The Parish believe there is only one red signpost remaining, which can be found on the corner of Mulcaster / Bond Street, near the Town Church.</p> <p>St Helier does not hold a record of when the signposts were first installed. St Helier	St Helier has a sign positioned along Victoria Avenue (photo below). There is no record of the date this signage was installed.
St John	No Welcome Signs. Twinning Sign 2009
St Lawrence	N/A
St Martin	According to the Jumelage Association, St Martin installed the welcome to the Parish signs sometime between 1995 and 2005 but the exact year is no known
St Mary	Probably installed at the time of the twinning with Longues-Sur-Mer in 1985
St Ouen	No record of when the sign was installed, however it refers to the twinning and that charter was signed in May 2000
St Peter	Welcome signs installed February/March 2014
St Saviour	N/A
