

THE JOHNSON FAMILY.

A Brief Account

OF SOME OF THE DESCENDANTS OF WM. JOHNSON, WHO SETTLED IN CHARLESTOWN IN 1634, AND OF HIS SON, JONATHAN JOHNSON, WHO SETTLED IN MARLBOROUGH, MASS., AS EARLY AS 1662,

THE JOHNSON FAMILY.

A Brief Account of some of the Descendants of Wm. Johnson, who settled in Charlestown in 1634, and of his son Jonathan Johnson, who settled at Marlborough, Mass., as early as 1662. Compiled by Cyrus Felton; including about all the Johnsons that have resided at Southborough.

William Johnson, (1) aged 32 years, left London in 1634, for America; he settled in Charlestown, Mass., where he had three and one half acres of land laid out to him the same year, in 1634. He and his wife Elizabeth were admitted to the church in Charlestown the next year, in 1635.

He was made freeman the same year, in March, 1635.

His will is dated December 7, 1677; proved in April, 1678; of course died in the interval, aged 76 years.

He names his seven children and one grand daughter, Elizabeth Bacon (3). Suppose his widow, Elizabeth Johnson, died about 1686.

Their children were John, (2), born in England about 1632, was the oldest; he had a double portion. He settled in Haverhill, Mass., and was killed by the Indians Aug. 29th, 1708, aged 75 years. The minister of the town was slain in his own house on the same day.

2. Ruhamah, (2), baptized in Charlestown in 1634; married John Knight of Charlestown and had four children.

3. Joseph, (2), baptized in C. in 1636; settled in Charlestown, Mass.

4. Elizabeth, (2), baptized in 1638, married in 1659 Edward Wyer of Charlestown. They had eleven children. He died in 1693, aged 71 years. Mrs. Wyer married again in 1697 William Munroe. She died in 1715, aged 77 years.

† 5. Jonathan, (2), born Aug. 14th, 1641, settled in Marlboro in 1662, and married Mary Newton of Marlboro the next year, 1663.

6. Joanna, a daughter, married Nathaniel

Johnson; they had two sons; she died before her father. He died in 1678, soon after his father-in-law.

7. Zachariah, (2), the fourth son, and John, the eldest, settled their fathers estate in 1678. Probably Zachariah resided at Boston in 1695.

8. Isaac, (2), the fifth son, settled in Charlestown, Mass., he was a gunsmith; his wife's name was Mary, and they had several children; their eldest son was, Eleazar Johnson. Isaac Johnson, Jr., married, had children and died before his father.

Dea Solomon Johnson of Sudbury and of Marlboro and died in Marlboro in 1687, supposed age nearly 80 years; supposed near relative of Wm. Johnson of Charlestown.

JOHNSON FAMILY—SECOND GENERATION.

Jonathan Johnson, (2), born Aug. 14th, 1641, son of Wm. of Charlestown, came to Marlboro in 1662. In 1663 the first meeting house in Marlboro was built upon the old common, and the same year, 1663, Jonathan Johnson had the "Smith lot" of thirty acres, directly south of the new meeting house, assigned to him. He soon afterwards sold the southern half, 15 acres, to Thos Barnes. Mr. Johnson married Oct. 14th, 1663, Mary Newton, born in 1644, daughter of Richard Newton of Marlboro. They were both called of this town; this was the first marriage recorded in Marlboro. Mrs. Johnson's father died in Marlboro, August 24th, 1701, "almost a hundred years old."

Mr. Johnson probably the only blacksmith in town until the resettlement after it was burnt by the Indians in the spring of 1676.

James Sawyer, a blacksmith, was in Marlboro several years before, 1700. He was living in Pomfret, Ct., in 1736.

Jonathan Johnson, the blacksmith, was employed, by the town as a school master for several years. In December, 1699, he taught in his dwelling house, before a school house was erected in town. He was the first school master, in the first school house erected in Marlboro, in 1700.

The first school master named in the Marlboro town records was Benjamin Franklin, who taught in 1696 to 1699; he probably taught here as early as 1690.

Benjamin and Phebe Franklin, had the names of two children recorded upon the Marlboro records, viz.: Mary Franklin, born July 3d, 1690; John Franklin, born Sept. 12th, 1692.

