chapter 10 **RECOVERY OF OVERPAYMENTS FROM PUBLIC ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS**

Requires the Department of Health and Social Services to remit benefit overpayments collected in administering public assistance programs to the Department of Revenue. Also allows the Department of Health and Social Services to garnish the permanent fund dividend of a former recipient of a public assistance program to satisfy the balance due on a defaulted overpayment claim. (CSSB 145(FIN))

Effective Date: July 1, 2016

Chapter 11 **ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ALASKA SENIOR BENEFITS PAYMENT PROGRAM**

Adds an additional requirement that to be eligible for senior benefits payments a person must be a citizen of the United States or a qualified alien under federal law. (CSSB 147(HSS))

Effective Date: July 1, 2016

Chapter 12 **BOARD OF PAROLE**

Extends the termination date of the Board of Parole to June 30, 2020. (SCS CSHB 231(STA))

Effective Date: May 27, 2016

Chapter 13 **RELEASE OF VOTER REGISTRATION INFORMATION TO ANOTHER STATE OR GROUP OF STATES AND INFORMATION THAT MAY BE INCLUDED IN THE GENERAL ELECTION PAMPHLET**

Requires the director of the division of elections to enter into an agreement with the Department of Administration and the Department of Revenue to match information provided by a voter with certain information held by the departments. Allows the division to release voter information to another state or group of states for the purpose of ensuring the accuracy of the state's voter registration list if the confidentiality of the information is maintained. Limits what information a political party may submit for inclusion in the state's general election pamphlet.

(HCS SB 9(STA) am H)

Effective Date: May 28, 2016

Chapter 14 **OBSTRUCTION OR INTERFERENCE WITH FREE PASSAGE ON OR USE OF NAVIGABLE WATER AND DEFINITION OF 'NAVIGABLE WATER'**

Amends a definition of navigable water to clarify that the navigable water of the state is water that is navigable in any season, whether liquid or solid. Provides that a person's obstruction or interference with another person's free passage on or use of navigable water may not be authorized by a permit issued by a federal agency unless that permit is authorized by law or regulation. **(SCS CSHB 216(RES))**

Effective Date: August 31, 2016

Chapter 15 **SPECIAL REGISTRATION PLATES COMMEMORATING THE BLOOD BANK OF ALASKA AND CELEBRATING THE ARTS**

Creates special registration plates commemorating the Blood Bank of Alaska. Amends the special registration plates celebrating the arts to require the commissioner of administration to choose a new design for the plates every four years. Requires the Alaska State Council on the Arts to hold a competition every four years to select a design for the special request plate celebrating the arts.

(HCS CSSB 154(STA))

Effective Date: August 31, 2016

Chapter 16 **REGULATION OF SALE OF PRODUCTS CONTAINING DEXTROMETHORPHAN**

Prevents a seller, retailer, or vendor from selling a product containing dextromethorphan to persons under 18 years of age, unless the person under 18 has a prescription issued by a licensed practitioner. Requires a seller, retailer, or vendor to check a government issued photo ID unless the person appears to be 25 years of age or older. Provides that a person who violates the restriction on sale of dextromethorphan is guilty of a violation punishable by a fine of \$150 for the first

violation and \$250 for the second and each subsequent violation. Prevents a municipality from enacting or enforcing an ordinance regulating the possession or sale of dextromethorphan. **(HB 125)**

Effective Date: June 3, 2016

Chapter 17 INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR MENTAL HEALTH BENEFITS PROVIDED THROUGH TELEHEALTH

Requires a health care insurer that provides coverage for mental health benefits to provide coverage for mental health benefits through telehealth by a provider licensed in this state. Prohibits insurers from requiring that in-person contact occur between a health care provider and a patient before payment is made for covered services. **(SCS CSHB 234(L&C))**

Effective Date: September 11, 2016

Chapter 18 DUTIES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME; FISH AND GAME LICENSES, PERMITS, TAGS, SURCHARGES, AND CONSERVATION DECALS

Requires the commissioner of the Department of Fish and Game (ADF&G) to provide a report to the legislature regarding the Board of Game's allocation of big game hunting opportunities in each preceding calendar year. Raises the costs of hunting, trapping, and sport fishing licenses, tags, and permits and the costs of nonresident big game tags. Changes and clarifies requirements for resident hunting, trapping, and fishing licenses and clarifies exemptions from licensure requirements. Establishes a surcharge that will be used for intensive management of the state's game populations and repeals the surcharge on December 31, 2022. Clarifies when a big game tag must be affixed to an animal. Directs ADF&G to produce and sell fish and game conservation decals. Allows the Board of Fisheries to adopt regulations establishing restricted seasons and areas necessary for residents under 18 years of age to participate in sport fishing. Clarifies provisions relating to permanent identification cards issued by ADF&G. Establishes a special sport fishing license, subsistence fishing permit, and personal use fishing permit for residents with developmental disabilities and allows a resident with a valid noncommercial license to fish or hunt on behalf of a person with developmental disabilities. Requires ADF&G to maintain and improve state-owned land used to access the Chitina dip-net fishery. Repeals the sport fishing facility surcharge and the Alaska sport fishing enterprise account when the revenue bonds for development projects that benefit sport fishing are fully repaid. **(CCS HB 137)**

Effective Date: Sections 21 and 34 are conditional; remainder of Act takes effect January 1, 2017

Chapter 19 **ALASKA COMMISSION ON AGING**
Extends the termination date of the Alaska Commission on Aging to June 30, 2024.
(SB 124)

Effective Date: June 16, 2016

Chapter 20 **ELECTRONIC FILING OF TAX RETURNS**
Requires electronic filing of all tax reports and returns with the Department of Revenue. Adds a penalty for failure to file a report or return electronically. Exempts a taxpayer that does not have the technological capability to file a report or return electronically. **(CSHB 375(FIN))**

Effective Date: Section 7 takes effect June 17, 2016; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2016

Chapter 21 **EXEMPTION FROM THE REGULATIONS OF POSTSECONDARY EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS**
Exempts from postsecondary educational institution regulations a program that 1) is in a field that does not require a professional or occupational license, 2) provides training primarily for recreational purposes, and 3) at the advanced training level, prepares program graduates to teach or instruct in that field. **(CSHB 305(EDC))**

Effective Date: September 15, 2016

Chapter 22 **CREDIT REPORT SECURITY FREEZE FOR A MINOR, INCAPACITATED PERSON, OR PROTECTED PERSON**
Allows a parent, legal guardian, or conservator to request a consumer credit reporting agency to place a security freeze on the credit report of a minor, incapacitated person, or protected person. Allows the parent, legal guardian, or conservator to make other requests that are related to the security freeze under the general security freeze provisions. **(CSSB 121(JUD) am H)**

Effective Date: September 17, 2016

Chapter 23 **USE OF ELECTRONIC DEVICES WHILE DRIVING**
Changes the penalty for using an electronic device while driving from a class A misdemeanor to a violation if the person's driving did not cause physical injury or death of another person. Directs the supreme court to establish a bail forfeiture schedule for violations of AS 28.35.161. **(CSSB 123(JUD))**

Effective Date: July 1, 2016

Chapter 24 **REAL ESTATE COMMISSION**

Extends the termination date of the Real Estate Commission to June 30, 2018.
(HB 290)

