





More from Monte Carlo

The world championship is not only a great tournament to play in, but it also provides huge learning opportunities for those not able or willing to make the journey to Monte Carlo. That was especially true this year because so many of the matches were streamed on YouTube.

As noted last week, the commentary team was strengthened by the inclusion of top players such as Ryan Rebelo, David Wells and Steve Sax. One of the best ways to improve your game is to watch matches with accurate and insightful commentary. I spent many hours (my wife will confirm this!) watching this year's matches.


Ideally, you should decide how you would play each move or make each cube decision before the players make their decisions. For those that you disagree with or do not understand, you can take a screenshot and then analyse the positions later using Extreme Gammon (XG). I have used this learning method for many years.

I found this week's position very instructive. Wilcox Snellings


(Black) was trailing 8-9 to 11 and had double fours to play. In my mind I quickly played 13/1*, 5/1, making a four-point home board and putting White on the bar. I was very surprised when Wilcox played 13/9, 7/3(2), 5/1*, leaving three blots exposed. What had he seen that I had missed?

After my play, Black's position is very static and the gaps on his 3 and 2-pts will be hard to fill. Wilcox's play is much more dynamic. He immediately created a strong broken prime which could quickly become a winning six-point prime. He had also taken note of the blot on White's 2-pt (Black's 23-pt). If White hits from the bar, Black may have a chance to pick up that White blot, which will increase Black's gammon chances.

Wilcox took very little time to find this difficult move and he was rewarded when White stayed on the bar. He went on to win a single game. His years of experience had enabled him to quickly find the right play. XG confirms that 13/9, 7/3(2), 5/1* is the best move and my move would have been an error. Hopefully I will use this technique to good effect in future games.

Sometimes in a game there is a fleeting tactical opportunity in what appears to be a quiet position. Here White played 1 Rd7 with the idea of 2 Qxg8+ and 3 Rb8+ mating. However, Black defended with 1 ... h6 and the game was eventually drawn. With a little more urgency White could have won. How?
