SYNOPSES OF LAWS ENACTED BY CHAPTER

**SYNOPSIS OF LAWS ENACTED BY CHAPTER
2023**

Chapter 1 **APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes supplemental appropriations and other appropriations. Makes appropriations under art. IX, sec. 17(c), Constitution of the State of Alaska, from the constitutional budget reserve fund. **(CSHB 79(FIN))**

Effective Date: April 1, 2023

Chapter 2 **CARBON MANAGEMENT AND OFFSET**

Grants the Alaska Oil and Gas Conservation Commission authority to acquire primary enforcement responsibility for Class VI wells, lets the Commissioner of Natural Resources lease state land for carbon management purposes, and establishes a carbon offset program within the Department of Natural Resources. **(CSSB 48(FIN))**

Effective Date: May 24, 2023

Chapter 3 **OIL TERMINAL FACILITIES**

Establishes that a tank vessel or oil barge with an approved contingency plan and proof of financial ability satisfies the additional contingency plan and proof of financial ability requirements for an oil terminal facility when it is also functioning as an oil terminal facility. Removes a tank vessel or oil barge with both an approved contingency plan and proof of financial ability from the definition of "oil terminal facility". **(CSHB 128(TRA))**

Effective Date: May 25, 2023

Chapter 4 **VETERAN HUNTING, FISHING, TRAPPING LICENSES**

Directs the Department of Fish and Game to issue a permanent sport fishing, hunting, or trapping identification card to a state resident who has been discharged from military service under honorable conditions and with a 50 percent or greater disability incurred during military service, and a person who served in the Alaska Territorial Guard who has a 50 percent or greater disability incurred during service in the Alaska Territorial Guard. Waives fees for waterfowl conservation and king salmon tags for a resident holding the permanent identification card. Requires a resident with a permanent identification card to have the card or the appropriate license in possession when fishing, hunting, or trapping. **(SB 10 am H)**

Effective Date: January 1, 2024

Chapter 5 **RENEWABLE ENERGY GRANT FUND**

Removes the repealer for the renewable energy grant fund and recommendation program, which had been set to sunset June 30, 2023, thus extending the program indefinitely. **(SCS HB 62(FIN))**

Effective Date: May 26, 2023

Chapter 6 **INACTIVE STATE ACCOUNTS AND FUNDS**

Repeals provisions relating to the curriculum improvement and best practices fund, the fuel emergency fund and fuel emergency grants, the special Alaska Historical Commission receipts account, the rural electrification revolving loan fund and loans from the fund, and the Exxon Valdez oil spill unincorporated rural community grant fund and grants from the fund. Requires the legislative finance division to conduct a review of inactive state accounts and funds, make recommendations regarding which inactive state accounts and funds, if any, should be repealed, and submit an electronic report of the division's recommendations. **(CSSB 25(FIN))**

Effective Date: September 11, 2023

Chapter 7 **CORRECTIVE AMENDMENTS: 2023 REVISOR'S BILL**

Makes corrective amendments to various Alaska Statutes as recommended by the revisor of statutes. **(SB 80)**

Effective Date: Section 2 takes effect January 1, 2024; remainder of Act takes effect June 14, 2023

Chapter 8 **THE OFFICE OF VICTIMS' RIGHTS**

Provides that the victims' advocate appointment is effective if the nomination is ratified by two-thirds of the full membership of the senate and the house of representatives, replacing a requirement for a roll call vote of two-thirds of the members of the legislature in joint session. Provides that victims' advocate is entitled to receive an annual salary on the salary schedule set out for attorneys in AS 39.27.011. Allows the president of the senate and the speaker of the house of representatives to jointly appoint an acting victims' advocate if the victims' advocate is not available to appoint an acting advocate. Clarifies that victims' advocate staff shall be compensated on the salary schedule set out in AS 39.27.011(a) and that victims' advocate staff attorneys shall be compensated on the salary schedule set out set out for attorneys in AS 39.27.011. **(SB 81 am)**

Effective Date: June 14, 2023

Chapter 9 **STATE MEDICAL BOARD, BOARD OF CERTIFIED DIRECT-ENTRY MIDWIVES**

Extends the termination dates in AS 08.03.010 for the Board of Certified Direct Entry Midwives from June 30, 2023, to June 30, 2025, and for the State Medical Board from June 20, 2023, to June 30, 2031. **(CSSB 55(FIN) am H)**