We suppose Benjamin Franklin, the Marlboro school master, was a son or a nephew of Benjamin and Katbarine Franklin, who resided in Boston from 1675 to 1682, and probably more years.

Jonathan Johnson, Sr., was paid by the town several years for sweeping and taking care of the meeting house. In 1699 he received for sweeping for one year, 13 shillings, 4 pence.

In 1711 was one of a committee of 11 to assign to the 26 garrisons in Marlboro the appropriate families.

He was one of the selectmen in Marlboro in 1711, the year that the new meeting house was built, that stood 99 years, until it was taken down in 1810.

Lt. Abraham Williams, was the first selectman in 1711, also, town clerk that year, and died the 29th of December the same year, 1711, aged 84 years. He was grandfather of Col. Abraham Williams of Marlboro, who died in 1781.

Jonathan Johnson, Sr., died the next year, April 21st, 1712, aged 70 years. Widow Mary Johnson, died Dec. 28th, 1728, aged 84 years, 6 months.

Jonathan (2) and Mary (Newton) Johnson's children at Marlboro:

JOHNSON FAMILY — THIRD GENERATION.

John Matthews, married in 1686, Mary Johnson, born Sept. 9th, 1664, daughter of Jonathan. He was called a physician; he practiced in Marlboro about 1720. The town of Marlboro every five years chose a committee of 13, to seat the meeting house. In 1722 Dr. Matthews and Dr. Isaac Bellows were of the committee. The two doctors resided in what is now Southboro. Mrs. Mary Matthews died June 22d, 1710, aged 46 years. Dr. Matthews married 2d in 1713 Sarah Garfield, born Feb. 1674. Dr. Matthews was living at Southboro in 1729. John and Mary Matthews had 6 children:

1. Mary, probably the oldest, died Oct. 2d, 1706.

2. Lydia, born March 16th, 1691, married Feb. 1713-14 Jonathan Witt; they had six children, all but the youngest one recorded at Marlboro, the oldest one also recorded at Stow. He was a land surveyor; was one of the first Deacons in Southboro, chosen in 1730. About 1741 Dea. Witt removed to Leicester, and died in L., in 1744; his will was proved Nov. that year.

- † 3. Ruth, born May 9th, 1693, married July, 1713, her cousin, Timothy Johnson.

4. John Jr., born Jan. 18th, 1694-5, married in 1718, Jerusha Bigelow, daughter of John and Jerusha Bigelow of Marlboro, had four children at Marlboro and six at Southboro.

5. Daniel, born March 16th, 1696-7, married Nov., 1724, Eunice Morse, who was baptized Sept., 1705, daughter of Samuel and Grace Morse of Marlboro, had two children recorded at Marlboro and 12 at Southboro.

6. Martha Matthews is named as grandchild of Jonathan Johnson, Sr., with the four brothers and sisters above.

William Johnson, (3), son of Jonathan, born Dec. 15th, 1665, married about 1688, Hannah Larkin; she died Dec. 18th, 1696; he married 2d about 1699, Hannah Rider.

William Johnson was highway surveyor for the west end of the town of Marlboro, in 1706. In March 1708, Wm. and his brother, Jonathan Jr., were both chosen constables. He was administrator of his brother's estate, also appointed guardian of

six youngest children of his brother Jonathan who was slain by the Indians in Oct. 1708.

He furnished the nails and lime for finishing the new meeting house that was erected in Marlboro in 1711. April 12, 1712, "Voted that Wm. Johnson provide nails and lime, and shall take four £s to pay for those already used."

Probably after his father's decease, in 1712, he resided several years upon his father's place in Marlboro, near the meeting house; for in 1717, Dec. 5th, the town allowed William Johnson, for keeping the key of the meeting house, five shillings. Mr. Johnson died at Southboro, June 5th, 1754, aged 88 years, 6 months; his widow three and a half years afterwards, Dec. 8, 1757, aged 79 years; in 1733, he had a grist and a saw mill east of his house on Stony Brook.

Wm. Johnson, (3), had 5 children by first wife and 8 by his second wife.

† 1. William Jr., (4), born Feb. 22d, 1689, married Sarah (—).

† 2. Hannah, (4), born July 20th, 1691, married Thos. Stowe, Jan. 1713-14.

