KNIT KIT

Yarn: Stylecraft Special DK, shades (A) 1821 Grass Green, one 50g ball, (B) 1316 Spring Green, (C) 1019 Cloud Blue, (D) 1826 Kelly Green, (E) 1001 White, (F) 1002 Black, (G) 1836 Vintage Peach, small amounts of each. Other brands of yarn in similar colours are available

Needles: 3mm Sturdy card (min): 15cm x 27cm Ruler Masking tape Safety toy stuffing Tapestry needle

ABBREVIATIONS

beg - beginning cont - continue/s DK - double knitting foll(s) - following/follows k - knit k2tog - knit two stitches together kfb - knit into the front and the back of next stitch min - minimum p - purl p2tog - purl two stitches patt - pattern pfb - purl into the front and the back of next stitch rem - remaining rep - repeat RH - right-hand RS - right side st(s) - stitch(es) st st - stocking stitch tog - together WS - wrong side



As Alphablock A is likely to be given to very young children, choose safety toy stuffing that is certified to be fire safe and free from toxins and harmful substances. Ensure your oversewing, appliqué and embroidery are all secure for this character to withstand play time.

Say hello to this lively character who, along with other letters from the Alphablocks programme, uses phonics to tell stories, make words and sing songs. Our friend Alphablock A is a little accident-prone, so don't forget to add her sticking plaster. She has been created by Sachiyo Ishii, and you'll want to get crafty with card and tape to make up the box for her distinctive shape. Follow the instructions to download the template, and use the photograph as a guide for stitching her features, and she'll be A-OK for play!

Start knitting here...

BODY

Using yarn B, cast on 14 sts NOTE: wind a small extra ball each of yarn A and yarn B, or use both tails from the same ball

Join in yarn A

□ Cast on four sts in yarn A, join in another end of yarn B, cast on four sts in yarn B, join in another end of yarn A, cast on 14 sts in A. 36 sts Keep colours correct and cross yarn at colour change to prevent any gaps forming □ Row 1 (WS): p9, k1, p16, k1, p9

Row 2: k to end
Last two rows set patt
Rows 3-15: cont in patt for
13 rows
Cut yarns A and B. Join in

yarn C, cont in yarn C only Row 16: k to end Row 17 (edge between colours): k to end

 \Box Rows 18-35: beg with a k

(RS) row, work in patt for 18 rows

Row 36: k1, k2tog, k4, k2tog, k1, k2tog, k1, k2tog, k1, k2tog, k1, a0 sts
Row 37: p7, k1, p14, k1, p7
Row 38: cast off seven sts (one st on RH needle), p15 for top front edge, cast off to end. 16 sts
Cut yarn C. With WS facing, rejoin yarn C to rem sts
Rows 39-46: beg with a p (WS) row, work in st st for eight rows
Row 47 (back edge): k to end

□ Row 48: k to end □ Row 49: p1, pfb, p to last two sts, pfb, p1. 18 sts

Rows 50-66: beg with a k (RS) row, work in st st for 17 rows

 Row 67 (edge between colours): k to end
 Cut yarn C, join in yarn B
 NOTE: letter foll instruction indicates yarn shade

□ Row 68: k5 B, k4 A, k4 B, k5 A

Keep colours correct and twist yarn at colour change to prevent any gaps forming Rows 69-82: beg with a p (WS) row, work in st st for 14 rows Carlow 83 (back bottom edge): k to end Rows 84-94: beg with a k (RS) row, work in st st for 11 rows Cast off

EYE (make two)

- Using yarn E, cast on one st Row 1 (WS): pfb. Two sts Row 2: kfb, k1. Three sts Row 3: p1, pfb, p1. Four sts Row 4: k1, kfb, k2. Five sts Row 5: p to end Row 6: k1, k2tog, k2. Four sts Row 7: p1, p2tog, p1. Three sts Row 8: k2tog, k1. Two sts Row 9: p2tog. One st
- □ Fasten off

PUPIL (make two) Cut a length of yarn F and separate two plies to use as one strand, cast on four sts Thread tail through sts, pull tight and fasten off, stitch ends tog to form a circle

PLASTER

Using yarn G, cast on four sts Row 1 (WS): p1, (pfb) twice, p1. Six sts Row 2: k1, kfb, k2, kfb, k1.
 Eight sts
 Row 3: p1, p2tog, p2, p2tog, p1.

Six sts

□ Row 4: k1, k2tog, pass first st over second (to cast off first st), cast off to last two sts, k2tog, cast off last st

CENTRE OF PLASTER

Cut a length of yarn G and separate two plies to use as one strand, cast on three sts Row 1: k to end Row 2: p to end

Cast off

MOUTH

Using yarn F, cast on 18 sts Row 1 (WS): (p2tog) to end. Nine sts Cut yarn, thread through sts, pull tight and fasten off, stitch

ends tog to form mouth

LETTER A Curved front

Using yarn F, cast on 20 sts Row 1 (WS): (p3, p2tog) twice, (p2tog, p3) twice. 16 sts Cast off

Straight back

Using yarn F, cast on ten sts Row 1 (WS): p to end Cast off

ARM (make two)

Using yarn A, cast on 12 sts Row 1 (WS): p to end Row 2: (k1, kfb) three times, (kfb, k1) three times. 18 sts Rows 3-5: beg with a p row, work in st st for three rows Row 6: k3, k2tog, k2, (k2tog) twice, k2, k2tog, k3. 14 sts Row 7: p to end
Row 8: k1, k2tog, k to last three sts, k2tog, k1. 12 sts
Rows 9-15: beg with a p row, work in st st for six rows
Cast off

LEG (make two)

Using yarn A, cast on 12 sts Work as for Arms to Row 5. 18 sts Row 6: k5, (k2tog) four times, k5. 14 sts Rows 7-14: beg with a p row, work in st st for eight rows Cast off

O MAKE UP

See panel to download the card template and construct the inner box. Join Body seams at top and sides with mattress stitch and leaving bottom open. Insert cardboard box but do not close seams yet. Sew Pupils to Eyes. Using yarn E, make a French knot in each Pupil. Pin Eyes and Mouth to Body using photo as a guide. Sew Centre of Plaster to main Plaster and pin to Body. Pin component letter pieces to upper part of Body using photo as a guide. Seam and stuff limbs and pin to Body. Remove box and sew pieces in place. Using yarn F, embroider nose with fly stitch. Using yarn E, embroider teeth in satin stitch. Using yarn D, outline eyes and embroider eyebrows, and add French knots to cheeks as freckles. Sew bottom Body seam. Using yarn D, embroider one long stitch over Arm end to divide hand.



Print or copy the template for Alphablock A's card insert onto card using tracing paper. Cut out and lightly score any folding edges with a blunt point. Fold into shape, taping one side at a time. There is no allowance for top corners, simply connect the corners with masking tape. If you feel your box is not holding its shape well, you can fill with a little toy stuffing to help.