Effective Date: June 21, 2016

Chapter 25 **MEDICAID REFORM; MEDICAL ASSISTANCE FALSE CLAIM AND REPORTING ACT; PUBLIC ASSISTANCE REFORM; CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE PRESCRIPTION DATABASE; TELEHEALTH**

Requires professional licensing boards that regulate physicians, audiologists, speech-language pathologists, professional counselors, marriage and family therapists, psychologists, psychological associates, social workers, physical therapists, occupational therapists, and registered speech-language pathologists to adopt regulations relating to treatment through telehealth. Establishes the Alaska Medical Assistance False Claim and Reporting Act, with a July 1, 2019, sunset for provisions that allow a private plaintiff to bring a civil action. Makes various changes to statutes that establish the controlled substance prescription database, including requiring certain practitioners to register to the database, requiring pharmacists to enter information in the database before dispensing certain prescriptions, requiring practitioners to check the database before prescribing certain drugs, and expanding access to the database. Most of the changes to the database are repealed January 1, 2021. Enacts changes to the medical assistance and public assistance programs, including a requirement for an enhanced computerized eligibility verification system, changes related to audits and identification of overpayments, a provision for civil penalties for violations of AS 47.05 or AS 47.07, and authorizes the Department of Health and Social Services to adopt regulations relating to expanding the use of telehealth, redesigning the medical assistance payment process, and managing care for recipients. Requires the Department of Health and Social Services to establish managed care and coordinated care projects, apply for waivers, collaborate with various entities to improve certain types of services and programs, submit reports to the legislature regarding medical assistance reform and fraud reduction efforts, and strengthen the health information infrastructure. Provides for feasibility studies analyzing the privatization of state employee and other health care plans, and of certain services delivered at the Alaska Psychiatric Institute, division of juvenile justice facilities, and Alaska Pioneers' Homes. Directs specified professional licensing boards to submit a report to the legislature regarding guidelines for the prescription of schedule II controlled substances. **(HCS CSSB 74(FIN) am H)**

Effective Date: AS 47.05.270(a)(5), AS 47.05.270(a)(8), and AS 47.05.270(a)(10) enacted by section 43, AS 47.07.038 enacted by section 46, section 53, and AS 09.58.010(f) enacted by section 18 are conditional; sections 57 and 59 - 61 take effect June 22, 2016; AS 47.07.076(c) enacted by section 47 takes effect July 1, 2016; AS 17.30.200(s) enacted by section 34 takes effect September 1, 2016; sections 5, 10 - 12,

21, 23, 25, 27, 29, 31, 33, AS 08.64.101(7) enacted by section 7, and AS 17.30.200(o) - (r) enacted by section 34 take effect July 17, 2017; sections 19 and 20 take effect July 1, 2019; sections 22, 24, 26, 28, 30, and 32 take effect July 1, 2021; remainder of Act takes effect September 19, 2016

Chapter 26 **SALE OF INFORMATIONAL, EDUCATIONAL, OR PROMOTIONAL MERCHANDISE BY THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES**

Allows the Department of Natural Resources to sell informational, educational, or promotional merchandise at prices that ensure a reasonable monetary return to the state. Requires, to the extent practicable, that the department sell only merchandise produced or manufactured in the United States that is procured from an Alaska bidder or person that employs state prisoners. **(CSSB 101(FIN))**

Effective Date: September 20, 2016

Chapter 27 **AUTHORIZING THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES, DIVISION OF GEOLOGICAL AND GEOPHYSICAL SURVEYS, TO COLLECT FEES FOR FACILITIES, EQUIPMENT, PRODUCTS, AND SERVICES**

Authorizes the Department of Natural Resources, division of geological and geophysical surveys, to charge and collect fees for facilities, equipment, products, or services offered by the division. Requires public hearings before the division sets fees. Requires fees to be established in regulation. Revenue from the fees will be accounted for separately within the State's general fund. Specifies that fees will be waived for a student who uses the division's facilities, equipment, products, or services for educational purposes. **(CSSB 170(RES))**

Effective Date: Section 4 takes effect June 23, 2016; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2016

Chapter 28 **TEMPORARY DELEGATION OF POWERS OVER CHILDREN**

Allows a parent or guardian of a child to delegate powers related to the child's care or custody to another person. Provides a power of attorney form for delegating the powers. Excludes certain powers. Limits the duration of the power of attorney and allows a parent or guardian to revoke the power of attorney at any time. Exempts from certain licensing and other requirements a nonprofit organization that operates a program that assists parents to find temporary care for children. **(CSSB 180(JUD))**

Effective Date: Section 4 takes effect on the effective date of section 1, ch. 93, SLA 2008; remainder of Act takes effect September 20, 2016

Chapter 29 **APPLICATION OF THE LEGISLATIVE ETHICS ACT; EXCLUSION OF CONTRACTORS AND EMPLOYEES OF CONTRACTORS FROM THE PUBLIC EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM (PERS)**

Limits the sections of the Legislative Ethics Act that apply to legislative consultants, legislative independent contractors, legislative interns, and legislative volunteers. Allows the Select Committee on Legislative Ethics to excuse certain persons not participating in work performed for the committee from compliance with limits in the Act on participation in or support of a political campaign. Excuses legislative interns, legislative volunteers, legislative consultants, and legislative independent contractors from certain provisions of the Legislative Ethics Act. Excludes persons from participating in or receiving benefits from PERS for services compensated on a contract or fee basis. **(CSSB 24(JUD) am H)**

Effective Date: September 20, 2016

Chapter 30 **REGULATION OF SPORT FISHING SERVICES, AND REGULATION AND LICENSING OF PERSONS PROVIDING SALT WATER SPORT FISHING SERVICES**

Establishes a licensing regime for salt water sport fishing operators and salt water sport fishing guides. Creates a combined salt water sport fishing operator and guide license. Provides what actions are covered by the scope of each license. Sets licensure requirements. Requires the registration and identification of vessels used to provide sport fishing services on fresh or salt water. Establishes penalties for violations of license requirements. Sunsets the licensing regime and related provisions January 1, 2019. **(SCS CSHB 41(FIN))**

Effective Date: Section 6 takes effect June 23, 2016; section 5 takes effect January 1, 2019; remainder of Act takes effect January 1, 2017

Chapter 31 **CHILD SAFETY SEAT LIABILITY**

Exempts certain persons from liability for civil damages as a result of an act or omission that occurs during the inspection, installation, or adjustment of a child safety seat or in providing education regarding the installation or adjustment of a child safety seat. Amends the mandatory child safety seat device requirements, relating to age restrictions, in certain circumstances. **(HB 308 am)**

Effective Date: September 29, 2016

Chapter 32 **BOARD OF BARBERS AND HAIRDRESSERS; ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CONTROL BOARD; MINOR CONSUMING; BACKGROUND CHECKS FOR MARIJUANA ESTABLISHMENTS**

Changes the requirements for members of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board.