Effective date: June 30, 2023

Chapter 10 **RECLASSIFICATION OF FIRST CLASS CITIES**

Provides a process to reclassify a first class city as a second class city if the city's population falls below 400 residents. **(SCS CSHB 69(CRA) am S)**

Effective Date: June 22, 2023

Chapter 11 **EXTENDING THE DATE OF THE ALASKA MINERALS COMMISSION**

Extends the termination date of the Alaska Minerals Commission found in AS 44.33.431 from February 1, 2024, to June 30, 2034. **(HB 103)**

Effective Date: September 19, 2023

Chapter 12 **MANAGEMENT OF THE POWER COST EQUALIZATION ENDOWMENT FUND**

Requires the Alaska Permanent Fund Corporation to manage the power cost equalization endowment fund and to publish certain reports relating to the power cost equalization endowment fund. **(CSSB 98(FIN))**

Effective Date: July 1, 2023

Chapter 13 **THE STATE BOARD OF REGISTRATION FOR ARCHITECTS, ENGINEERS, AND LAND SURVEYORS AND THE PRACTICE OF THOSE PROFESSIONS**

Amends the statute relating to the composition of the State Board of Registration for Architects, Engineers, and Land Surveyors to clarify that an electrical engineer and a mechanical engineer may serve concurrently on the board. Requires that the registrant who signs and seals a document must do the work or be in responsible charge of the work and the work must be within the registrant's field of practice. Acknowledges electronic document transmission, updates the types of business entities that may be registered, and updates the registration process to align with current practices. **(SB 126)**

Effective Date: June 28, 2023

Chapter 14 **VETERINARIAN LICENSURE AND CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES**
Recognizes a new certification process and authorizes the Board of Veterinary Examiners to adopt a certification process for licensure as a veterinarian. Exempts veterinarians from participating in the controlled substance prescription database. **(SCS HB 56(L&C))**

Effective Date: July 7, 2023

Chapter 15 **THE BOARD OF PHARMACY**
Modifies the makeup of the Board of Pharmacy by designating one spot for a licensed pharmacy technician and one for an individual with no financial stake in the healthcare industry. Creates an epinephrine auto-injector training program supervised by the Board of Pharmacy, updates licensing and regulatory requirements for in-state and out-of-state pharmacies as well as pharmacists to comply with the federal Drug Supply Chain and Security Act, and authorizes direct-to-consumer shipments of peritoneal dialysis equipment and medications. **(CSHB 112(L&C) am)**

Effective Date: Sections 4 and 21 take effect July 7, 2023; remainder of Act takes effect November 26, 2023

Chapter 16 **MEDICAID ELIGIBILITY FOR PREGNANT WOMEN**
Raises the household income limit for Medicaid eligibility for pregnant women to 225 percent of the federal poverty line, and permits the Department of Health to allow pregnant women to remain on Medicaid for the maximum period authorized under federal law, subject to federal approval of corresponding amendments to the state Medicaid plan. **(HCS SB 58(FIN))**

Effective Date: Sections 1 and 2 are conditional; remainder of Act takes effect October 17, 2023

Chapter 17 **ESTABLISHING ALASKA COMMUNITY HEALTH AIDE APPRECIATION DAY**
Establishes September 10 of each year as Alaska Community Health Aide Appreciation Day. **(HB 78)**

Effective Date: October 18, 2023

Chapter 18 **FILIPINO AMERICAN HISTORY MONTH**
Establishes October as Filipino American History Month. **(HB 23)**

Effective Date: October 18, 2023

Chapter 19 **ESTABLISHING THE CRIME OF INTERFERENCE WITH EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS**

Makes it a class B misdemeanor for a person to make repeated emergency communications if a person was asked to stop reporting a previously reported incident, or if the person makes multiple reports knowing that there is not a police, fire, or medical emergency. Also criminalizes threatening an emergency communications worker during an emergency communication. **(SB 38)**

Effective Date: October 18, 2023

Chapter 20 **COMMERCIAL DRIVERS' LICENSES**

Removes the requirement that a person hold a driver's license for at least one year or meet experience qualifications established by the Department of Administration before applying for a commercial driver's license. **(CSSB 123(L&C))**

