What is a **Living Allowance?**

What is a Living Stipend?

AmeriCorps members earn a modest living allowance, rather than a salary or hourly wage. The amount an AmeriCorps member is paid remains consistent from one pay period to the next. The living allowance is provided to cover the cost of basic expenses while serving AmeriCorps Seniors volunteers serving with the Foster Grandparent program or Senior Companion program earn a modest living stipend, rather than a salary. Income eligible volunteers in the Foster Grandparent program and the Senior Companion program receive the stipend to offset the cost of service.

AmeriCorps NCCC & FEMA Corps



Age requirement

• Members must be 18-26 (no upper age limit for team leaders)



How you'll serve

- 10-12 months of full-time service
- Travel regionally or nationally
- Complete 3-6 different types of projects (clear trails in a national park, build homes, respond to disasters, etc.)



- Housing, meals, travel, and living allowance provided
- Limited medical benefit
- Fast track employment with FEMA, additional employment opportunities with project partners

AmeriCorps Seniors



Age requirement

• Volunteers must be 55 or older



How you'll serve

- Time commitments are flexible
- Help a struggling child to learn to read, deliver groceries to an elderly neighbor, support a family impacted by natural disaster, and more



- Benefits will vary by program, income-eligible volunteers may receive a modest stipend
- Forge new connections, improve your wellbeing

AmeriCorps State & National



Age requirement

• Members must be 17 years or older (no upper age limit)



How you'll serve

- Customizable commitment (fulltime, part-time; 3 months to 1 year)
- Serve on the project of your choice (mentor or tutor students, build a community garden, support veterans and military families, etc.)



- A truly customizable experience!
- Thousands of service opportunities in a variety of service settings (classroom, outdoors, office, etc.)

Public Health AmeriCorps



Age requirement

• Members must be 18 years or older (no upper age limit)



How you'll serve

- Customizable commitment (fulltime, part-time; 3 months to 1 year)
- Serve on a project you are passionate about (behavioral health, COVID-19 recovery, improving equitable access to care, etc.)



- Benefits will vary by project site
- Receive specialized training and start (or continue) your career in public health

AmeriCorps VISTA



Age requirement

• Members must be 18 years or older (no upper age limit)



How you'll serve

- Full-time, 12-month term; summer opportunities are also available
- Anti-poverty focus
- Professional, administrative setting (write grants, recruit, conduct community outreach, etc.)



- Eligibility for federal jobs (NCE); job opportunities with nonprofits and local governments
- Living allowance adjusted to location; members may also qualify for a relocation allowance

Find your fit

Consider these factors to find your fit



Age

Some AmeriCorps programs have limits on how old you must be to serve; others have age cut offs.

Location

Choose to serve in your community or explore a new city or region. Knowing where you want to serve can help you narrow down your service opportunities.

Time

Serve for a year or just a few months. Deciding on how long you want to serve can help you select an opportunity.

Interest

Selecting a project area of interest can help you find service opportunities that match your skills and passions.
