



### **BELLE VIE AT THE DRAYCOTT**

Former Belle Vie owner Vincent Samarco has partnered with Matt and Marissa Hermer to bring a pop-up featuring the restaurant's food to The Draycott, which began November 14 and runs through New Year's Eve.

Samarco, a third-generation Parisian restaurateur who has been in Los Angeles for 11 years, launched his Belle Vie French bistro in West LA in 2016, before it closed in December 2020. Samarco and the space were the subjects of an Emmy Award-winning documentary, which followed their journey through the pandemic.

Some of the highlights of the menu at The Draycott will include chicken and morel sauce, which "rose to fame at Belle Vie," F.F.F. (fresh French fries), as well as Angels' Eggs, Baked Raclette, Warm Goat Cheese Salad, Steak Entrecote and more.

"I'll be there every day with the Belle Vie mascot—my classic 2cv Citroen truck, which will be parked in front of The Draycott on all service days," Samarco said. "Some of the art that adorned the walls at Belle Vie will make a comeback, as well as the live music ambiance and piano bar that helped to make the restaurant such a home away from home for my guests."

### **BRISKET AT CINQUE TERRE WEST OSTERIA**

For one night only on Thursday, December 7, Cinque Terre WEST Osteria will feature a pre-order takeout special: prime brisket 1st cut "top quality" half brisket with mashed potatoes.

The meal, which is designed to serve six people, will include three to three-anda-half pounds, and is available for \$140.

"Cinque Terre WEST Osteria is a warm family-run Italian restaurant reminiscent of the small Mediterranean coastal villages of the Cinque Terre region," according to its website. "We serve authentic regional Ligurian dishes, using locally sourced food, specializing in fresh seafood, daily housemade pastas, fatto a mano (made-by-hand) pizza dough and delizioso cornetti (Italian croissants)."

Owners Gianbattista "Gianba" and Marlo Vinzoni have lived in the Lower Las Casas neighborhood for nearly 20 years.

### **SEASONAL SIPS**

Coffee shops across Pacific Palisades are offering their takes on holiday-time drink specials.

At Alfred in Palisades Village, in addition to its regular menu, there is also a Pumpkin Slice Latte, available iced or hot, Pumpkin Slice Matcha Latte, also available iced or hot, and a Pumpkin Slice Cold Foam—all in collaboration with the "Thanksgiving" movie, which released in theaters November 17.

"The magic all starts with our housemade pumpkin sauce, a special blend of 100% real pumpkin puree, brown sugar, apple cider, vanilla, cinnamon, allspice, and clove, topped with your choice of milk and espresso," read a description for the Pumpkin Slice Latte on Alfred's website.

The pumpkin drinks will be available through the end of November, with Alfred launching holiday drinks on December 1. The holiday menu includes an OatNog Latte, Mint Mocha and Mint Cocoa Cold Foam.

"The weather outside might be frightful, but our new Mint Cocoa Cold Foam is so delightful," read a description. "Your choice of milk blended with a festive peppermint syrup and dark cocoa powder, rec-



ommend pairing with a cold brew, iced americano or iced matcha americano."

Over at Starbucks, which has two locations in the Palisades (The Village and The Highlands), pumpkin season has come to an end, but with that comes the arrival of holiday beverages.

This year's holiday drinks at Starbucks include Peppermint Mocha, Caramel Brulée Latte, Chestnut Praline Latte and, for the first time, the Iced Gingerbread Oatmilk Chai.

ith plenty of activities to choose from, Palisadians can consider adding these festive events, experiences and performances to their holiday-time to-do list.

### **PALISADES-MALIBU** YMCA TREE LOT

As the holiday season arrives in Pacific Palisades, so do a variety of fresh Christmas trees.

Palisadians can get theirs from Palisades-Malibu YMCA's annual Christmas Tree Lot at Simon Meadow, which opens December 1 at 3 p.m.

Palisades-Malibu YMCA has been providing community members with fresh trees for years.

