SYNOPSES OF LAWS ENACTED BY CHAPTER

SYNOPSIS OF LAWS ENACTED BY CHAPTER

Chapter 1 **SUPPLEMENTAL BUDGET FOR DISASTER RELIEF**

Makes supplemental appropriations related to unemployment assistance, fire suppression, and earthquake disaster relief for fiscal year 2019. Makes and amends appropriations to capitalize funds. **(CSSB 38(FIN))**

Effective Date: April 6, 2019

Chapter 2 **SUPERIOR COURT JUDGES, THIRD JUDICIAL DISTRICT**

Increases the number of superior court judges from 43 to 45 and allocates the two additional positions to the third judicial district. **(SB 41)**

Effective Date: July 1, 2019

Chapter 3 **SCOTT JOHNSON MEMORIAL BRIDGE**

Names bridge number 506 over the Tok River at mile 1309 of the Alaska Highway the Scott Johnson Memorial Bridge. **(HB 34)**

Effective Date: August 15, 2019

Chapter 4 **TROOPER GABE RICH MEMORIAL BRIDGE**

Names bridge number 392 over the Chatanika River at mile 38.8 of the Steese Highway the Trooper Gabe Rich Memorial Bridge. **(HB 88)**

Effective Date: August 15, 2019

Chapter 5 **LEGISLATIVE ETHICS ACT**

Adds a legislative finding that a right of a constituent to have access to legislators and the right of a person to petition the government are rights protected by the Constitution of the State of Alaska, and the Legislative Ethics Act (the Act) is not intended to restrict those rights. Changes a limitation on official action and official influence from a limitation where the action or influence of a legislator could substantially benefit or harm the financial interest of a member of the legislator's immediate family, an employer or prospective employer of the family member or the legislator, or a person from whom the legislator or family member has received more than \$10,000 income in a 12-month period, and clarifies that, unless barred by the Uniform Rules of the Alaska State Legislature, the limitations apply when the effect

of the vote or other action is likely to substantially benefit or harm the financial interest of the legislator, the legislator's spouse, or a person with whom the legislator or the legislator's spouse is employed or negotiating for employment. Narrows the definition of "substantially benefit or harm" in AS 24.60.030, the section on prohibited conduct and conflicts of interest. Repeals the definition of "financial interest" applicable to the chapter, and replaces it with a new definition applicable only in AS 24.60.030. **(FCCS SB 89)**

Effective Date: May 25, 2019

Chapter 6 **KATIE JOHN DAY**

Establishes May 31 of each year as Katie John Day to honor Ahtna Athabascan elder Katie John for her mentoring and advocacy in defense of Alaska Native customary and traditional hunting, fishing, and gathering rights. **(HCS SB 78(TRB))**

Effective Date: May 31, 2019

Chapter 7 **CRIMINAL LAW AND PROCEDURE**

Relating to the term of a protective order. Relating to grounds for denial of a protective order. Relating to the extension of a protective order. **(SCS CSHB 12(JUD))**

Effective Date: September 8, 2019

Chapter 8 **STATEWIDE SUICIDE PREVENTION COUNCIL**

Extends the termination date of the Statewide Suicide Prevention Council to June 30, 2027. **(SB 10)**

Effective Date: June 27, 2019

Chapter 9 **MORTGAGE LENDER, BROKER, AND ORIGINATOR LICENSING**

Adds exemptions for certain persons and entities from the mortgage lender, mortgage broker, and loan originator licensing requirements of the Alaska Secure and Fair Enforcement for Mortgage Licensing Act of 2010. The mortgage lender and broker exemption covers bona fide nonprofit organizations. The loan originator exemptions cover certain sellers, certain governmental employees, and certain employees of bona fide nonprofit organizations. Makes the exemption for sellers retroactive to July 1, 2008. **(CSHB 104(L&C) am S)**

Effective Date: Sections 2, 6, and 7 take effect June 29, 2019; AS 06.60.015(b)(4), enacted by section 2 of this Act, is retroactive to July 1, 2008; remainder of Act takes effect January 1, 2020

Chapter 10 **RECREATIONAL SITE LICENSE; BOND REQUIREMENT FOR CERTAIN ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE LICENSE HOLDERS**

Allows the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board to issue, renew, or transfer a recreational site license for a licensed premises that does not qualify as a "recreational site" if the applicant for the license meets certain other requirements. Provides an exception to the requirement that certain license holders must furnish a surety bond. Requires the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board to reconsider an application for issuance, renewal, or transfer of a recreational site license that the board previously denied if the applicant meets certain requirements.

