Previously she served as Senior Project Director at the Center for Science Diplomacy of the American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS) in Washington DC, and a high-level policy advisor to former European Commissioner for Research and Innovation, Carlos Moedas. She holds a PhD in Biomedical Sciences. from the University of Queensland in Australia and was a Global Competitiveness Leadership Fellow at Georgetown University.
