What opportunities does the Erasmus+ Program offer?

- Going abroad for part of your studies
- Education in an international environment
- Integration in an international environment
- Getting to know the culture and language of a given country
- Subsidy for living costs (scholarship)

Who can apply?

- Students of full-time and part-time studies of all fields and degrees of education
- Achieving good academic results
- Knowing a foreign language at least B.2.2

Where can you go?

- European Union countries plus Iceland, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, North Macedonia, Norway, Serbia and Turkey
- Countries outside the European Union

How long is the trip?

- Long-term stay: from 2 to 12 months
- Short-term trip: 5 to 30 days (obligatory virtual component)



Step by step how to apply



- 1) On the DWM website check the list of universities we cooperate with (bilateral agreements)

- 2) Search for your Faculty and select a university from the list of available ones



- 3) Contact the Faculty Coordinator - the list can be found here

Erasmus+ scholarship



- The amount of the scholarship is specified in the financial agreement signed between the student and WUST
- Scholarship holders are exempt from tuition fees at the partner university
- Scholarship holders may receive additional funding from the City of Wrocław
- Students entitled to a WUST social scholarship may apply for additional funding



TRAINEESHIPS

What opportunities does the Erasmus+ Program offer?

- Implementation of a student internship or graduate internship in a foreign company, organization, university, etc.
- Implementation of the training program in accordance with the field of study
- Opportunity to receive funding from the Erasmus+ Program as well as additional funds from the host institution

Who can apply?



- Internships: Students of full-time and part-time studies of all fields and degrees of education
- Graduate traineeships: graduates up to 12 months after defense

Where can you go?

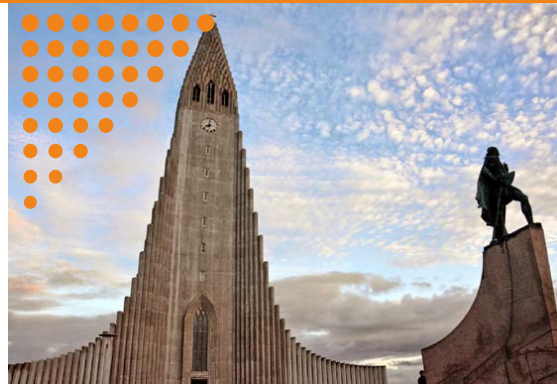
- European Union countries and Iceland, Liechtenstein, Luxemburg, North Macedonia, Norway, Serbia and Turkey,
- Countries outside the European Union

How long is the trip?

- Long-term stay: from 2 to 12 months
- Short-term trip: 5 to 30 days (obligatory virtual component)

Step by step how to apply

- 1) Use contacts and acquaintances (also from previous trips)
- 2) Search the databases of the Wrocław University of Science and Technology (also the DWM website)
- 3) Ask for help from student organizations (BEST, IAESTE, ESN, etc.)
- 4) Check the list of necessary documents

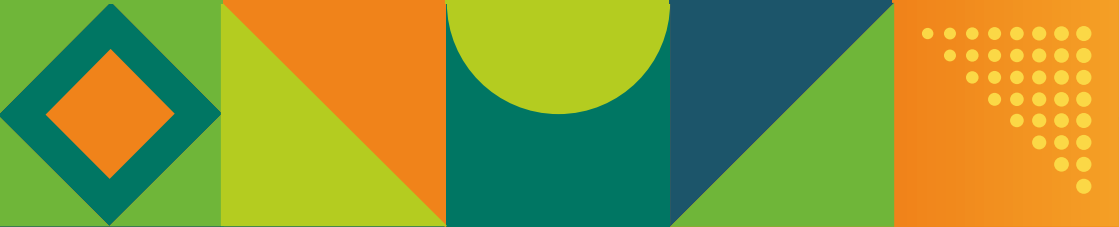


Erasmus+ scholarship
