Engl 99T is a 1-unit, credit/no credit course that gives you a reserved weekly 1-hour tutoring session with a Writing Center tutor. You'll meet with the same tutor art the same day and time for the whole semester.

Your tutor will provide you with tailored support for your writing, be a listening ear, and help you grow as a writer.

Sonoma State University Supplemental Instruction and Stretch Math Learning Communities

Supplemental Instruction (SI) and Stretch Math Learning Communities are FREE weekly, peer-led group study sessions for students taking historically difficult courses.

We target high risk courses rather than high risk students.

SI & LC sessions are open to ALL students enrolled in the course; it is not remedial.

These sessions are facilitated by SI Leaders and Learning Community Mentors (LCMs).

SI Leaders & LCMs are students who have previously done well in the course. They attend course lectures, take notes, and act as model students.

SI Leaders and LCMs help students connect "what" to learn with "how" to learn.

SI and Math Learning Communities are about active learning in small groups.

In sessions, students...

Compare class notes

Discuss readings

Develop organizational tools

Prepare for tests and exams