Sets out the terms for members of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board and the Board of Barbers and Hairdressers. Allows employment of persons who are 18, 19, or 20 years of age on golf courses. Permits access by minors to golf courses for the purpose of playing golf or attending golf-related activities. Provides that minor consuming or in possession or control and unauthorized presence by a minor are violations, each punishable by a fine of \$500. Provides that a fine for a minor consuming or in possession violation or an unauthorized presence by a minor violation may be reduced by a court to \$50 if the minor supplies proof of completion of an alcohol safety action program or a community diversion panel. Prohibits a prosecutor from joining a minor offense for minor consuming or in possession or unauthorized presence by a minor with a related criminal offense. Modifies the required language for warning signs for unaccompanied minors. Prohibits the court system from publishing on a publicly available website the record of a violation for minor consuming or in possession or unauthorized presence by a minor. Adds a definition for "community diversion panel." Requires background checks for persons applying for a registration to operate a marijuana establishment. Amends Rule 17(a), Alaska Rules of Minor Offense Procedure, to prohibit a prosecutor from joining a minor offense for minor consuming or possession or unauthorized presence by a minor with a related criminal offense. Repeals sections relating to repeat or habitual minor consuming. Provides that the provisions relating to violations for minor consuming or in possession or unauthorized presence by a minor apply to offenses committed on or after the effective date of the Act. Authorizes the Department of Public Safety to submit fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of Investigation to obtain a background check for a person applying for a registration or license to operate a marijuana establishment. **(HCS CSSB 165(L&C) am H)**

Effective Date: October 4, 2016

Chapter 33 NURSING; CERTIFIED MIDWIFERY

Requires licensure and establishes licensure requirements for advanced practice registered nurses. Requires that advanced practice registered nurses use their professional titles or initials on signs, stationery, or other advertising. Changes the term "advanced nurse practitioner" to "advance practice registered nurse" and the term "professional nursing" to "registered nursing." Requires that the Board of Nursing adopt regulations relating to the practice of advanced practice registered nursing. Establishes the licensure by examination requirements for registered, practical, and advanced practice registered nursing. Requires the Department of Commerce, Community and Economic Development to set fees related to advanced practice registered nursing. Removes references to "licensed professional nurse" and "vocational" nursing. Authorizes advanced practice registered nurses to use specific titles and associated initials. Authorizes advanced practice registered nurses to supervise practical nurses, delegate certain nursing duties, draw blood for tests of persons charged with sex offenses, and review a health care plan for an assisted living home resident. Adds impersonation of an advanced practice registered nurse as a grounds for denial, suspension, or revocation of a nursing license or a certificate

to practice as a nurse aide. Requires institutions that are applying for accreditation of advanced practice registered nurse training to provide certain information to the board. Defines the practice of advanced practice registered nursing. Exempts advanced practice registered nurses from civil and criminal liability for certain acts or omissions. Clarifies that nurse-midwives and direct entry midwives are certified. Adds advanced practice registered nurses to the definition of health care provider in statutory provisions concerning prisons. Authorizes advanced practice registered nurses with certain training to assess a child with respect to a home and community based medical assistance waiver. Authorizes advanced practice registered nurses with certain education to determine if a person may be administered psychotropic medication without the person's consent. Repeals certain statutes relating to the definitions of "nurse midwife" and "nurse anesthetist." (HCS SB 53(L&C))

Effective Date: July 7, 2016

Chapter 34 INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR ANTI-CANCER MEDICATIONS

A health care insurer that offers an insurance plan, which provides coverage for anti-cancer medications injected or intravenously administered by a health care provider or patient-administered anti-cancer medications is prohibited from requiring a higher copayment, deductible, or coinsurance amount for patient-administered anti-cancer medications than it requires for those administered by a health care provider. Prohibits health care insurers from offsetting the costs of compliance by increasing the copayment, deductible, or coinsurance amount for anti-cancer medications that are injected or intravenously administered by a health care provider or by reclassifying benefits with respect to anti-cancer medications. (HCS CSSB 142(L&C))

Effective Date: January 1, 2017

Chapter 35 KENNY AND PATTI BARBER SHOOTING RANGE

Names a shooting range located in the Knik River Public Use Area the Kenny and Patti Barber Shooting Range. Prohibits the state from replacing state-owned signs for the shooting range before the effective date of the Act unless the state-owned sign is damaged or due for replacement. (SB 204)

Effective Date: October 4, 2016

Chapter 36 CRIMINAL LAW AND PROCEDURE

Abolishes common law civil in rem forfeiture actions if used instead of a criminal proceeding. Raises the felony theft threshold to \$1,000, adjusted for inflation. Amends the crime of arson in the third degree to prohibit intentionally damaging a motor vehicle that is the property of another person by starting a fire or causing an explosion while that vehicle is located on private property. Lowers the punishment for various crimes, including failure to appear, violation of conditions of release, and

misconduct involving controlled substances. Prohibits prosecution for prostitution if the accused witnessed or was a victim of certain crimes, and reported the crime to law enforcement in good faith. Changes when a peace officer may issue a citation instead of arresting a person. Changes the bail procedures. Changes the circumstances for credit against a sentence of imprisonment for time spent in a treatment program. Raises the fine for a class A misdemeanor to \$25,000. Creates a suspended entry of judgment process. Lowers the maximum period of probation. Requires a probation officer to recommend to the court that probation be terminated and a defendant be discharged from probation if the defendant has completed one or two years on probation if the defendant meets certain criteria. Provides for punishments for technical violations of probation. Raises the minimum term of imprisonment for murder in the first degree, murder of an unborn child, or murder in the second degree. Changes the presumptive sentence ranges for class A felonies, class B felonies, class C felonies, class A misdemeanors, and class B misdemeanors. Changes the presumptive sentence ranges for theft in the fourth degree, concealment of merchandise, removal of identification marks, unlawful possession, issuing a bad check, and criminal simulation. Prohibits a law enforcement agency investigating an offense under AS 11.41.410 - 11.41.470 from disclosing information related to the investigation to an employer of the victim except under limited circumstances. Prohibits an employer from penalizing or threatening to penalize a victim of an offense because the victim reports the offense to a law enforcement agency or participates in the investigation of the offense. Adds a physician's assistant or an advanced nurse practitioner to the Violent Crimes Compensation Board. Prohibits the Alaska Court System from publishing a court record of a criminal case on a publically available website if all criminal charges against the defendant in the case have been dismissed after a suspended entry of judgment. Requires the Department of Administration to rescind a revocation of a driver's license if the person has been acquitted of driving under the influence or refusal to submit to a chemical test. Allows a court or the Department of Administration to grant limited license privileges after revoking a driver's license under certain circumstances. Amends the crime of driving while license is canceled, suspended, revoked, or in violation of a limitation. Changes the punishment for driving under the influence or refusal to submit to a chemical test to provide for service of a sentence under electronic monitoring at a private residence. Requires the commissioner of corrections to create an administrative sanction and incentive procedure. Creates a pretrial services program. Creates administrative parole and defines eligibility for administrative parole. Allows a person who is at least 60 years of age and has served at least 10 years of a sentence to be released on discretionary parole. Provides punishment for technical violations of parole. Requires the commissioner of corrections to establish a program to allow parolees to earn credits for complying with the conditions of parole. Creates the recidivism reduction fund and places 50 percent of the marijuana tax into the fund. Requires the Alaska Criminal Justice Commission to create a working group to review and analyze the implementation of the recommendations made in the justice reinvestment report in December 2015. Requires a person convicted of a felony drug offense to be disqualified from receiving food stamps unless the person meets certain requirements. Makes changes to the alcohol and

substance abuse monitoring program. Amends Rule 38, Alaska Rules of Criminal Procedure, to require the court to provide notice to a defendant of the date, time, and place of a scheduled hearing and a reminder notification at least 48 hours prior to the scheduled hearing and the potential consequences of failure to appear. Repeals various statutes. Requires the Alaska Criminal Justice Commission to prepare a report regarding the effectiveness of the penalties, fines, and reformatory and rehabilitative measures under state law for the offenses of driving while intoxicated, refusal to submit to a chemical test, and driving without a valid driver's license, and a report regarding the implementation of a financial recovery and victim's restitution program and make recommendations for statutory changes to improve the payment and collection of victim's restitution. Requires the Alaska Criminal Justice Commission to submit a report regarding the potential of using social impact bonds to reduce recidivism rates. **(HCS CSSSSB 91(FIN) am H)**

