DEFENDANT-INTERVENORS' CROSS-MOTION FOR SUMMARY JUDGMENT

Pursuant to Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 56 and Local Rule 105, Defendant-Intervenors The American Legion, The American Legion Department of Maryland, and The American Legion Colmar Manor Post 131 (collectively, “the Legion”) hereby move this Court to enter summary judgment in favor of the Legion and the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission (the “Commission”) as to all of Plaintiffs’ claims in the above-captioned case. The grounds for this motion are set forth in the accompanying Memorandum of Law and the attached Exhibits. No material facts are in dispute, and, based on the undisputed facts, the Commission’s ownership and display of the Bladensburg World War I Veterans Memorial do not violate the Establishment Clause, *see* U.S. Const., amend. I. As a result, summary judgment in favor of the Legion and the Commission is appropriate.