(HCS CSSB 16(FIN) am H)

Effective Date: July 6, 2019; AS 04.11.210(d), enacted by section 1 of this Act, is retroactive to January 1, 2018; AS 04.11.210(e), enacted by section 1 of this Act, is retroactive to October 1, 2018

Chapter 11 **CRIMINAL LAW AND PROCEDURE; DUTIES OF PROSECUTING ATTORNEYS; VICTIM NOTIFICATION**

Includes strangulation to the point of unconsciousness in the crime of assault in the first degree. Amends the elements of the crime of harassment in the first degree. Amends the definitions of "dangerous instrument" and "sexual contact." Defines "semen." Limits the conditions under which a court may grant credit against a sentence of imprisonment. Adds strangulation that results in unconsciousness as an aggravating factor that must be considered by a court at sentencing. Amends the duties of a prosecuting attorney. Expands victim notification requirements.

(SCS CSHB 14(FIN))

Effective Date: October 17, 2019

Chapter 12 **INSURERS AND CORPORATE GOVERNANCE; INSURANCE HOLDING COMPANIES AND INSURANCE COMPANY HOLDING SYSTEMS**

Requires domestic insurers to provide a corporate governance annual disclosure to the director of the division of insurance. Clarifies when a domestic insurer is required to notify the director of the division of insurance of a transaction between the domestic insurer and a person in its insurance holding company holding system. Allows the director of the division of insurance to act as the group-wide supervisor of an internationally active insurer or recognize another insurance regulatory official as the group-wide supervisor. **(SCS HB 78(RLS) am S)**

Effective Date: July 20, 2019

Chapter 13 **REVISOR'S BILL**
Makes corrective amendments to various Alaska Statutes as recommended by the Revisor of Statutes. **(HCS SB 71(JUD))**

Effective Date: October 17, 2019

Chapter 14 **BOARD OF DENTAL EXAMINERS**
Extends the termination date of the Board of Dental Examiners to June 30, 2027. **(SB 25)**

Effective Date: August 2, 2019

Chapter 15 **HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONALS WORKFORCE ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM**

Establishes the health care professionals workforce enhancement program for the purpose of addressing the shortage of health care professionals in the state. Eligible health care professionals must agree to work for a minimum of three years in underserved areas in the state in exchange for partial repayment of student loans and specified cash incentives up to a maximum combined total. The commissioner of health and social services, in cooperation with an advisory council, manages and administers the program. Participating employers must provide funding for employees in the program. The workforce enhancement program replaces the loan repayment and incentive program that was repealed July 1, 2019. **(HCS CSSB 93(FIN))**

Effective Date: August 2, 2019; section 1 is retroactive to July 1, 2019

Chapter 16 **BOARD OF NURSING**
Extends the termination date of the Board of Nursing to June 30, 2025. **(SB 36)**

Effective Date: August 9, 2019

Chapter 17 **STATEWIDE IMMUNIZATION PROGRAM**

Reauthorizes and amends the statewide immunization program established in 2014, which monitors, purchases, and distributes all childhood vaccines and select adult vaccines to providers. Creates the vaccine assessment fund as an account in the general fund. The commissioner of health and social services administers the program. Assessments from health plans and insurers and other fees provide funding for the program. **(CSSB 37(FIN))**

Effective Date: August 9, 2019

Chapter 18 **PRESCRIPTION OF DRUGS WITHOUT PHYSICAL EXAMINATION BY PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT; PREFERRED DRUG LIST AND PRIOR AUTHORIZATION MEDICATIONS LIST**

