What company manages the export of the materials, how are they sorted and what proportion of it is incinerated? Also, does the same company oversee this for all parishes?

Response

Monier Eco Industrie Romi manages the export of recyclables from the St Helier Municipal Services Depot via Morvan Fils shipping company, the Parish supplies a trailer plan to Morvan Fils to assist with their import documents.

St Helier Kerbside and Bringsite recyclables are brought to our recycling depot via refuse truck with the compressor plate isolated to avoid crushing the bags containing the public's sorted materials, once they have been segregated into the appropriate bins they are then baled, weighed and loaded on the shipping trailer that is stored at the depot

Approximately 5% is sent for incineration due to contamination

St Helier currently process the Parish of St Saviour's Kerbside recycling also in the same manner but they drop the materials here in their own vehicles. Monier Eco only export from St Helier (with St Saviour's recyclables) and not for all parishes.

The airport also deliver cardboard for recycling to St Helier, which is processed in the same manner.