Effective Date: July 30, 2023

Chapter 21 **RESTRICTIONS ON FIREARMS AND OTHER WEAPONS DURING A DISASTER EMERGENCY**

Prohibits the governor, a state agency, or a municipality from issuing or adopting an order, proclamation, regulation, ordinance, or policy relating to certain actions on firearms, firearm parts, firearm accessories, ammunition, or other weapons, closing or limiting operating hours of stores that sell such items or gun ranges unless the closure or limitation applies to all forms of commerce in the jurisdiction, or taking certain actions relating to concealed handgun permits during a disaster emergency declared under AS 26.23.020. Allows a qualified person or a membership organization to bring a civil suit for actions taken by the governor, a state agency, or a municipality in violation of the restrictions. Defines "firearm," "firearm accessory," and "firearm part" for the purposes of the bill. **(SCS CSHB 61(JUD) am S)**

Effective Date: October 27, 2023

Chapter 22 **HEALTH INFORMATION AND MEDICAID**

Authorizes the sharing of confidential health information between the Department of Health and the Department of Family and Community Services. Allows a legally responsible person to provide personal care services to a Medicaid recipient under a home- or community-based waiver. Authorizes the Department of Health to regulate and pay for host home care services, subject to federal approval of changes to the state Medicaid plan. **(HCS CSSB 57(FIN) am H)**

Effective Date: Section 3 is conditional; remainder of Act takes effect
October 27, 2023

Chapter 23 **IDENTIFICATION FOR PRISONERS**

Adds theft of a Department of Corrections issued identification card to the offense of misconduct involving confidential information in the second degree. Allows the director of elections to use information on Department of Corrections issued identification cards to match identifying information provided by a voter with existing identification records. Allows a Department of Corrections issued identification card to be used for obtaining a permit for commercial fishing. Requires the commissioner of corrections to ensure a prisoner has a valid state identification on release and if a prisoner does not have a valid state identification, to issue one prior to the prisoner's release from incarceration. Authorizes the Department of Corrections to issue an identification card to a prisoner before the prisoner's release. Allows an identification card issued by the Department of Corrections to be used for secured transactions purposes. **(SB 119)**

Effective Date: January 1, 2024

Chapter 24 **DON YOUNG DAY**

Establishing Don Young Day on June 9 of each year. **(HB 141)**

Effective Date: November 24, 2023

Chapter 25 **NATIVE CORPORATIONS**

Exempts Native corporations from the requirement that the articles of incorporation of a corporation existing before July 1, 1989, may only be amended with a two-thirds affirmative vote of that corporation's shares. **(HB 123)**

Effective Date: August 29, 2023

Chapter 26 **LUMBER GRADING TRAINING PROGRAM**

Establishes a lumber grading training program to train mill operators to grade lumber and to issue lumber grading certificates. Allows use of load-bearing dimensional lumber graded and certified by an individual holding a lumber grading certificate in one-, two-, and three-family dwellings in the state if certain requirements are met. **(SB 87)**

Effective Date: August 31, 2023

FIRST SPECIAL SESSION

Chapter 1 APPROPRIATIONS

Makes appropriations for the operating and loan program expenses of the state government and for certain programs, capitalizes funds, repeals appropriations, amends appropriations, and makes capital appropriations, supplemental appropriations, and reappropriations. (SCS CSHB 39(FIN) am S)

Effective Date: The appropriations made in sections 1, 41(c), and 42(c) are conditional; sections 8 - 13, 17 - 19, 26, 27(a), 35, 36, 37(a) and (b), 39, 40(a), 41(a) and (b), 42(a) and (b), 43 - 46, 48(c) and (d), 50, 80(a) and (b), and 82 take effect June 19, 2023; sections 20 - 25, 27(b), 28 - 32, 47, 48(a) and (b), 49, 62(b), 71(d), 73(d) - (g), and 80(c) take effect June 30, 2023; sections 5 - 7 and 67(b) take effect January 1, 2024; section 79 takes effect June 30, 2024; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2023; sections 8 - 13, 17 - 19, 26, 27(a), 35, 36, 37(a) and (b), 39, 40(a), 41(a) and (b), 42(a) and (b), 43 - 46, 48(c) and (d), 50, and 80(a) and (b) are retroactive to April 16, 2023; the appropriations made in section 1 of this Act that appropriate either the unexpended and unobligated balance of specific fiscal year 2023 program receipts or the unexpended and unobligated balance on June 30, 2023, of a specified account are retroactive to June 30, 2023, solely for the purpose of carrying forward a prior fiscal year balance