Authorizes a physician assistant to prescribe a drug without conducting a physical examination of the patient under certain conditions. Allows a physician assistant to prescribe a controlled substance or botulinum toxin to a patient without conducting a physical examination if an appropriate licensed health care provider is present with the patient. Permits the Department of Health and Social Services to incorporate by reference into the state's Medicaid program regulations future amended versions of the preferred drug list adopted under AS 47.07.065(b) and the prior authorization medications list. **(HCS CSSB 44(FIN))**

Effective Date: Sections 5 - 7 take effect August 8, 2019; remainder of Act takes effect March 1, 2020

Chapter 19 **LICENSE TO DRIVE A COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLE**

Lowers the minimum age to 18 to operate a commercial vehicle in intrastate commerce under AS 28.33.100(a). Creates an exception to the minimum age requirement for operating a commercial vehicle in interstate commerce for a person who holds a valid commercial driver's license under AS 28.33.100(a) and is authorized to operate a commercial vehicle in interstate commerce under federal law. **(SB 75)**

Effective Date: November 14, 2019

Chapter 20 **HYDROELECTRIC SITE AT THE NUYAKUK RIVER FALLS**

Establishes that development and operation of a hydroelectric site at the Nuyakuk River Falls is a use compatible with the Wood-Tikchik State Park, provided that (1) the development does not include a dam that fully spans the river; (2) the operation maintains at least 70 percent of the daily upstream water flow along the natural course of the river; and (3) the operation is licensed by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission by July 1, 2024. Provides for conforming changes to the Wood-Tikchik State Park management plan. **(CSSB 91(FIN))**

Effective Date: August 17, 2019

Chapter 21 **TRANSFER OF ALASKA RAILROAD CORPORATION LAND**

Approves the transfer of a parcel of Alaska Railroad Corporation land in the Alaska Railroad Healy Reserve near Otto Lake to Alaska Tourism Development, LLC. **(SB 54)**

Effective Date: August 17, 2019

Chapter 22 **TRANSFER OF STATE AND ALASKA RAILROAD CORPORATION LAND**
Authorizes the Department of Natural Resources to convey a parcel of real property used as a shooting range to the Tok Shooters Association, Inc. Authorizes the Alaska Railroad Corporation to convey a parcel of real property to the Whittier Manor Condominium Association, Inc. **(HCS SB 95(RES) am H)**

Effective Date: August 17, 2019

Chapter 23 **BOARD OF MARINE PILOTS**
Extends the termination date of the Board of Marine Pilots to June 30, 2027. **(SB 29)**

Effective Date: August 17, 2019

Chapter 24 **REGULATION OF TELECOMMUNICATION UTILITIES**
Permits the Regulatory Commission of Alaska (RCA) to employ up to five utilities analyst masters and adds utilities analysts masters to the exempt service list. Prohibits the RCA from designating a local exchange or interexchange carrier as a carrier of last resort. Allows the RCA to designate a telecommunications carrier in a manner consistent with federal law. Allows the RCA to require a telecommunications carrier to make tariff filings regarding services provided to inmates in the custody of the Department of Corrections. Requires certificated telecommunications utilities to pay an annual regulatory cost charge, and requires that the terms and conditions of service for basic telephone service be uniform throughout a carrier's service area. Mandates that retail rates of a long distance telephone company be geographically averaged. Exempts telecommunications utilities from the provisions of the Alaska Public Utilities Regulatory Act (AS 42.05), other than provisions regarding the ability of the RCA to designate a carrier of last resort, utility certification requirements, a public utility regulatory cost charge, required services, reduced and reasonable rates, eminent domain, exchange access charges, the universal service fund, exchange carrier associations, municipal authority, and the resale of telecommunications services. Exempts local exchange carriers from municipal regulation. Repeals and amends statutes concerning the registration and regulation of alternative operator and long distance telephone service. **(HCS SB 83(L&C))**

Effective Date: November 27, 2019

Chapter 25 **CLAIMS AGAINST INSURANCE POLICIES OF VESSEL OWNERS**
Changes the benefit an eligible vessel owner may receive from the fishermen's fund administered by the Department of Labor and Workforce Development, for a qualifying claim by a fisherman, to the lesser of the full amount of the amount of the vessel owner's indemnity insurance policy deductible or \$5,000. **(SB 61)**