Chapter 37 SWEETHEART LAKE HYDROELECTRIC PROJECT

Authorizes the Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority (AIDEA) to issue bonds to finance the infrastructure and construction costs of the Sweetheart Lake hydroelectric project. Provides that the bonds may not exceed \$120,000,000 and shall be payable exclusively from the revenue derived from the project. Exempts the bonds from inclusion in AIDEA's 12-month bonding limitation under AS 44.88.095(a). **(CSHB 143(FIN))**

Effective Date: October 13, 2016

Chapter 38 EXEMPTION FOR INTRASTATE SECURITY OFFERS AND SALES

Exempts offers or sales of a security from certain registration and promotional requirements when the offer or sale is conducted solely in this state to a state resident and meets the other listed requirements. Allows the commissioner of the Department of Commerce, Community and Economic Development, to deny or revoke the exemption if the sale would defraud the purchasers. Disqualifies certain security issuers from using this exemption. **(CSSB 126(L&C) am H)**

Effective Date: October 16, 2016

Chapter 39 **REAL ESTATE BROKER LICENSURE**

Changes the education and experience requirements for licensure as a real estate broker or associate real estate broker. Repeals a statutory provision related to errors and omissions insurance. Provides that the amended education and experience requirements for licensure apply to applications submitted on or after the effective date of the Act. Authorizes the Real Estate Commission to adopt regulations prior to the effective date of the Act. **(HCS SB 158(L&C) am H)**

Effective Date: Section 6 takes effect July 19, 2016; sections 1 and 5(a) take effect January 1, 2017; sections 2 - 4 and 5(b) take effect January 1, 2018

Chapter 40 **PHYSICAL ACTIVITY GUIDELINES FOR STUDENTS IN GRADES KINDERGARTEN THROUGH EIGHT**

Requires school districts to establish guidelines for schools to provide students in grades kindergarten through eight with opportunities for physical activity equal to a minimum of 90 percent of the daily amount of physical activity recommended by the Centers for Disease Control for each full school day. **(HCS CSSB 200(EDC) am H)**

Effective Date: October 16, 2016

Chapter 41 **OMNIBUS INSURANCE**

Amends various provisions of the insurance code and makes conforming changes to bring Alaska statutes into compliance with certain federal insurance laws, including compliance with provisions of P.L. 111 - 148 (Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act). Modernizes certain insurance provisions. Includes consumer protection provisions and insurer licensing restrictions. **(SCS CSHB 372(L&C))**

Effective Date: Section 67 takes effect July 19, 2016; section 65 takes effect January 1, 2017; AS 21.27.150(a)(9), enacted by section 19 of this Act, and section 66 take effect March 1, 2017; section 63 takes effect January 1, 2019; remainder of Act takes effect October 16, 2016

Chapter 42 **SALE OF TIMBER ON STATE LAND**

Subject to legislative appropriation, requires the commissioner of the Department of Natural Resources to provide 25 percent of the revenue from a sale of timber on state land to forestry programs of the department in or near the community where the timber sale took place. Authorizes the commissioner to determine how certain state timber should be sold. Allows the commissioner, upon a finding that the sale is in the best interests of the state, to sell timber at its appraised value to a local

manufacturer of wood products or a user of wood fiber. Removes a requirement that the commissioner make certain findings before negotiating a timber sale to a local manufacturer. **(HCS CSSB 32(RES))**

Effective Date: July 20, 2016

Chapter 43 USE OF THE POWER COST EQUALIZATION ENDOWMENT FUND

Provides that the legislature may appropriate a percentage of the value of the power cost equalization endowment fund for the purpose of power cost equalization and rural electric capitalization, and the amount of earnings of the power cost equalization endowment fund in excess of the annual appropriation for community revenue sharing or community assistance, or other energy or power system upgrades. **(CCS SB 196)**

Effective Date: July 21, 2016

Chapter 44 COMMUNITY REVENUE SHARING PROGRAM

Changes the name of the community revenue sharing program to the community assistance program. Reduces the amount that the legislature may appropriate to the community assistance fund and the fund balance that is required before the department distributes money from the fund without further appropriation. Increases the basic amount, which is used to determine basic community assistance payments, and authorizes the department to reduce the basic amount pro rata if necessary to make community assistance payments. Changes the rounding of community assistance payments from the nearest \$1,000 or \$100 to the nearest dollar. **(HCS CSSB 210(FIN))**

Effective Date: January 1, 2017

Chapter 45 EXTENDING REGULATION EXEMPTION FOR SMALL RENEWABLE ENERGY POWER PRODUCERS

Extends an exemption from regulation by the Regulatory Commission of Alaska to certain small plants and facilities that generate electricity entirely from renewable energy resources in commercial operations beginning before July 1, 2021. **(HCS CSSB 193(L&C))**

Effective Date: October 18, 2016

Chapter 46 HEALTH CARE SHARING MINISTRIES

Defines health care sharing ministry as a faith-based organization whose participants share a common set of ethical or religious beliefs and medical expenses in accordance with those beliefs. Exempts them from regulation as an insurer. **(SB 18)**

Effective Date: October 18, 2016

Chapter 47 **CAREGIVERS FOR DISCHARGED PATIENTS**

Directs a hospital to give a patient the opportunity to designate a person to provide the patient with care after discharge. Requires the hospital to provide the patient and the caregiver with instruction and training as necessary for the caregiver to perform medical and nursing aftercare. Allows the patient and the caregiver to participate in discharge planning. Requires a hospital to maintain a written discharge policy. (CSSB 72(L&C))

Effective Date: January 1, 2017

Chapter 48 **ALASKA WATER AND SEWER ADVISORY COMMITTEE**

Creates the Alaska Water and Sewer Advisory Committee for the purpose of proposing legislation to provide safe and sustainable water and sewer systems in Alaska. The committee is terminated July 1, 2018. (CSHB 209(FIN))

Effective Date: July 29, 2016

Chapter 49 **DUTIES OF PROBATION OFFICERS**

Requires probation officers to accommodate the efforts of probationers to secure and maintain steady employment or to participate in educational courses or training programs when prescribing the times at which a probationer shall report, and to permit each probationer to travel in the state to secure and maintain steady employment or to participate in educational courses or training programs if the travel is not inconsistent with other terms and conditions of probation. Requires a person on special medical, discretionary, or mandatory parole to report to the parole officer at times that accommodate the efforts of the parolee to secure and maintain steady employment or participate in educational courses or training programs. Allows the parole board to set as a condition of special medical, discretionary, or mandatory parole that a parolee refrain from traveling in the state to make efforts to secure and maintain steady employment or to participate in educational courses or training programs, but only if the travel violates other conditions of parole. (SCS CSHB 93(JUD))

Effective Date: October 26, 2016

Chapter 50 **POWERS OF ATTORNEY AND OTHER RECORDS TRANSFERRING
DECISION-MAKING POWERS**

Changes and adds to the provisions that govern the use of a power of attorney. Uses "agent" to identify a person who is authorized by a power of attorney to act for another person. Addresses an agent's duties and liability and when third parties must accept a power of attorney. Adjusts the statutory form of a power of attorney, including the method for indicating which powers are given. Requires that certain powers be specifically marked in order to be given to the agent. Addresses when

another person may sign for the person making the power of attorney. Adopts the Uniform Recognition of Substitute Decision-Making Documents Act to provide, in part, guidelines for determining the validity of documents signed in other states and which state's laws determine the meaning and effect of the document.

