## The downswing

The beauty (and horror) of poker is that it can mess with your head like nothing else. There is hardly any other activity where excellent performance can lead to relentless and apparently unending loss. Being stuck in a rut where you can do nothing to counteract the appalling misfortune you are experiencing can be soul destroying. Welcome to the downswing.
Every reasonably experienced poker player has been through the dreaded downswing. This is when, for a prolonged period of time, you simply cannot get your fair share of luck - or even any luck at all. Not for a hand or two, not for an hour or two and not for a day or two, it can last weeks, months, even years. Downswings happen to everybody and, unless you are extraordinarily mentally resilient, they are torture.

One evening you get A-A on four occasions and lose four big pots because, every time, some idiot hits an absurdly lucky river card. The next evening you play numerous online tournaments. On nine occasions you get the money all-in as a 55-45 favourite and lose every single one. Then you don't get a playable hand for three hours. Despite recent misfortunes, you play good, disciplined poker and await some decent cards. You then get a run of good hands and, of course, lose the lot. You think that sounds bad? We've only just started. Next week is even worse.

What can you do when you are stuck in this horror show? Well, first of all it won't help to complain. No matter how unfortunate your tale of woe there will be someone else who, in Four Yorkshiremen style, can trump it. So, take a deep breath and understand that you are not being singled out for special treatment. This happens to everybody. No one is immune. No one enjoys it but the stronger players handle it better.

Next - and this is hard - trust your game. One of the difficulties maintaining equilibrium as a poker player is that the feedback loop is awful. Excellent play often leads to horrible losses and awful play can be rewarded with big wins. Maintaining confidence in your play when results are disastrous is extremely difficult. Stuck in a downswing, it is easy to believe your game isn't working and this leads players in one of two unhelpful directions. They may become far too aggressive because their usually solid style seems to be failing. Alternatively they become too passive because it feels as though every time they played aggressively (and correctly) they suffered a horrible reverse.

Without falling prey to mindless positive thinking, it is also possible to try to extract useful information from a downswing. It could simply be horrible luck but it is sensible to be open to the possibility that there are situations where you are misplaying your hands. So study hard.

Black to play.