Effective Date: December 9, 2019

Chapter 26 **BOARD OF BARBERS AND HAIRDRESSERS; BIG GAME COMMERCIAL SERVICES BOARD; LICENSE QUALIFICATIONS FOR GUIDE-OUTFITTERS, MASTER GUIDE-OUTFITTERS, CLASS-A ASSISTANT GUIDES, ASSISTANT GUIDES, AND TRANSPORTERS**

Extends the termination date for the Board of Barbers and Hairdressers to June 30, 2027, and the termination date for the Big Game Commercial Services Board to June 30, 2024. Provides that a guide-outfitter, master guide-outfitter, class-A assistant guide, assistant guide, or transporter may not continue to hold the individual's respective guide or transporter license if the individual is convicted of certain violations or crimes. Changes the qualifications for licensure as a master-guide outfitter. (HCS CSSB 43(FIN) am H)

Effective Date: September 14, 2019

Chapter 27 **BLACK HISTORY MONTH**

Establishes the month of February as Black History Month. (SB 40)

Effective Date: December 18, 2019

Chapter 28 **WILLARD E. DUNHAM RESIDENCE HALL**

Names the Alaska Vocational Technical Center building in Seward, Alaska, the Willard E. Dunham Residence Hall. (SB 100)

Effective Date: December 26, 2019

Chapter 29 **ALASKA NATIVE HERITAGE MONTH**

Establishes November as Alaska Native Heritage Month. (HB 126)

Effective Date: January 3, 2020

FIRST SPECIAL SESSION

Chapter 1 **OPERATING AND LOAN PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes appropriations for the operating and loan program expenses of the state government and for certain programs, capitalizes funds, amends appropriations, and makes supplemental appropriations. (CCS SSHB 39)

Effective Date: Sections 4 - 6 , 8, 9, 10(b), 11 - 13, 15, and 42 take effect June 29, 2019; sections 4 - 6, 8, 9, 10(b), 11 - 13 and 15 are retroactive to May 1, 2019; sections 10(a), 14, 39, 40, and 43 take effect June 30, 2019; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2019

Chapter 2 **MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes appropriations for the operating and capital expenses of the state's integrated comprehensive mental health program for fiscal year 2020. (CCS SSHB 40)

Effective Date: July 1, 2019

Chapter 3 **CAPITAL BUDGET**

Makes appropriations for capital projects. Amends prior appropriations and reappropriates money from prior appropriations for capital projects and other purposes. Capitalizes funds. Makes supplemental appropriations and other fund transfers and appropriations. (HCS CSSSB 19(FIN) am H(brf sup maj fld H))

Effective Date: The appropriations made from the constitutional budget reserve fund in sections 1 - 6 are conditional; the appropriations made in sections 14(a), 14(b), and 19(b) are conditional; remainder of Act takes effect July 9, 2019; sections 4 - 6, 9, 12(a), 29, and 30(a) are retroactive to May 15, 2019; sections 13(a) and (b), 15(a), 16, 17, 18(b), 21 - 26, and 30(d) - (f) are retroactive to June 30, 2019; sections 1 - 3, 7, 8, 10, 11, 12(b), 13(c) and (d), 14, 15(b), 18(a), 19, 20, 27, and 30(b) and (c) are retroactive to July 1, 2019

Chapter 4 **CRIMINAL LAW AND PROCEDURE; PROBATION AND PAROLE; RELATING TO REPORTING CHILD ABUSE OR NEGLECT; VILLAGE PUBLIC SAFETY OFFICER PROGRAM; MOTOR VEHICLES; DUTIES OF PROSECUTING ATTORNEYS; DUTIES OF THE COMMISSIONER OF CORRECTIONS**

