## A BILL ENTITLED

#### AN ACT concerning

Zoning Regulations – Uses Permitted in the R.C. 50 Zone – Plastics Recycling Facility

- FOR the purpose of permitting the conversion of former landfill sits to sustainable plastics recycling facilities; and generally relating to uses permitted in the R.C. 50 Zone.
- BY adding

Section 101.1, the definition of "Plastics Recycling Facility" listed alphabetically and Section 1A05.3.D Baltimore County Zoning Regulations, as amended

WHEREAS, more than 25% of all garbage generated in the United States consists of

discarded consumer packaging materials; and

WHEREAS, whether to meet internal sustainability goals or minimum-recycled-content standards, manufacturers are increasing their use of recycled content in consumer packaging, which will have a positive impact on the environment. However, there is an insufficient supply of usable recycled plastic to meet the demand of manufacturers for this material; and

WHEREAS, plastic recycling facilities or "polymer centers" are being developed to allow for the sorting and processing of recycled plastics and the production of high-quality recycled plastic products, including 100% post-consumer: (i) polyethylene terephthalate ("PET") flake and pellets, (ii) polypropylene ("PP") flake and pellets, and (iii) polyethylene ("PE") flake and pellets, ready for use in consumer packaging; and

WHEREAS, leaders in the environmental services industry have proposed to convert former landfill sites to sustainable plastic recycling facilities or "polymer centers" in eastern Baltimore County; and

WHEREAS, the County Council finds the proposed use to be an acceptable reuse of a landfill site and supports making the necessary amendments to the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations to allow for a more sustainable and environmentally friendly use; now therefore,

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE
COUNTY, MARYLAND, that the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations read as follows:
ARTICLE 1 – GENERAL PROVISIONS

8	C. THE MINIMUM NUMBER OF OFF-STREET PARKING SPACES
9	PROVIDED SHALL BE ONE SPACE PER EMPLOYEE ON THE LARGEST SHIFT.
10	D. SIGNAGE FOR A PLASTICS RECYCLING FACILITY
11	DEVELOPED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL COMPLY WITH THE REGULATIONS
12	APPLICABLE TO THE M.H. ZONE.
13	2. LANDFILLS ON TRACTS REDEVELOPED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION
14	SHALL REMAIN PERMANENTLY CLOSED AND SHALL NOT BE PERMITTED TO
15	DISPOSE OF ANY NEW MUNICIPAL SOLID WASTE ON SITE.
16	3. DEVELOPMENT OF A PROPERTY UNDER THIS SUBSECTION SHALL
17	REQUIRE A DEVELOPMENT PLAN, WHICH SHALL BE PROCESSED BY WAY OF A
18	LIMITED EXEMPTION UNDER § 32-4-106(B)(8) OF THE BALTIMORE COUNTY CODE.

20	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that this Act shall take effect 14 days
21	after its enactment.
