

2023 Legislative Scorecard

Planned Parenthood Affiliates of California (PPAC) represents the seven separately incorporated Planned Parenthood affiliates in California, operating more than 100 health centers and serving over 750,000 patients a year. PPAC advocates on legislative, fiscal, and regulatory issues that impact sexual and reproductive health care, health equity, sexual health education, and access to affordable and quality health care, including abortion.

The PPAC Scorecard is intended to provide the public with information about how their state legislators voted on these important issues and represents the top priorities for a given year based on legislative votes and actions. The PPAC Scorecard considers a member's vote or action during a critical opportunity to vote and/or their role in procedurally holding or delaying a priority bill. The scores listed are based on California legislators' actions on a floor vote and/or in the relevant committees for the following PPAC sponsored legislation and top budget priorities: SB 487, AB 352, AB 492, AB 576, AB 583, AB 1646, AB 1707, AB 102, AB 118, and AB 119. In addition to our top priorities, PPAC supported more than 60 bills and budget items impacting Planned Parenthood patients, operations, and our mission. This includes bills related to maternal health, social determinants of health, STI and HIV testing and prevention, health care coverage and payments, foster youth wellbeing, LGBTQ+ rights, behavioral health, intimate partner violence, access to comprehensive education, and health equity.

Description of Scored Legislation

AB 352 (Bauer Kahan) Patient Privacy Protections - Enhances privacy protections for medical records related to abortion, pregnancy loss, and other sensitive services through electronic health record sharing and health information exchanges.

AB 492 (Pellerin) Behavioral Health Integration in Reproductive Health Pilot Program - Would create a pilot program to demonstrate outcomes of integrating behavioral health screenings, referrals, and services, into primarily reproductive health care settings. (2 Year Bill)

AB 576 (Weber): Medi-Cal Reimbursement for Abortion - Requires the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) to update its Medi-Cal policies to support full reimbursement for the provision of medication abortion based on up-to-date clinical guidelines and peer-reviewed scientific evidence.

AB 583 (Wicks): Birthing Justice Pilot Program - Would improve access to doula care and secure funding for community-based organizations actively seeking to support and improve health outcomes in communities with disproportionately high negative birth outcomes.

AB 1646 (Nguyen): Post-Grad training - Facilitates guest rotations in medical residency programs in California.

AB 1707 (Pacheco): Provider Protections - Builds on existing law to protect reproductive health care providers from adverse actions based on another state's hostile law.

SB 487 (Atkins and Skinner) Provider Protections - Provides additional safeguards for California abortion providers and other entities and individuals that serve and support abortion patients that reside in states with hostile abortion laws.

State Budget (AB 102, AB 118, AB 119) - Includes the largest investment in the Medi-Cal system through the renewal of the Managed Care Organization Tax and supports core programs that support equitable access to health care including funding for the UCLA Center of Reproductive Health, Law, and Policy Center.