3. Elizabeth, born Aug. 15th, 1693, died Oct. 6th, 1693, aged 7 weeks.

4. Thomas, (4), born Aug. 28th, 1694, died unmarried Sept. 14th, 1785, aged 91 years.

† 5. Mary, (4), born Dec. 4th, 1696, married Thos. Green, 1718.

† 6. Moses, (4), born Sept. 25th, 1700, married Sarah Bush, 1727.

† 7. Ruth, (4), born Jan. 16th, 1702, married David Woods, 1725.

8. Hephzibah, born April 5th, 1704, died Jan. 19th, 1719, aged 15 years.

9. Elizabeth, born July 18th, 1705, died Dec. 8th, 1732, aged 27 years.

† 10. Ebenezer, (4), born Nov. 6th, 1707, married Mary (—).

† 11. Mercy, (4), born Dec. 14th, 1709, suppose married Ephraim Woods, 1733-34.

† 12. Isaac, (4), born April 12th or 20th, 1713, married Rachel Thomas, 1735.

13. Jacob, (4), born April 6th, 1717, was drowned in Westboro May 28th, 1739, aged 22 years. His brother, Ebenezer, administrator; a Caleb Johnson is named in the settlement.

In 1707, Richard Barnes Sr., John Bellows

and William Johnson, all of Marlboro, appointed to state a highway from Belcher's pond (now Brigham's pond) to Cedar Swamp.

Jonathan Johnson, (3) Jr., born Jan. 2d, 1667, son of Jonathan Sr., (2), married in 1689, Mary Kerley, born Oct. 1666, daughter of Capt. Henry Kerley of Marlboro. Her mother, Elizabeth (White) Kerley, and her two brothers, Wm. and Joseph Kerley, were killed in Lancaster, Feb., 1676, at the destruction of the town by the Indians. Mrs. Kerley was the sister of Mrs. Rowlandson, the wife of Rev. Joseph Rowlandson of Lancaster. Capt. Kerley married again widow Elizabeth Howe of Marlboro; she was a widow of John Howe Jr., of Marlboro, who was slain by the Indians at Sudbury in April, 1676; she had children by both husbands.

Jonathan Johnson Jr. was a blacksmith, like his father. He was highway surveyor in 1705. In March, 1708, he was chosen constable, as was also his brother, Wm. Johnson. He was slain by the Indians Oct. 12th, 1708, on or near Jericho hill, now in Marlboro, at the age of 41 years.

In Oct., 1708, soon after Jonathan Johnson Jr. was killed, the selectmen of Marlboro called a town meeting, Oct. 25th, to choose a constable in place of Jonathan Johnson, Jr., "who was barbarously slain." John Newton, Jr., was chosen constable to fill the vacancy.

His brother William settled his estate and was appointed guardian to the 6 youngest children. Mrs. Mary Johnson died at Southboro in 1741, aged 75 years; her will dated Oct. 1740, proved July, 1741. Jonathan and Mary Johnson's children were:

† 1. Timothy, (4), born May 18, 1690; married Ruth Matthews, in 1713.

† 2. Jonathan, (4) Jr., born June 13th, 1692; married Abigail Bellows, 1723.

3. Mary, born Sept. 5th, 1694, died young.

† 4. Sarah, born March 25th, 1696, married John Bellows Jr., 1723.

5. Jotham, born March 30th, 1699, was living in 1708.

† 6. Martha, born Jan. 26th, 1701; suppose married Col. Timothy Brigham.

† 8. and 9. Joseph and Hannah, twins.

born March 2d, 1707. Joseph married Hannah Bruce, 1730.

JOHNSON FAMILY—FOURTH GENERATION.

William Johnson, (4) Jr., born Feb. 22d, 1689, son of Wm., was a highway surveyor in Marlboro, in 1714; he was a blacksmith; perhaps it was this William instead of his father, who we suppose was living on Jonathan Johnson Sr., place, near Marlboro meeting house in 1717; if so he removed before the year 1727, into what is now Southboro, as he was chosen the first moderator that year in Southboro. He was a town officer in Southboro a few years.

Wm. Johnson Jr., married Sarah _____ and had Jotham, (5); born Jan. 2d, 1715-16; was baptized in 1717.

