


Dance theatre performance explores a complex, often forgotten Black presence in pre-Windrush Britain.

This powerful dance performance is inspired by 19th century studio photographs of Black men, women and children.



Through dance, the show invites us to think about the connections, missing links and stories of Black Victorians hidden in Britain's archives.



The dance style blends Victorian Ballroom dance with hip hop and contemporary movement which is rooted in traditional African dance.



The show starts and ends with the cast standing still, looking at the audience. They seem to be posing for a photograph.
