



2017 New Hampshire Legislative Scorecard

Overview

About Open Democracy Action

Open Democracy Action is a nonprofit advocacy organization dedicated to creating and safeguarding political equality for the people of New Hampshire. We believe this will only happen through an open, accountable, and trusted democratic government, “of, by, and for the people,” that is free from the corrupting influence of big-money politics and control.

To that end, we educate and inform N.H.'s public, and its civic and political leaders, about reforms needed to replace the current big-money political system—a system which perpetuates political inequality—with a system of people politics that encourages equality. And we support and mobilize groups, candidates, and elected officials who support the reform agenda.

The Open Democracy Action Scorecard

It is one thing for candidates to declare that they believe in open democracy and stand for political equality, quite another for office holders to vote in ways that move us in that direction. This scorecard is the first of what will be annual reports to N.H.'s citizens on how their state representatives and senators voted on these issues.

In its 2017 session, New Hampshire legislators had the opportunity to pass several bills that would have taken strong steps toward returning our state government to the people it is obligated to represent. They would have closed campaign spending loopholes, strengthened enforcement of existing spending laws, and ended the practice of political parties establishing voting districts that favor their candidates. They also had the chance to encourage every legal voter to exercise their democratic right.

We encourage all who read this scorecard to become familiar with how their elected officials voted on these bills, to urge them to support legislation that would create a more open state government, and to question and organize against those who oppose these efforts.

2017 Bills

Open Democracy Action (ODA) followed more than a dozen bills during the 2017 New Hampshire legislative session. Topics ranged from redistricting reform to voting procedures to transparency in campaign funding. Few of these were decided by roll call votes in both the Senate and House. (Roll calls provide a record of individual votes, so are essential for scorecard data.) Bills and resolutions that originated in the House (HBs and HRs) and were voted down in that chamber, were not considered in the Senate, and vice versa for bills originating in the Senate (SBs). Still, ten votes—five each in the House and Senate—provided information on which to score legislators on the issues we care about.

Senate Bills

Voting

SB 3 This highly controversial bill would require voters wishing to register and vote on election day to provide written proof of domicile. If they cannot do so, they must fill out a lengthy, confusing affidavit and agree to submit proof within a short period or be investigated and subject to criminal penalties. Supporters say the bill both prevents voter fraud and increases citizens' confidence in the integrity of elections. Opponents consider it a draconian solution to a nonexistent problem, predicting it will discourage many legitimate Granite Staters from voting. ODA opposes the bill. We feel a more sensible way to combat the perception of voter fraud is to research whether fraud is actually occurring. SB 3 passed the Senate 14-9, the House 191-162, and has been signed into law by the Governor.

Transparency

SB 33 This bill would close a loophole in election law that some independent spending groups have used to avoid registering with the Secretary of State and filing expenditure reports. It passed the Senate 14-9 with bipartisan support. Members of the House Election Law Committee, perhaps fearful of the electoral consequences of confronting powerful, deep-pocketed independent groups, retained the bill in committee, meaning it will be revisited later this year and voted on in early 2018.

Redistricting

SB 107 With a look ahead to the setting of political district boundaries that will follow the 2020 census, SB 107 would establish an independent, nonpartisan redistricting commission. The commission would replace the current practice by which boundary lines are drawn by members of the majority party—a practice which commonly gives that party electoral advantage. The bill was killed in the Senate 14-9.

Donation limits

SB 115 In New Hampshire, candidates may receive campaign donations from limited liability companies or LLCs. LLCs typically have a small number of owners, often just one. In the past, some donors have created sham LLCs, allowing them to contribute once as individuals and multiple times as LLCs. SB 115 would attribute campaign donations from LLCs to their owners, effectively preventing them from using LLCs to get around contribution limits. The bill died in the Senate 14-9.

Election law enforcement

SB 197 As amended, this bill calls for an appropriation to the Department of Justice of \$200,000 over two years for enforcement of election and lobbying laws, something that the DOJ freely admits it has not had the resources to do. The money would pay for an investigator to look into infractions of the law governing voting, campaign finance, and lobbying. SB 197 passed unanimously in the Senate but was retained in the House Finance Committee, meaning that, like SB 33, it will be revisited later this year and voted on in early 2018. The \$200,000 is contained in the 2018-19 fiscal year budget, however.

Scoring Methodology

The score that appears in the red column on the next page represents a legislator's percentage of pro-reform votes. Excused absences (**A/E**) and unexcused absences (**A/U**) were treated as anti-reform votes. Those legislators with less than two recorded votes were not scored and show **N/S** in the score column.

House Bills

Redistricting

HB 203 Like SB 107, a similar but not identical bill in the Senate, HB 203 would establish an independent, nonpartisan redistricting commission. The commission would replace the current practice by which boundary lines are drawn by members of the majority party—a practice which commonly gives that party electoral advantage. The bill was killed in the House 190-164.

HB 320 Another bill designed to eliminate partisan favoritism in redistricting, HB 320 would remove human influence from the redistricting process altogether. It calls for use of a computer model to draw state and federal district boundaries using purely nonpolitical criteria: district population size and compactness. HB 320 failed 184-161.

Transparency

HB 519 This bill would establish a bipartisan commission to study the feasibility of implementing a "clearinghouse model" for tracking political donations and expenditures. Campaign information provided by New Hampshire's current antiquated system is both untimely and difficult to interpret. The clearinghouse approach would capture contributions and expenditures in real time (as they occur) and log them in a searchable database. And because candidates would no longer need to report campaign data to the state, the clearinghouse model would reduce campaign workloads. HB 519 was voted down 192-158.

Donation restrictions

HR 7 This resolution calls on Congress to consider an amendment to the US Constitution prohibiting campaign contributions from all donors who are not themselves eligible to vote in that federal election. Given this criterion, out-of-state and out-of-district donations would be banned, as would donations from corporations, unions, and political action committees (PACs). Independent spending by SuperPACs, 501(c)(4) organizations, and other outside groups would no longer be allowed. Support for the "Real Reform Amendment" was strong among members of both parties. HR 7 passed easily 211-75. As a House resolution, the bill will not be considered in the Senate.