Wm. Johnson moved to Worcester, where he died June 15th, 1757, aged 68 years; an inventory of his estate taken the same year. Perhaps this Wm. Johnson had a second wife. We find that Wm. and Mercy Johnson of Worcester had recorded at Worcester:

1. John, born March 24th, 1736.
2. Eunice, born Feb. 27th, 1737, (supposed 1738.)
3. William, born Aug. 18th, 1741; supposed at Fort William Henry in Aug. 1757.
4. Samuel, born Nov. 27th, 1743.
5. Peter, born Sept. 14th, 1746.

Thomas Stowe, born Dec., 1682, son of Samuel Stowe of Marlboro, married 1713 Hannah Johnson, (4), born July 20th, 1691, daughter of Jonathan Johnson; they had 18 children in Marlboro. Mr. Stowe died Aug. 31st, 1765, aged 82 years, 8 months. Mrs. Hannah (Johnson) Stowe, (4), died 24 years afterwards, June 15th, 1789, at the great age of 97 years, 11 months.

They lived together as husband and wife over 50 years. Children:

1. A son, born Aug. 5th, 1714, died Aug. 11th, 1714.
2. A daughter, born Aug. 28th 1715, died Sept. 1715.
3. Comfort, born July 16th, 1716, died Oct. 18th, 1716.
4. Thomas* Jr., born Sept. 8th, 1717, died Sept. 19th, 1717.
5. Benjamin, born Aug. 25th, 1718; married Mercy _____, settled at Harvard, Mass., had sons, Manassah and Benjamin Jr.

6. David, born Oct. 14th, 1719, died June 12th 1722, aged about 3 years.

7. Thomas, Jr., born Oct. 15th, 1720, married in 1752, Elizabeth Newton; he had two sons and one daughter and died in Marlboro, aged 89 years: was a weaver by trade.

8. Charles, born Dec. 31st, 1721, died June 23d, 1722, aged 6 months; Charles a name very uncommon; only ten born in Marlboro, before the Revolution of 1776; one Rice, one Brigham, one Woods, one Howe, before Charles Stowe.

9. Samuel, born Dec. 26th, 1723, married in 1748 Rebecca Howe.

He was a tailor by trade; held the office of assessor 12 years; was chosen a deacon in 1770; and a representative in Marlboro in 1778, but declined serving. Dea. Stowe died Jan. 12th, 1813, aged 89 years; his widow five years afterwards, aged 91 years.

10. Stephen, born Dec. 15, 1724, married in 1753, Abigail Smith; had several children, two first born in Marlboro, and the others in the town of Stow.

11. Josiah, born Dec. 8, 1725, died Dec. 25th, the same year.

12. Hannah, born Dec. 9th, 1726, died Jan. 4th, 1727.

13. Experience, born Feb. 24th, 1728, married in 1750, Nathan Newton of Southboro; had Paul, born 1751, Silas 1753, Louisa, 1755. Mrs. Newton died May 3d, 1755, aged 27 years. Mr. Newton married 2d, 1757, Lydia Hager.

14. David, born April 29th, 1729, married Lucy Goodnow of Westboro; they settled in Grafton, had 14 children; their oldest child Lovinah Stowe, born May 17th, 1755, married in 1775, Stephen Felton of Marlboro; were the grand parents of the compiler of this Johnson family record.

15. Josiah, born July 5th, 1730; married in 1760, Ruth Howe of Marlboro. They resided in Marlboro and had five children; he died in 1818, aged 88 years.

16. Hannah, born Sept. 8th, 1731, died Sept. 29th, 1740, aged 9 years.

17. Sabilla, born Sept. 4th, 1732, died Nov. 15th same year.

18. Silas, born Oct. 20th, 1734, died Oct. 1st, 1740, aged 6 years. In 1740 there were an unusual number of deaths in Marlboro, whole number 46. There were 40 deaths

in Southboro, from June 13th, 1740, to June 15th, 1741; and 30 of them, it is said of the throat distemper.

Thomas Green, married Nov. 1718, Mary Johnson, (4), born Dec. 4th, 1696; they had one child recorded in Marlboro and five in Shrewsbury:

Moses Johnson (4), born Sept. 25th, 1700, son of Wm. (3), married in 1727, Sarah Bush, born Oct. 27th, 1709, daughter of Abiel and Grace (Barrett) Bush of Marlboro. In 1731, he had land near Johnson's mill. They had, at Southboro, 7 children.

Mr. Johnson, (4), died March 13th or 18th, 1763, aged 63 years.

