24	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF

5	(2) The beginning and ending dates of the apprenticeship; and

29	MECHANICAL SYSTEMS SERVICE CONTRACT
30	A CONTRACT FOR SERVICE OF THE FOLLOWING SYSTEMS:
31	(A) HVAC SYSTEMS, INCLUDING HEATING, VENTILATION, AND COOLING/AIR
32	CONDITIONING EQUIPMENT;
33	(B) REFRIGERATION SYSTEMS;
34	(C) PLUMBING SYSTEMS, INCLUDING PIPES, TANKS, FITTINGS, AND OTHER
35	ELEMENTS THAT CONTROL THE WATER AND GAS SUPPLY, HEATING, AND
36	SANITATION OF A BUILDING;
37	(D) ELECTRICAL SYSTEMS, INCLUDING ANY ELECTRICAL POWER AND

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15	§228-2 Exclusions.
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17	Except as provided in Subsection E, this Article does not apply to a County-financed
18	construction contract:
19	A. Of less than \$500,000;
20	B. That is subject to a federal or state prevailing wage law;
21	C. With a public entity;
22	D. To the extent that the contractor is expressly precluded from complying with this article by the
23	terms of any federal or state law, contract, or grant;
24	E. THIS ARTICLE APPLIES TO A MECHANICAL SYSTEMS SERVICE CONTRACT WITH
25	A CONTRACT VALUE IN EXCESS OF THE THRESHOLD AMOUNT CODIFIED AT 41
26	U.S.C. 6702(A)(2), THE MCNAMARA-O'HARA SERVICE CONTRACT ACT OF 1965, AS
27	AMENDED. NOTWITHSTANDING THE FOREGOING, THIS SUBSECTION DOES NOT
28	APPLY TO THE RENEWAL OR EXTENSION OF A MECHANICAL SYSTEMS SERVICE
29	CONTRACT WITH AN ORIGINAL CONTRACT DATE PRIOR TO THE EFFECTIVE DATE
30	OF SUBSECTION E.
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**SECTION 2.** AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, THAT THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT FORTY-FIVE (45) DAYS FROM THE DATE IT BECOMES LAW.
