

About Patois

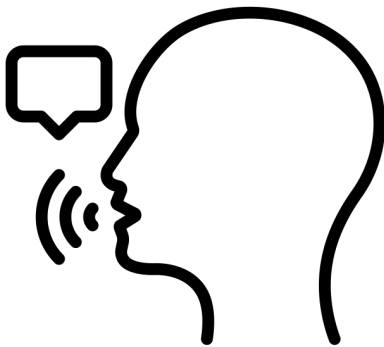


Patois is a dance show about the language of Patois.

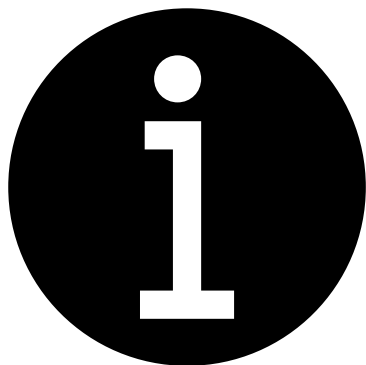

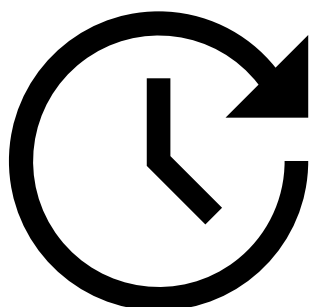