Children: 1. Moses, Jr., (5) born April 4th, 1728; he was out in the Crown Point expedition of 1756; some Moses Johnson with a family moved into Marlboro soon after, or before the Revolutionary war.

2. Aaron, (5), born April, 1731.
3. Merriam, a daughter, born Feb. 9th, 1733, died June 6th, 1736, aged 3 years.
- † 4. Hezekiah, (5), born March 21st, 1736; supposed married Lucy ———.
5. Sarah, born Nov. 26th, 1738.
6. Jacob, (5), born Feb. 6th, 1740, the next year after his uncle Jacob Johnson was drowned.
7. Jonas (5), born March 20th, 1749.

David Woods, born Jan. 5th, 1695-6, son of John, and grand-son of Dea. John Woods of Marlboro, married in 1725, Ruth Johnson, (4), born January 16th, 1702, daughter of William Johnson. In 1733 David Woods lived south of Spruce Swamp; he was chosen a deacon in Southboro in 1741; he died Feb. 16th, 1774, aged 78 years; his widow, Ruth (Johnson) Woods, died June 24th, 1798, aged 96 years.

Children: 1. David Jr., born Feb. 14th, 1727, recorded at Marlboro. Born the year that Southboro was set off and made a town.

2. Jonas, baptized in Marlboro, Jan., 1728-9; married in 1750, Elizabeth Newton, and had four children.

3. Martha, born March 1st, 1736, died Sept. 21st, 1777, aged 41 years.

4. Ruth, born May 18th, 1738.

Ebenezer Johnson, (4), born Nov. 6th, 1707; married Mary ———, and had ten children recorded in Southboro. Mrs. Johnson died Nov. 6th, 1756; the mother and three daughters died within two months that year. Mr. Johnson died Sept. 18th, 1767, aged 70 years. An inventory of his estate in November same year.

Children: 1. Elijah, born May 24th, 1733, died Oct. 30th, 1740, aged 7 years.

2. Sarah, born June 29th, 1736.
3. Mary, born March 24th, 1738, died Nov. 1st, 1740, aged 2 years.

Ephraim Woods, born May 5th, 1712, half brother of Dea. David Woods, married Feb. 1733-34, Mercy Johnson, supposed daughter of William Johnson, (3); Mrs. Mercy Woods died Jan. 18th, 1747-8. Had, at Southboro, 7 children:

Isaac Johnson, (4), born April 12th, 1713, son of Wm.; married Oct. 1733, Rachel Thomas, born March 8th, 1710. Isaac Johnson was one of the selectmen in Southboro, 1761, 1771. Mrs. Johnson died March 18th, 1794, aged 84 years. Mr. Johnson, seven years afterwards, Feb. 16th, 1801, in the first year of the new century, aged almost 88 years. They lived husband and wife 60 years.

Timothy Johnson, (4), born May 18th, 1690, son of Jonathan (3) Jr., married 1713, his cousin Ruth Matthews, born May 9th, 1693; of their children the five oldest recorded at Marlboro, and the three last at Southboro. Mr. Johnson was a school teacher and a land surveyor and one of the selectmen of Southboro, in 1732, 1741. He died June 5th 1768, aged 78 years.

Children: 1. Nathan, born Sept. 17th, 1713, was living in 1768; and the next month after the death of his father, July 1768, Wm. Collins of Southboro was appointed his guardian.

† 2. Dinah, born Sept. 25th, 1715, married Sept. 1749, Ephraim Woods, his 2d wife.

† 3. David, born Aug. 25th, 1718, married Zeruah Morse.

4. Hannah, born Oct. 15th, 1720.

† 5. Eunice, born May 25th, 1723, married Nov. 1743, Jabez Hill.

6. Jonathan, baptized in Marlboro in 1725.

7 and 8. Timothy Jr., and Ruth, (5), twins, born March 22d, 1726-7. Timothy Jr., died Feb. 3d, 1754, aged 27 years. Some Ruth Johnson married June 1773, Ithamar Bellows, who I suppose was born in 1708, son of Dea. John Bellows of Southboro.

9. Keziah, born Oct. 7th, 1736.

Jonatban Johnson, (4), born June 13th, 1692, son of Jonathan Jr., married in 1723, Abigail Bellows, born May 27th, 1701, daughter of Eleazer Bellows. Supposed Mr. Johnson was a tanner; in March 1727, he took or had additional land upon Richard Newton's right, within the cow common, near his dwelling house and tannery. They had five children recorded in Marlboro, and three at Southboro, and the eight were living in 1754. He died in Southboro, July 29th, 1740, aged 48 years.

