PROJECT: Intertwined Pillow Cover

PATTERN BROUGHT TO YOU BY:

Make a striking pillow cover that has the look of woven fabric by orienting one easy block four ways.

INSPIRED BY: Batik Lattice from designer Monique Jacobs (opengatequilts.com) PROJECT TESTER: Diane Tomlinson



FABRICS are from the Imperial Garden collection by Teresa Chan for Paintbrush Studio (pbsfabrics.com).



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FINISHED PILLOW: 20" square FINISHED BLOCK: 8" square

MATERIALS

Yardages and cutting instructions are based on 42" of usable fabric width.

- □ 1/4 yard solid white (blocks)
- ☐ 1/4 yard each aqua print and teal print (blocks)
- 5/8 yard orange print (pillow top, pillow back)
- □ 24"-square batting
- □ 24"-square muslin
- □ 20"-square pillow form

CUT FABRICS

Cut pieces in the following order.

From solid white, cut:

- \square 8-2½×4½" rectangles
- \Box 16–2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

From each aqua print and teal print, cut:

- \Box 4-2½×6½" rectangles
- \Box 4-2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

From orange print, cut:

- \square 2-12 $^3/_4\times$ 20 $^1/_2$ " rectangles
- $\Box 2-2^{1/2}\times 20^{1/2}$ " strips
- $\Box 2-2^{1}/2 \times 16^{1}/2$ " strips

ASSEMBLE BLOCKS

Measurements include 1/4" seam allowances. Sew with right sides together unless otherwise stated.

Press seams in directions indicated by arrows on diagrams. If no direction is specified, press seam toward darker fabric.

- **1.** Referring to **Diagram 1**, lay out the following pieces in four vertical rows:
 - □ solid white: two $2\frac{1}{2} \times 4\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles and four $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares
 - \square aqua print: one $2\frac{1}{2} \times 6\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle and one $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square
 - □ teal print: one $2\frac{1}{2} \times 6\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle and one $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square

- **2.** Sew together Step 1 pieces in rows. Join rows to make a block (**Diagram 1**). The block should be 8½" square including seam allowances.
- **3.** Repeat steps 1 and 2 to make four blocks total (**Diagram 2**).

ASSEMBLE PILLOW TOP

- **1.** Referring to **Diagram 3** for block orientation, sew together blocks in pairs. Join pairs to make pillow top center. The pillow top center should be 16½" square including seam allowances.
- **2.** Referring to Pillow Top Assembly Diagram, sew orange print 2½×16½" strips to opposite edges of pillow top center. Join orange print 2½×20½" strips to remaining edges to make the pillow top. The pillow top should be 20½" square including seam allowances.

FINISH PILLOW

- **1.** Layer pillow top, batting, and muslin squares; baste. Quilt as desired.
- **2.** Trim batting and muslin even with pillow top edges.
- **3.** Turn one long edge of each orange print 12³/₄×20¹/₂" rectangle under ¹/₄"; press. Turn under ¹/₄" again and stitch in place to make hemmed pillow back pieces. Each hemmed pillow back pieces should be 12¹/₄×20¹/₂" including seam allowances.
- **4.** Referring to Pillow Back Assembly Diagram, overlap hemmed edges of pillow back pieces by 4" to make a 201/2" square. Stitch across overlaps to make pillow back.


- **5.** Layer pillow top and pillow back with right sides together. Stitch ¼" from outer edges to make pillow cover. Turn right side out through opening in pillow back; press.
- **6.** Insert pillow form in pillow cover to complete the pillow.