Chapter 2 MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS

Makes appropriations for the operating and capital expenses of the state's integrated comprehensive mental health program for fiscal year 2024. (SCS CSHB 41(FIN))

Effective Date: Section 11 takes effect June 19, 2023; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2023

BILLS PARTIALLY VETOED BY GOVERNOR DUNLEAVY

Chapter 1 **APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes appropriations for the operating and loan program expenses of the state government and for certain programs, capitalizes funds, repeals appropriations, amends appropriations, and makes capital appropriations, supplemental appropriations, and reappropriations. (SCS CSHB 39(FIN) am S)

Effective Date: The appropriations made in sections 1, 41(c), and 42(c) are conditional; sections 8 - 13, 17 - 19, 26, 27(a), 35, 36, 37(a) and (b), 39, 40(a), 41(a) and (b), 42(a) and (b), 43 - 46, 48(c) and (d), 50, 80(a) and (b), and 82 take effect June 19, 2023; sections 20 - 25, 27(b), 28 - 32, 47, 48(a) and (b), 49, 62(b), 71(d), 73(d) - (g), and 80(c) take effect June 30, 2023; sections 5 - 7 and 67(b) take effect January 1, 2024; section 79 takes effect June 30, 2024; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2023; sections 8 - 13, 17 - 19, 26, 27(a), 35, 36, 37(a) and (b), 39, 40(a), 41(a) and (b), 42(a) and (b), 43 - 46, 48(c) and (d), 50, and 80(a) and (b) are retroactive to April 16, 2023; the appropriations made in section 1 of this Act that appropriate either the unexpended and unobligated balance of specific fiscal year 2023 program receipts or the unexpended and unobligated balance on June 30, 2023, of a specified account are retroactive to June 30, 2023, solely for the purpose of carrying forward a prior fiscal year balance

Chapter 2 **MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes appropriations for the operating and capital expenses of the state's integrated comprehensive mental health program for fiscal year 2024. (SCS CSHB 41(FIN))

Effective Date: Section 11 takes effect June 19, 2023; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2023

BILLS VETOED BY GOVERNOR DUNLEAVY

2023

DISAPPROVING STATE OFFICERS COMPENSATION COMMISSION RECOMMENDATIONS

Disapproves the recommendations contained in the January 24, 2023, final report of the State Officers Compensation Commission relating to the salaries of the governor, the lieutenant governor, and each principal executive department head. **(SB 86)**

ELECTRIC-ASSISTED BICYCLES

Defines electric-assisted bicycles, classifies them as bicycles, and distinguishes them from motor vehicles. Gives users of electric-assisted bicycles the same rights and duties as users of bicycles. Authorizes the Department of Natural Resources to establish different standards for electric-assisted bicycles and other bicycles in a land use management plan for a public use area, recreation river, or recreational mining area. **(SCS HB 8(STA))**

USE OF DESIGNATED REFRIGERANTS AND FIREFIGHTING SUBSTANCES

Allows for use of refrigerants designated as acceptable under 42 U.S.C. 767k, if the equipment containing the refrigerant is listed and installed in accordance with the safety standards and use conditions imposed under the federal designation. Generally prohibits use of firefighting substances that contain a perfluoroalkyl substance or polyfluoroalkyl substance. Allows the use of firefighting substances that contain a perfluoroalkyl substance or polyfluoroalkyl substance to respond to a fire originating in relation to oil or gas production, transmission, transportation, or refining in the state, unless the state fire marshal adopts regulations mandating use of an alternative substance. Requires the state fire marshal to adopt regulations mandating the use of an alternative firefighting substance if the state fire marshal determines that a safe and effective alternative meeting certain specifications exists. Requires the state to accept a perfluoroalkyl substance or polyfluoroalkyl substance for disposal in certain circumstances. **(HB 51 am S(efd add S))**