(SCS CSHB 8(JUD))

Effective Date: January 1, 2017

Chapter 51 MORTGAGE LENDING, MORTGAGE LOAN ORIGINATORS, AND DEPOSITORY INSTITUTIONS

Allows a mortgage loan originator to work under an exclusive contract for a registered depository institution. Retains the exemption for depository institutions from the mortgage lender and mortgage broker licensing requirements. Establishes the registration requirements for registered depository institutions. Incorporates registered depository institutions into the existing regulatory and enforcements provisions of the mortgage licensing chapter. Exempts governmental agencies from the licensing requirements for mortgage lenders and mortgage loan originators.

(SCS CSHB 12(L&C))

Effective Date: Section 20 takes effect July 29, 2016; remainder of Act takes effect January 1, 2017

Chapter 52 ALASKA REGIONAL ECONOMIC ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Makes the duty of the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development to perform certain acts regarding the Alaska regional economic assistance program subject to appropriation. Requires that the department's annual report cover the activities of regional development organizations. Extends the repeal of the Alaska regional economic assistance program from 2016 to 2021.

(SCS HB 314(FIN))

Effective Date: July 29, 2016; section 4 is retroactive to July 1, 2016

Chapter 53 MARIJUANA POSSESSION; MARIJUANA LOCAL OPTION ELECTIONS

Provides that not more than 12 marijuana plants, with six or fewer being mature, flowering plants, may be present in a single dwelling regardless of the number of persons 21 years of age or older residing in the dwelling. Allows an established village to prohibit the operation of marijuana cultivation facilities, marijuana product manufacturing facilities, marijuana testing facilities, or retail marijuana stores through a local option election. Provides that powers exercised by a borough under AS 17.38.210 may be exercised only on a nonareawide basis. Sets out the procedure for marijuana local option elections. Requires the supreme court to establish a schedule of bail amounts that may be forfeited without court appearance for a

violation of AS 17.38.030 - 17.38.050. Provides definitions for "dwelling," "established village," and "manufacture." (CCS HB 75)

Effective Date: July 29, 2016

Chapter 54 **EDUCATION: PARENTAL RIGHTS, ACCOUNTABILITY SYSTEM, FEDERAL LAW, STATEWIDE STANDARDS-BASED ASSESSMENTS, TRAINING SCHEDULES FOR SCHOOL DISTRICT CERTIFICATED STAFF, SEX EDUCATION PROGRAMS**

Requires local school boards to adopt policies recognizing parental authority, requiring parent notification before certain classes and activities, and allowing parents to withdraw children from activities, classes, programs, and standards-based assessments. Makes various changes relating to the accountability system for schools and districts and removes requirements for the Department of Education and Early Development (DEED) to comply with federal law in implementing the accountability system. Prohibits DEED from requiring schools or districts to administer statewide standards-based assessments after July 1, 2016, and before July 1, 2018, unless the United States Department of Education notifies DEED that the United States Department of Education intends to withhold federal education funding from the state as a result of the prohibition. Revises requirements for school boards to establish certain training schedules for certificated employees of school districts. Allows school districts to require teachers to obtain physical examinations as a condition of employment, but does not require school districts to pay the cost of the physical examinations. Requires a teacher of a class in sex education to possess a valid teacher certificate or to be supervised by a person who has a valid teacher certificate. Repeals the minimum expenditure for instruction, and repeals changes made under sec. 4, ch. 2, SSSLA 2015, to requirements for administering surveys in schools. (SCS CSHB 156(FIN)(efd fld H))

Effective Date: October 26, 2016

Chapter 55 **CODE OF MILITARY JUSTICE**

Establishes a Code of Military Justice, which is applicable to members of the militia. Creates courts-martial procedures and appeal procedures. Enumerates military offenses and punishments. Updates and makes conforming changes to existing Alaska statutes governing the administration of military justice. (SCS CSHB 126(JUD))

Effective Date: August 7, 2016

Chapter 56 **FINANCIAL ACCOUNTS FOR INDIVIDUALS WITH DISABILITIES**

Enables the state to implement a program to allow financial accounts to be established by or for individuals with disabilities to pay their qualified disability

expenses. Provides the basis for beneficial tax treatment of the accounts under the federal law authorizing the program. Permits the state to cooperate with other states to procure services for the program and to allow state residents to participate in other states' programs. Prohibits the state from considering an account amount when determining certain state benefits. Establishes an expense fund for the program. Allows the state to file a Medicaid claim against an account after death for payments made to the deceased person. **(CSHB 188(FIN))**

Effective Date: Section 8 takes effect August 7, 2016; remainder of Act takes effect November 4, 2016

Chapter 57 EXTENSIONS OF CERTAIN STATE LAND LEASES, STATE LAND EXCHANGES, AND AMENDING DEFINITIONS OF STATE LAND

Allows one extension of a lease of state land under certain circumstances for a purpose other than the extraction of natural resources for a period of up to two years. Changes the notice requirements for an exchange of state land. Clarifies statutory definitions of 'state land.' Revises state land exchange procedures. Removes a requirement that the director of the division of lands find that exchanging mineral rights in state land achieves a significant public purpose. Clarifies that revenue derived from existing rights in state land continues to accrue to the state until that state land is exchanged. Changes the hearing requirement for a state land exchange involving land worth more than \$5,000,000 to a requirement that the director hold at least two public meetings, of which one may be held telephonically, for such an exchange. **(CSHB 274(RES))**

Effective Date: November 8, 2016

Chapter 58 IN-STATE UREA, AMMONIA, OR GAS-TO-LIQUIDS PRODUCTS PROCESSING FACILITY

Creates a tax credit for a taxpayer that owns an in-state urea, ammonia, or gas-to-liquid product processing facility. The credit is equal to the percentage of royalty paid on natural gas from a state lease that is delivered to the facility for processing. Allows the commissioner of the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to enter into an agreement to accept the price of gas established in the contract between DNR and an in-state urea, ammonia, or gas-to-liquid product processing facility for the purpose of calculating the royalty value. **(SCS CSHB 100(FIN) am S)**

Effective Date: Sections 1, 2, and 4 take effect July 1, 2017; section 3 takes effect January 1, 2024

Chapter 59 BIG GAME COMMERCIAL SERVICES BOARD

Extends the termination date of the Big Game Commercial Services Board to June 30, 2019. Requires the Big Game Commercial Services Board to submit a

written report to the legislature by October 31, 2016, that outlines the board's plan to be financially solvent by December 31, 2019. **(SCS HB 254(FIN))**

Effective Date: October 8, 2016

Chapter 60 **ANIMALS**

Amends certain provisions relating to animal cruelty, seizure of animals, and destruction of animals. Provides for inclusion of animals in protective orders. Allows courts to consider ownership or joint ownership of animals in dissolution of marriage and divorce proceedings. **(CSHB 147(JUD))**

