SENATE ONLY

1. **1. Unemployment Insurance Experience COVID-19 Exclusion (2021-SF 192):** Saves employers money by excluding COVID-19 related unemployment insurance claims from an employer's experience rating and freezing taxable wages. **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed by the Senate 66-0. Passed by the House 129-0. Signed by the governor.
2. **PPP Loan Forgiveness State Tax Exemption (2021-SF 263):** Saves small businesses money on state taxes by excluding federal Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loan forgiveness from counting as income. **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed by the Senate 55-12.
3. **Individual Health Insurance Market Reinsurance for 2022 (2021-SF 694):** Extends Minnesota's reinsurance program, which reduces health insurance premiums for those who don't get coverage through an employer plan or the government, through 2022. **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed by the Senate 39-28.
4. **Governor's Peacetime Emergency Reform (2021-SF 4):** Requires the governor to obtain approval from a majority of the Minnesota House and Senate to continue a peacetime emergency beyond 30 days. **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed by the Senate 38-29.
5. **Unemployment Insurance (UI) Debt Repayment (2022-SF 2677):** Eliminates pandemic-related UI tax hikes by transferring \$2.7 billion in surplus funds to pay off UI debt and restore the UI program financial reserve. **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed by the Senate 55-11.
6. **Individual Health Insurance Market Reinsurance for 2023-27 (2022-SF 3472):** Extends Minnesota's reinsurance program, which reduces health insurance premiums for those who buy coverage on their own by 20-25% on average, through 2027. **A "Yes" vote**

supports the NFIB position. Passed by the Senate 42-24.

7. **2022 Senate Tax Bill (2022-SF 3692):** Permanently reduces Minnesota's first tier individual income tax rate from 5.35% to 2.8% and exempts additional federal COVID-19 small business relief from state taxes. **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed by the Senate 42-24.
8. **Southwest Light Rail Audit (2022-HF 3035):** Requires a legislative audit of the long-delayed and over-budget Southwest Light Rail project, the estimated cost of which has ballooned from \$1.75 billion in 2015 to \$2.75 billion in 2022. The audit will provide needed oversight and guide future legislative action. **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed by the Senate 65-0. Passed by the House 132-1. Signed by the governor.
9. **Paid Leave Insurance Policies (2022-SF 3885):** Authorizes group paid leave insurance policies in the state. This provides a voluntary, flexible option for small businesses seeking to provide or expand paid leave benefits and stands in favorable contrast to rigid and expensive paid leave mandates. **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed by the Senate 37-29.

HOUSE ONLY

1. **Unemployment Insurance Experience COVID-19 Exclusion (2021-SF 192):** Saves employers money by excluding COVID-19 related unemployment insurance claims from an employer's experience rating and freezing taxable wages. **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed by the House 129-0. Passed by the Senate 66-0. Signed by the governor.
2. **2021 House Tax Bill (2021-HF 991):** Establishes a new 5th tier income tax rate of 11.15 percent for income over \$500,000, which would be the second highest income tax rate in the country. **A "No" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed by the House 68-66.

- 3. 2021 House Jobs Omnibus Bill (2021-SF 1098):** Includes Sick Leave Mandate; establishes a new 24-week, \$1 billion, state-run paid leave program funded by a new \$1 billion payroll tax; and major civil penalty increases. **A "No" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed by the House 69-64.
- 4. Job Applicant Pay History Prohibition (2021-HF 403):** Prohibits an employer inquiring about, requiring disclosure of, or considering an applicant's pay history, with violations subject to a civil penalty, treble damages, and an additional penalty of up to \$25,000 per violation. **A "No" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed by the House 80-51.
- 5. Sick Leave Mandate, Red Tape & Penalties (2021-HF 7):** Requires all employers to provide all employees with six paid sick days per year, adds onerous new paperwork requirements, and increases employer penalties by 900%. **A "No" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed by the House 69-63.
- 6. Gas Tax & Motor Vehicle Tax Increases (2021-HF 1684):** Increases the state's gas tax by \$360 million over three years and added a permanent annual inflator, and increased motor vehicle registration fees and sales taxes by roughly \$70 million per year. **A "No" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed by the House 69-62.
- 7. 2022 House Jobs-Energy Omnibus Bill (2022-SF 4091):** Includes new energy tax to fund electric vehicle subsidies, onerous new red tape for employers, higher fines and penalties, and a new \$1 billion payroll tax to pay for a new 24-week state-run paid leave program. **A "No" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed by the House 69-62.
- 8. Southwest Light Rail Audit (2022-HF 3035):** Requires a legislative audit of the troubled, long-delayed and over-budget Southwest Light Rail project, the estimated cost of which has ballooned from \$1.75 billion in 2015 to \$2.75 billion in 2022. The audit will provide needed oversight and guide future legislative action. **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed by the House 132-1. Signed by the governor.
