Introduction

The Dean and the Deanery are financed from various sources, including the States of Jersey, the Rectorat and the Parish of St Helier. The information provided below is in respect of all information held by the Parish of St Helier and details all of the information requested in relation to both the Rectorat and the Parish of St Helier's contributions towards the financing of the Dean and the Deanery.