Effective Date: January 17, 2017

FOURTH SPECIAL SESSION

Chapter 1 MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS

Makes appropriations for the operating and capital expenses of the state's integrated comprehensive mental health program for the fiscal year 2017. **(CCS HB 257)**

Effective Date: Sections 9 and 12 take effect June 29, 2016; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2016; section 9 is retroactive to April 17, 2016

Chapter 2 CAPITAL BUDGET

Makes appropriations for capital projects. Amends prior appropriations and reappropriates money from prior appropriations for capital projects and other purposes. Makes supplemental appropriations for the operation of the state government for fiscal year 2016. Capitalizes funds. Makes other fund transfers and appropriations. **(HCS CSSB 138(FIN) am H(brf sup maj fld H))**

Effective Date: The appropriations made in sections 19(b), 23(a), and 26(d) are conditional; sections 4, 7, 10, 12, 17(b), and 38 take effect June 29, 2016; sections 17(a), 18(b) - (c), 19(a), 21, 22, 23(b), 24, 25, 26(a) - (c), 27(a), 27(d) - (f), and 28 - 32 take effect June 30, 2016; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2016; section 12 is retroactive to June 30, 2015

Chapter 3 OPERATING AND LOAN PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS

Makes appropriations for the operating and loan program expenses of the state government and for certain programs, capitalizes funds, amends appropriations, repeals appropriations, makes supplemental appropriations, reappropriates money, and makes appropriations under art. IX, sec. 17(c), Constitution of the State of Alaska, from the constitutional budget reserve fund. **(CCS HB 256)**

Effective Date: Sections 12(e), 22(a), 26(d), 27(c), 36, and 38 take effect June 29, 2016; sections 13(g), 31, 34, and the fiscal note for HB 247 as described in section 2 of this Act take effect June 30, 2016; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2016; the appropriations made in section 1 of this Act that appropriate either the unexpended and unobligated balance of specific fiscal year 2016 program receipts or the unexpended and unobligated balance on June 30, 2016, of a specified account are retroactive to June 30, 2016, solely for the purpose of carrying forward a prior fiscal year balance; sections 12(e), 22(a), 26(d), and 27(c) are retroactive to April 17, 2016

OIL AND GAS PRODUCTION TAX, TAX CREDITS, INTEREST ON DELINQUENT TAX

Requires the Alaska Oil and Gas Conservation Commission to make certain findings related to the commencement of oil or gas production for purposes of the application of certain production tax value reductions. Increases the interest rate for delinquent oil and gas production tax to seven percentage points above the federal funds rate, compounding quarterly for the first three years after the tax is due, eliminates interest accrual after three years. Makes public the name of the person receiving a tax credit certificate and the total aggregate amount of oil and gas production tax credits purchased from that person each year. Limits the production tax cap on oil produced in Cook Inlet to one dollar per barrel. Reduces the qualified capital expenditure credit against oil and gas production tax to 10 percent of a qualified capital expenditure, beginning January 1, 2017, and terminates the credit for Cook Inlet on January 1, 2018. Reduces the carried-forward net operating loss credit against oil and gas production tax for the North Slope to 15 percent of a carried-forward annual loss beginning January 1, 2017, and terminates the credit for Cook Inlet on January 1, 2018. Requires the carried-forward net operating loss tax credit to be recaptured before the calculation of certain other adjustments to the production value of oil and gas. Reduces the well lease expenditure credit to 20 percent, beginning January 1, 2017, and terminates the credit for Cook Inlet on January 1, 2018. Clarifies that oil or gas must receive a certain production tax value reduction in order to qualify for a certain per-barrel tax credit. Extends the applicability of a frontier basin credit to July 1, 2017. Caps the total amount of oil and gas production tax credit certificates that the Department of Revenue (DOR) may purchase from a person at \$70,000,000 per year. Requires DOR to adopt regulations related to the purchasing of tax credit certificates that give a preference to applicants that hire a greater percentage of resident workers and that reduce the value of certain certificates. Allows DOR to withhold certain tax credit certificate purchases equal to amounts owed to the state. Eliminates the reduction of the gross value for certain "new" oil or gas after seven years or three consecutive or nonconsecutive years of oil prices above \$70 per barrel. Eliminates reduction of the gross value of oil and gas from certain leases or properties that pay a royalty rate over 12.5 percent after seven years or three consecutive or nonconsecutive years of oil prices above \$70 per barrel. Amends certain calculations related to oil and gas production tax paid by municipalities. Adds a bond requirement for business licenses for certain oil and gas businesses. Repeals the exploration incentive credits on January 1, 2017. On January 1, 2018, repeals statutes related to the calculation of certain lease expenditures accrued before 2010. **(CCS HB 247)**

Effective Date: Sections 22, 37, and 38 take effect June 29, 2016; sections 29, 34, and 36 take effect January 1, 2018; remainder of Act takes effect January 1, 2017

Chapter 5 **REINSURANCE PROGRAM**

Establishes the Alaska comprehensive health insurance fund and provides that the legislature may appropriate from the fund to pay for a reinsurance program. Permits the director of the division of insurance to seek a waiver for state innovation from the federal government with respect to health insurance coverage in the state.
(SCS CSHB 374(FIN))

Effective Date: Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 7 take effect July 19, 2016;
 remainder of Act takes effect October 16, 2016; section 3 is
 retroactive to June 30, 2016

