**ZONING BILL**

1 AN ORDINANCE concerning

2 Tobacco Shops, Electronic Cigarette Shops, or Retail Tobacco Businesses

3 For the purpose of amending the Zoning Ordinance to include reasonable parameters as to hours  
4 of operation, sign displays as a criteria for approval of Special Exceptions; amending the Zoning  
5 use tables concerning such use in Non-Residential Base Zones, Transit Oriented/Activity Center  
6 Base Zones, and Planned Development Zones, for Tobacco Shops, Electronic Cigarette Shops, or  
7 Retail Tobacco Business uses; and providing for an amortization period by December 31, 2025,  
8 in furtherance of the public safety, health, and welfare of citizens and residents of Prince  
9 George's County.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,  
18 Maryland, sitting as the District Council for that part of the Maryland-Washington Regional  
19 District in Prince George's County, Maryland, that Sections 27-5101 and 27-5402 of the Zoning

2 County Code, be and the same is hereby repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:

2 **Sec. 27-5402. Additional requirements for Specific Special Exception Uses.**

3 **(kkk) Tobacco shops, electronic cigarette shops or a retail tobacco business**

4 (1) Tobacco shops, electronic cigarette shops, or a retail tobacco business may be  
5 permitted by special exception, subject to the following:

- 6 (A) The structure in which the use is proposed shall be located at least three  
7 hundred (300) feet from any school, library, park, recreational facility, and  
8 historic site, resource, or district identified on any applicable Historic Sites  
9 and District Plan, a National Register Site, or an Historic District. This  
10 provision shall not apply to a retail tobacco or electronic cigarette business  
11 within a recreational or entertainment establishment of a commercial nature  
12 with video lottery facility uses in accordance with Section 27-5102(e)(7)(D),  
13 Recreational or Entertainment Establishment of a Commercial Nature with a  
14 Video Lottery Facility, of this Subtitle.
- 15 (B) In its final decision to approve a special exception for the use, the Council  
16 may impose other reasonable requirements deemed necessary to safeguard the  
17 health, safety, morals, and general welfare of the community, taking into  
18 account the character of surrounding properties and the general neighborhood,  
19 and any other uses on the subject property.
- 20 (C) No special exception shall be permitted for a tobacco shop, electronic  
21 cigarette shop, or a retail tobacco business located within 2,000 feet of  
22 another tobacco shop, electronic cigarette shop, or a retail tobacco business.  
23 In addition, the use shall be limited to specified daily hours of operation,  
24 which shall be between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. This provision  
25 shall not apply to a Retail Tobacco Business within a Recreational or  
26 Entertainment Establishment of a Commercial Nature with Video Lottery  
27 Facility uses.
- 28 (D) Any displays or signs with LED, bright, flashing lights, or any lights  
29 prohibited pursuant to Section 27-61503, are not permitted. Other illuminated  
30 displays or signs shall only be limited to the hours of operation for the use  
31 which shall be no earlier than 10:00 a.m. and no later than 8:00 p.m.

2 SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that to provide for a reasonable period of  
3 amortization and to prevent unreasonable economic loss, any existing Tobacco shop, electronic  
4 cigarette shop or retail tobacco business uses in all zones except for IH as of December 31,2023,  
5 may not be deemed compliant and must cease operations on or before December 31, 2025.

6 SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Ordinance are  
7 hereby declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph,  
8 subparagraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Ordinance is declared invalid or  
9 unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall  
10 not affect the remaining words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs,  
11 subsections, or sections of this Ordinance of any such invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase,  
12 clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection, or section.

13 SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Ordinance shall take effect forty-five  
14 (45) calendar days after its adoption.
