YOUR LEGISLATORS' VOTING RECORD ON SMALL BUSINESS ISSUES | 2022 EDITION

Votes by your state legislators on key small business issues are listed here. Although this Voting Record does not reflect all elements considered by a lawmaker when voting, nor does it represent a complete profile of a legislator, it can be a guide in evaluating your legislator's attitudes toward small business. Please thank those legislators who supported small business.

HOUSE AND SENATE

- 1. Small businesses; alternative income tax (SB 1783):** Establishes an alternative income tax for small business taxpayers. **A "YES" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 16-13. Passed the House 31-25. Signed by the governor.
- 2. Revenue; budget reconciliation; (SB 1827):** As part of the budget reconciliation provisions, creates an aggregate individual income tax rate cap of 4.5% for taxable years beginning January 1, 2021. **A "YES" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 16-14. Passed the House 31-29. Signed by the governor.
- 3. Omnibus; taxation (SB 1828):** Reduces the assessed valuation of commercial property from 18% to 16% in .5% increments over two years beginning January 1, 2022. Creates a two-tier individual income tax rate structure of 2.55% and 2.98% for 2022 depending on filing status and taxable income and, if general fund revenue thresholds are met, a reduced two-tier individual income tax rate structure of 2.53% and 2.75% or a single 2.5% tax rate beginning in 2023. **A "YES" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 16-14. Passed the House 31-29. Signed by the governor.
- 4. Income tax; partnerships; S corporations (HB 2838):** Creates an entity-level income tax for partnerships and S corporations allowing for the deduction of state income taxes at the federal level. **A "YES" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 26-3. Passed the House 44-14. Signed by the governor.
- 5. Equalization assistance; class one property (SB 1093):** Reduces the assessed valuation percentage on all commercial properties in .5% increments over two years to 15% by 2027 and sets the state equalization assistance tax rate for 2022 through 2027. **A "YES" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 17-11. Passed the House 31-28. Signed by the governor.
- 6. Administrative hearings; GRRC (HB 2599):** Revises laws relating to occupational licensure, review of agency rules, and appealable agency actions including reasons for which a person may petition the Governor's Regulatory Review Council (GRRC) to request a review of an agency's final rule, an existing agency practice, a regulatory licensing requirement, or an appeal of an agency's rejection of a person's petition to review a rule or agency practice. **A "YES" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 17-10. Passed the House 58-8. Signed by the governor.
- 7. Personal property; additional depreciation (HB 2822):** Sets the valuation factor, for property tax purposes, for most classes that include personal property acquired and initially classified on or after January 1, 2022, to 2.5%. **A "YES" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 18-10. Passed the House 35-24. Signed by the governor.
- 8. Asbestos claims; required information; liability (SB 1157):** Outlines requirements for filing a personal injury claim involving asbestos exposure. Allows an asbestos defendant to obtain early dismissal where a plaintiff fails to provide facts sufficient to create a reasonable inference that the plaintiff is entitled to damages. **A "YES" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 18-11. Passed the House 35-23. Signed by the governor.