Chapter 6 **PROXY FOR ADOPTION OR GUARDIANSHIP OF A CHILD IN STATE CUSTODY**

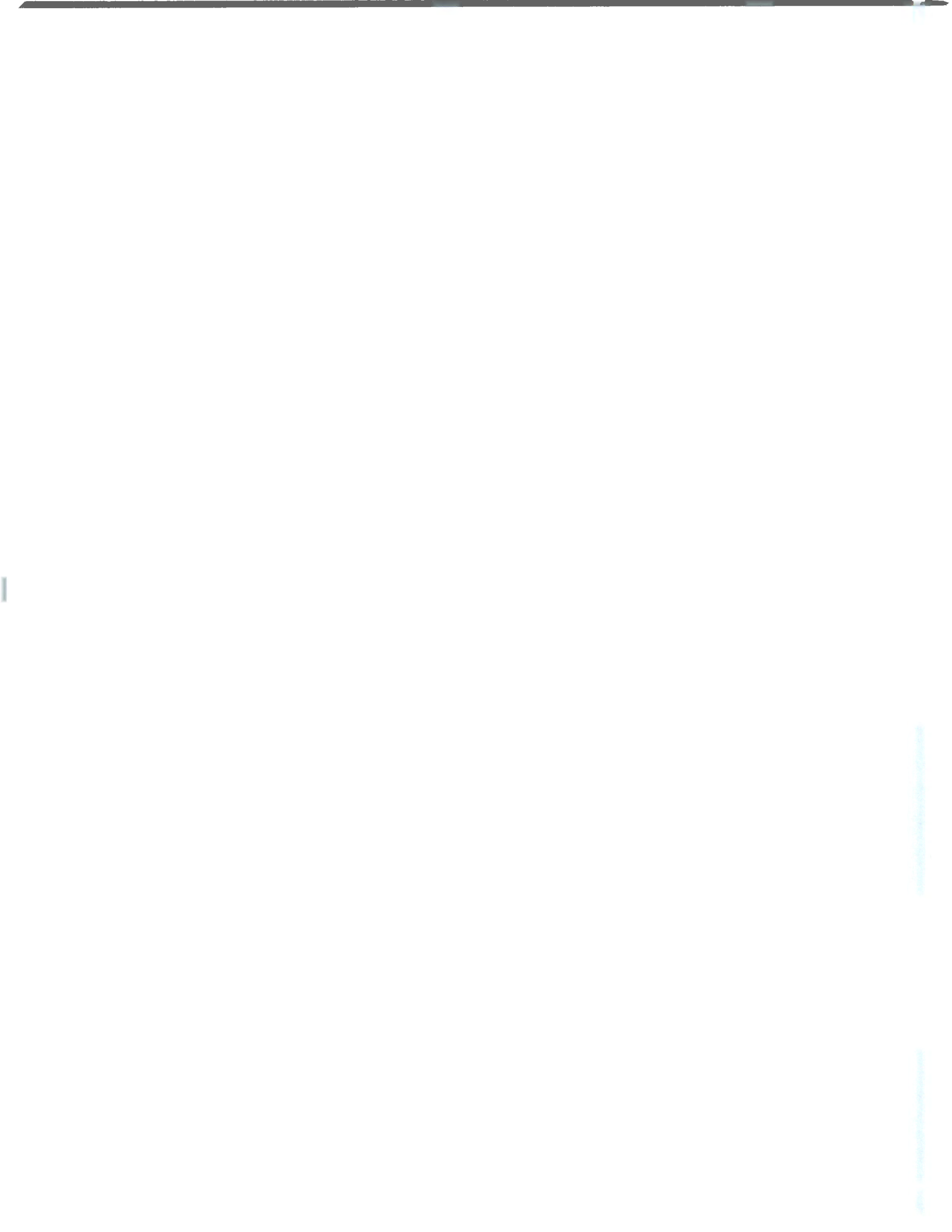
Requires, with some exceptions, child custody proceedings and proceedings for the adoption of or appointment of a guardian for a child in state custody under AS 47.10 to take place as part of the child-in-need-of-aid proceeding. Allows a person seeking the immediate permanent placement of a child in state custody under AS 47.10 to file a proxy for a formal petition for adoption or legal guardianship of the child. In a case involving an Indian child, a proxy for a formal petition preserves placement preferences under the Indian Child Welfare Act. Amends court rules related to a petition or proxy for adoption or legal guardianship of a child who is the subject of a pending child-in-need-of-aid proceeding. (CSHB 200(HSS) am)

Effective Date: Section 19 takes effect July 27, 2016; remainder of Act takes
 effect January 1, 2017

Chapter 7 **CHILD PROTECTION AND OPPORTUNITY ACT**

Requires the Department of Health and Social Services (H&SS) to recruit foster parents and adoptive parents. When transferring a child in need of aid to a new placement setting, requires H&SS to search for an appropriate placement with an adult family member and to coordinate with a child's school district to allow the child to continue attending the same school. Requires H&SS to report to the court, and the court to make findings relating to H&SS's efforts to find a permanent placement for a child in need of aid. Allows H&SS to place a child 16 years of age or older in another transitional living arrangement. 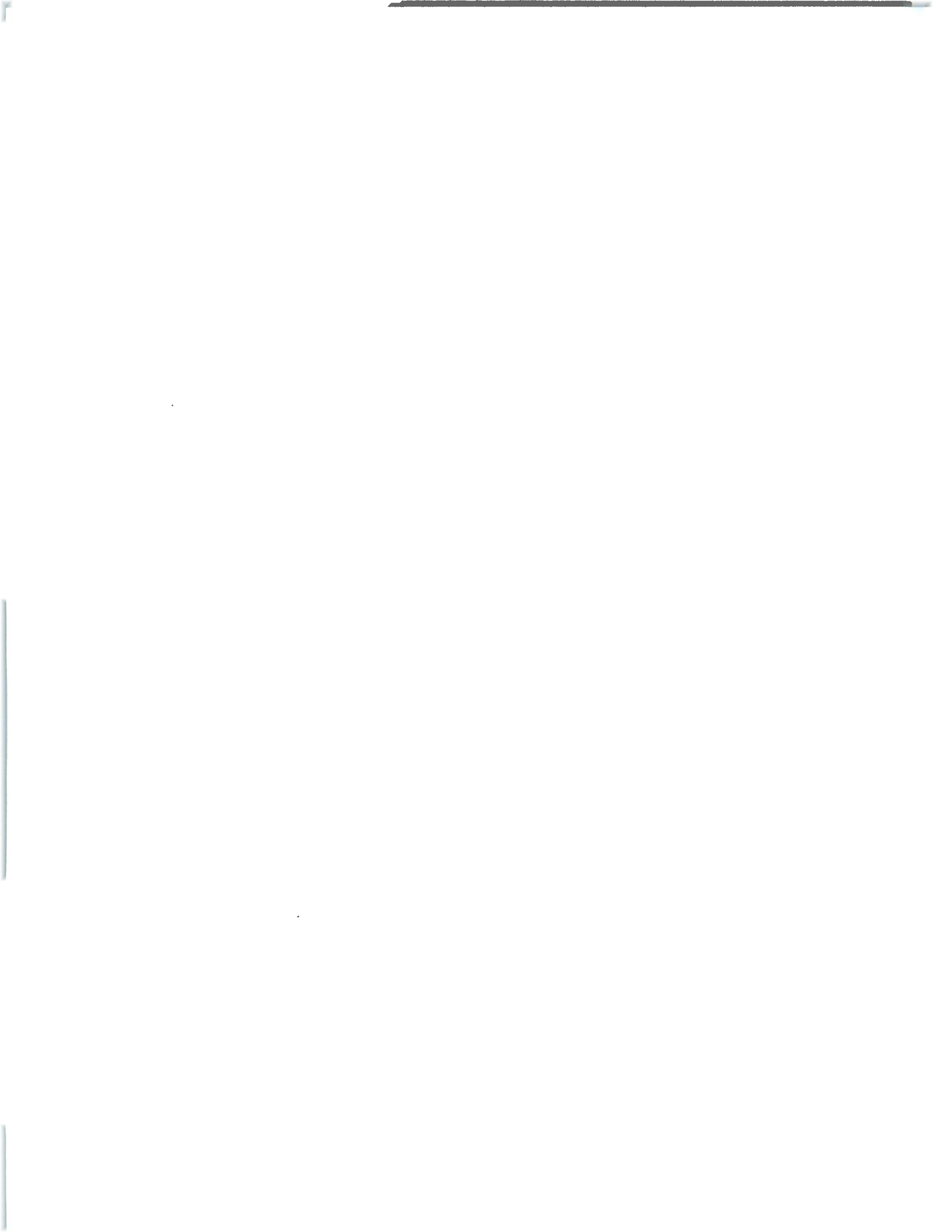

Adds three nonvoting legislative members to the board of the Alaska Gasline Development Corporation, including one member from the minority caucus. Specifies that certain board responsibilities may only be executed by voting board members.