Changes the requisite mental state for certain sexual assault crimes from knowingly to recklessly. Amends the marriage defense provision for certain crimes of sexual assault. Increases the criminal penalties for unlawful exploitation of a minor and

indecent exposure in the first degree. Removes the inflation adjustment for theft offenses. Makes theft of an identification document theft in the second degree, and use of a stolen identification a crime of fraudulent use. Creates the crime of possession of motor vehicle theft tools. Amends the crime of escape in the third degree to include removal of an electronic monitor or leaving one's residence without prior authorization while under detention for a felony. Amends the penalties for failure to appear and violation of condition of release. Adds threats which cause initiation of an emergency protocol to the offense of terroristic threatening. Limits the definite term of imprisonment for disorderly conduct. Amends harassment in the second degree to include repeated distribution of photographs showing genitals. Increases the criminal penalties for indecent viewing or production of a picture. Establishes the offense of solicitation or production of an indecent picture of a minor. Reclassifies drug offenses with schedule IA controlled substances and manufacture of methamphetamine or its salts, isomers, or salts of isomers or its immediate precursors as misconduct involving a controlled substance in the second degree. Increases the penalty for misconduct involving a controlled substance in the fifth degree for the second offense within ten years to a class C felony for a controlled substance other than marijuana. Amends conditions of pretrial release and third party custodian requirements. Increases the maximum allowable period of probation. Amends the definite terms of imprisonment for felonies and certain sexual felonies. Prohibits the suspension or reduction of the period of probation for sexual felonies. Amends the definite terms of imprisonment for misdemeanors. Amends the requirements for consideration at sentencing of prior felony convictions. Adds the offenses of sexual abuse of a minor in the third degree and indecent viewing or production of a picture to the definition of "sexual felony for purposes of sentencing and probation." Relates to the duties of the prosecuting attorney. Requires notification of the victim of a sex offense of available state resources. Amends the duty and duration requirements for the registration of sex offenders and child kidnappers. Requires any person required to register as a sex offender or child kidnapper in another jurisdiction to register in Alaska. Amends the village public safety officer program to include the ability to work with Alaska Native organizations. Authorizes administrative revocation of a driver's license for failure to pay fines for motor vehicle offenses in the amount of \$1000 or more. Amends the crime of driving while license cancelled, suspended or revoked. Amends the department of transportation's authority to revoke or reinstate driver's licenses. Establishes the crime of failure to use headlights. Amends the earned compliance credit program for complying with conditions of probation and conditions of parole. Amends parole eligibility requirements. Relates to the duties of the commissioner of corrections. Relates to the offender risk assessment program. Amends annual reporting requirements for the Alaska Criminal Justice Commission. Requires the attorney general to develop a method to track sex offenses. Requires the department of law to gather and report data on felony sex offenses. Relates to sexual assault examination kit testing. Relates to disclosure of information about minor offenders. Relates to reporting child abuse, neglect, or sex offenses against a child. Amends Alaska Court Rules relating to prior convictions and two way video conferencing. Repeals provisions of the marriage defense to sexual assault crimes, the property value threshold, adjustment of inflation for property value or services,

provisions related to technical violations of probation, mandatory minimum sentences of imprisonment for certain misdemeanor offenses, procedures relating to notice of seeking to establish aggravating factors at sentencing, and provisions of discretionary parole. Requires reports relating to corrections, rehabilitative services, and involuntary commitment. **(CCS HB 49)**

Effective Date: Sections 126 - 129 take effect January 1, 2020; sections 123 - 125 take effect July 1, 2020; section 131 takes effect September 1, 2020; remainder of Act takes effect July 9, 2019

ELIMINATING AN EXEMPTION FROM SALARY SCHEDULE LIMITS FOR CERTAIN EMPLOYEES

Moves from the exempt service of the state to the partially exempt service of the state persons who are employed as professionals to make a temporary or special inquiry, study, or examination as authorized by the governor. Repeals the authority of the governor or a designee of the governor to authorize pay that is higher than is otherwise allowable by law for employees of the executive branch who are in the partially exempt service. Requires the commissioner of administration to prepare and submit to the legislature, within 60 days, a report that lists all positions in the exempt and partially exempt service of the state and the salary and proposed salary schedule for each of those positions. **(CSHB 48(FIN) am)**