2. Mary, born Jan. 12th, 1727.

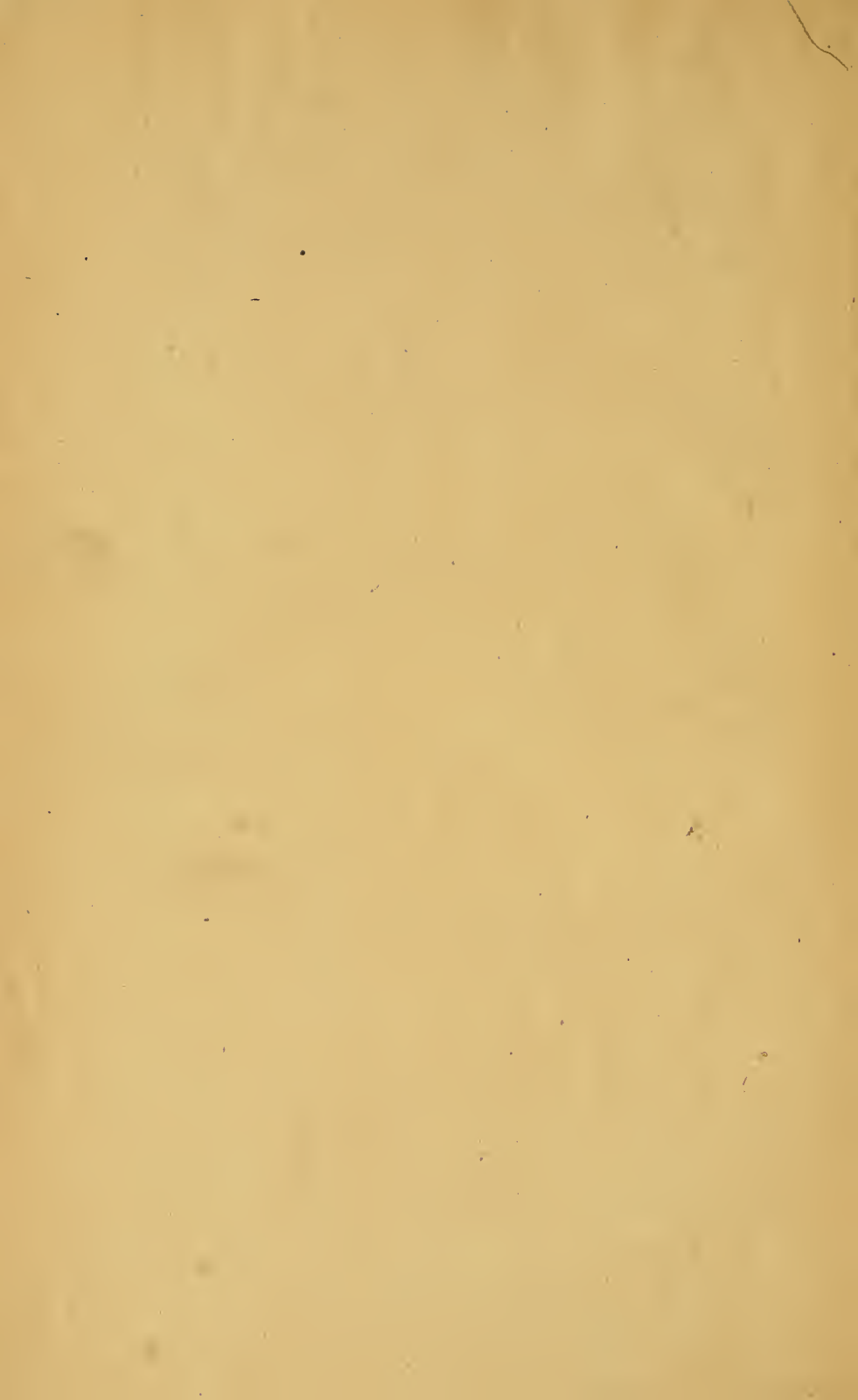

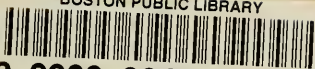