USE OF CONSUMER CREDIT HISTORY OR INSURANCE SCORE BY INSURERS

Removes prohibition against underwriting or rating a personal insurance policy at renewal based in whole or in part on a consumer's credit history or insurance score. Requires that insurers who use a consumer's credit history or insurance score provide reasonable exceptions to the insurer's rates, rating classifications, company or tier placement, or underwriting rules or guidelines for consumers who have experienced certain extraordinary life circumstances. 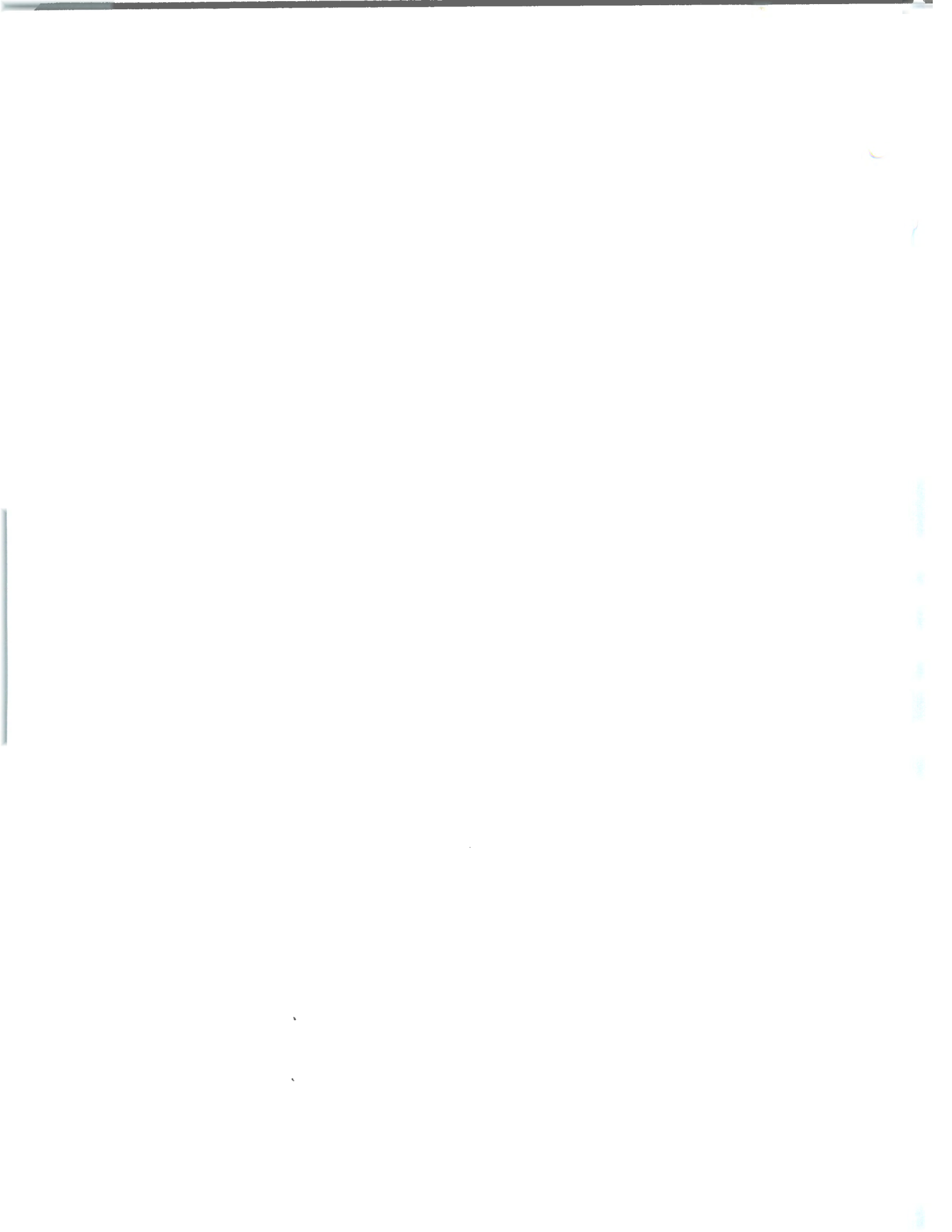

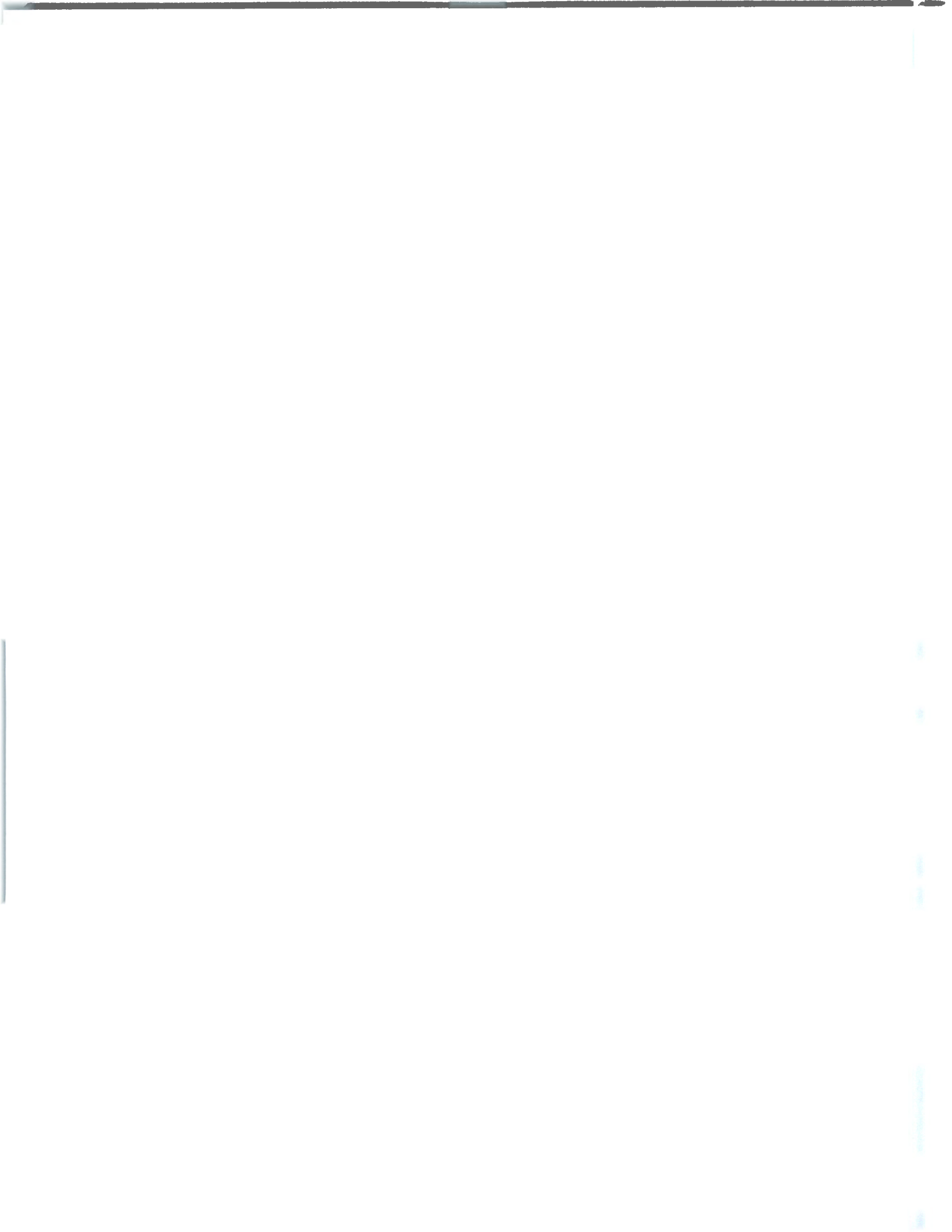
