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1	(1) Upon a determination of eligibility, the County shall provide a credit as set forth
2	in a rate schedule adopted by Resolution of the County Council and the
3	application fee shall either be applied towards the Applicant's tax account or
4	refunded.
5	(2) If the County Executive determines that the balance in the County's Watershed
6	Protection and Restoration Fund is sufficient to cover the costs that are reasonably
7	expected during the current and following fiscal year, the County Council may
8	authorize, at the request of the County Executive, an additional credit of up to 100
9	percent of the Watershed Protection and Restoration Fee for each property that is
10	subject to the fee.
11	(f) Credit Recertification for Continued Credit. In order to remain eligible for a credit, a
12	property owner shall submit a recertification application:
13	(1) Every three years; AND

16	(g) Inspections. The Department, or its designee, may enter upon any property to inspect
17	stormwater best management practices for which a credit is awarded. Credits may not be
18	awarded if a property owner refuses to permit an inspection.
19	(h) Proration. The fee shall not be prorated for a credit approved by the County during
20	the billing year and any approved credits shall be applied to the next billing cycle.
21	(i) Nonprofit Entities. A nonprofit entity that qualifies as not for profit under the Internal
22	Revenue Code may receive a credit for stormwater treated on its property under one of
23	the two following options:
24	(1) Equivalent percentage. The nonprofit entity may receive a credit that is equivalent
25	to the percentage of stormwater treated onsite; or
26	(2) Maximum percentage.
27	(i) A nonprofit entity may receive a credit of up to 100 percent of the fee if the
28	nonprofit entity:
29	a. Allows the County to enter onto its property to assess the property and to
30	advise the nonprofit entity of ways to treat stormwater to the maximum
31	extent practicable; and

1	b. Implements the improvements recommended by the County.
2	(ii) County assistance. The County may:
3	a. Award grants to nonprofit entities to assist with the payment for
4	improvements to treat stormwater to the maximum extent practicable; or
5	b. Waive the fee until work is completed and the credit is awarded.

Summary

Bill xxx-2023 removes a \$75 application fee for credit against the Watershed Protection and Restoration Fee, which is part of our continued effort to make programs more equitable and streamlined.

Background

In 2013, at the creation of the Watershed Protection and Restoration Fee, Howard County implemented a \$75 application fee for anyone applying for a credit against their Watershed Fee. This was done largely to avoid an influx of irrelevant applicants hoping to receive credit without providing appropriate stormwater treatment on site. As it turned out, applicants were more enticed by the one-time reimbursement payment toward the installation of a practice, than the credit alone. Therefore, when they applied and were approved for reimbursement, Howard County automatically awarded them the appropriate credit on their Watershed Fee without an additional application. Moving forward we anticipate receiving credit-only applications from residents participating in the Columbia Association reimbursement program and then applying for Watershed Fee credit with Howard County.

The main reason for removing the \$75 application fee is equity. The application fee is an additional cost burden to residents to merely request a credit. The fee is also an additional burden on staff time in several departments and an additional processing hinderance. Therefore, in an effort continually make our programs more equitable and streamlined, we request the removal of the \$75 application fee for Watershed credits.

Fiscal Impact

We have not collected this fee in the past because of the lack of individual credit applications to date, however we anticipate receiving residential credit-only applications in the next year to which this fee would apply.
