What is AmeriCorps Seniors?

- AmeriCorps Seniors is part of AmeriCorps, the federal agency for volunteerism and national service. AmeriCorps provides the people power and funding to local and national partners to tackle our nation's most pressing challenges.
- Through its grantee organizations, AmeriCorps Seniors provides thousands of opportunities for adults 55 and older to serve in their communities. This includes direct service to people in need and indirect service that builds capacity within nonprofit organizations.
- Older adults of all life experiences can serve in AmeriCorps Seniors. AmeriCorps Seniors volunteers include 55-year-old individuals looking for volunteer opportunities, recently retired adults volunteering to stay active and connected with others, and 70+ year old adults who are volunteering to pass their knowledge onto the next generations.
- Some AmeriCorps Seniors volunteers may receive benefits during their service. Our stipend programs offer a modest stipend to qualified, low-income volunteers. Most programs offer accident, personal liability, and excess automobile liability insurance.



Our Stipend Programs

AmeriCorps Seniors has two programs providing modest living stipends to qualified, low-income volunteers, AmeriCorps Seniors Foster Grandparent program and AmeriCorps Seniors Senior Companions program. Foster Grandparents and Senior Companion Programs income eligibility is within 200% of the poverty line. The modest stipend is a per service hour stipend. The current amount of \$4.00 per service hour (as of April 1, 2023).

AmeriCorps Seniors Foster Grandparent Program

In the AmeriCorps Seniors Foster Grandparent Program, volunteers work in an educational or other childcentered setting. Volunteers will mentor, teach, or act as role models to young people in the local area. They may serve children who are homeless or youth at local community centers. They may assist and support students with schoolwork through one-on-one tutoring at local schools or afterschool programs or provide mentoring to teens.

Our Opportunities

- The Foster Grandparent program offers project-specific training to all volunteers and modest stipends to income-eligible volunteers to help offset the cost of volunteering.
- This is not a traditional foster experience where you host a child in your home all volunteer service happens at the service site, which could be a school or community center.

AmeriCorps Seniors Senior Companion Program

- The AmeriCorps Senior Companion Program engages volunteers in service to help older adults in their communities to live independently longer. Volunteers assist with daily living tasks such as driving to doctor appointments, supporting with errands and chores, and generally lending their company and friendship.
- The Senior Companion Program offers project-specific training to all volunteers and modest stipends to income-eligible volunteers to help offset the cost of volunteering.



Our Non-Stipend Program

AmeriCorps Seniors has one program that does not provide a living stipend to volunteers. Our AmeriCorps Seniors RSVP program is open to all adults 55 and older. There is no income restriction or requirement for the AmeriCorps Seniors RSVP program.

AmeriCorps Seniors RSVP

 Volunteers with AmeriCorps Seniors RSVP do a wide range of tasks such as recruiting and managing other volunteers, mentoring and tutoring children, supporting workforce development and training, helping with food security, providing disaster preparedness and mitigation assistance, supporting veterans and military families, and addressing a host of other critical community needs. Volunteers can lend their skills and experience to the projects they're most passionate about.

Our Opportunities

• Volunteers in the RSVP program do not receive any financial compensation, but may be reimbursed for meals, mileage, and other cost related to their service.



Benefits

- AmeriCorps Seniors volunteers are driven by their motivation to make a difference. The impact volunteers make will be felt by their organization, the community, and the individuals they are serving. Altruism is the main reason people serve with AmeriCorps Seniors.
- AmeriCorps Seniors volunteers can see the daily impact of their service as they build on skills they already have and develop new ones.
- Service can help improve the health and wellbeing of volunteers. Volunteers have experienced decreased anxiety, depression, and loneliness. 84% of volunteers report stable or improving health after one year of service.¹
- Service with AmeriCorps Seniors provides volunteers with the chance to forge new friendships and build relationships with individuals of all ages throughout their community. 88% of volunteers who felt a lack of companionship reported fewer feelings of isolation after becoming an AmeriCorps Seniors volunteer.

Volunteer Experience and Training

• Individuals interested in volunteering with AmeriCorps Seniors programs will find opportunities in their county using the <u>Pathfinder Tool</u> on the AmeriCorps website. The Pathfinder provides the name of the program, the senior program the opportunity is provided by, and contact information for the program. There is no central application for any AmeriCorps Seniors program. Interested volunteers will contact the program directly using the contact information listed on the Pathfinder.

Our Opportunities

- Volunteers will receive onsite training from their host organizations before beginning their volunteer service. The training received will depend on the volunteer location and project.
- AmeriCorps Seniors volunteers who serve in the RSVP program choose how, where, and when they want to serve, with commitments ranging from a few hours to 40 hours per week. You can find an opportunity with any of the thousands of organizations we work with that see service as a solution to local, regional, and national challenges. AmeriCorps Seniors volunteers report better health and longevity having served their community.
- AmeriCorps Seniors volunteers who serve with the Foster Grandparent Program and the Senior Companion program are required 20 service hours for orientation and an additional 24 hours for training annually.
- AmeriCorps Seniors volunteers serving with the Seniors Companion Program and Foster Grandparent program commit to serving a minimum of five hours weekly or 260 hours annually.