"Generations of kids, parents, neighbors and friends have come to buy a tree and celebrate the season," according to a previous poster.

The sale of trees acts as a major fundraising event for the YMCA, helping provide programs and financial assistance to families in need, and beyond.

The 2023 selection includes a variety of trees, like nobles, Nordmann and Silvertips, ranging from table-top size to 14 feet. Special decorative items will also be available for sale, including wreaths, wooden reindeer and garland by the foot.

The lot is open Monday through Friday from 3 to 7 p.m., as well as Saturdays and Sundays from 11 a.m. to 7 p.m.

"After decades, [HoHoHo!] remains one of the most heartwarming Palisades traditions—a free holiday family festival built for the community by the community," Palisadian Lou Kamer said to 90272 Magazine. "It exists to watch kids jump up and down when Santa and Mrs. Claus arrive on the Station 69 fire truck, or when proud parents watch their kids dance and sing on an outdoor stage amidst a Christmas

tree forest."

One lucky Palisadian family will also have the opportunity to ride atop LAFD Station 69's fire truck with Santa Claus and local firefighters during this year's event. Event organizers invited the community to enter the raffle for a chance to win.

Raffle tickets, which are \$40, can be purchased in-person at Palisades Branch Library or at the YMCA Christmas Tree Lot at Simon Meadow.

Raffle tickets are on sale now through Thursday, December 7. All proceeds will directly benefit the YMCA Food Distribution Program.

### THEATRE PALISADES 10TH ANNUAL CHRISTMAS RADIO SHOW

The Theatre Palisades Actors' Troupe will host its 10th Annual Christmas Radio Show on Wednesday, December 13, at Pierson Playhouse.

This year, actors will present Charles Dickens' "A Christmas Carol," a reenactment of a 1940's radio show.

### WESTSIDE BALLET'S 'THE NUTCRACKER'

Celebrating its 50th anniversary, Westside Ballet of Santa Monica's holiday-time ballet "The Nutcracker" will return to the stage this year with several Palisadian dancers.

"As we celebrate Westside Ballet's remarkable 50th anniversary production, we honor our legacy through the exceptional artistry of our star alumni," Producer and Westside Ballet President Judith Meister said in a statement.

Three Westside Ballet alumni—Tiler Peck, and Palisadians Lucia Connolly and Lyrica Woodruff—will each take center stage as the Sugar Plum Fairy.

Westside Ballet's late Co-Founder Yvonne Mounsey first brought "The Nutcracker" to Los Angeles in 1973, adding her own choreography—today, the company's rendition of the ballet is Southern California's longest-running production.

From 1973 to 2011, Mounsey oversaw Westside Ballet's annual performances of the show, teaching dancers the same choreography and techniques she learned directly from George Balanchine. The show is a close rendition of Balanchine's classical ballet, which was an homage to the original story—first danced in 19th century Russia.

Set to the score of Tchaikovsky led by The Santa Monica College Symphony Orchestra, this year's production will feature over 107 dancers, 225 costumes and four "lavishly designed" scenes.

"This year's 'Nutcracker' is poised to be an unforgettable journey into the enchanting world of dance, art and magic, blending the spirit of tradition with the brilliance of our talented performers," Meister added.

Show times are Saturday, November 25, at 1 and 5 p.m.; Sunday, November 26, at 1 and 5 p.m.; Saturday, December 2, at 1 and 5 p.m.; and Sunday, December 3, at 1 and 5 p.m.

### **PACIFIC PALISADES WOMAN'S CLUB**

### What is Pacific Palisades Woman's Club and what is some of the work that it does?

PPWC is a nonprofit organization that has been serving the Palisades community since 1925. Our focus is enhancing the quality of life in the Palisades through education, recreation, beautification, community service and charitable causes.

We volunteer with Meals on Wheels, host an annual 90th birthday party, have a robust grant program and give annual scholarships to students at Palisades Charter High School.

This year we hosted a Red Cross Blood Drive, and they received over 40 pints of much-needed blood. We also hosted a flu shot clinic and gave 90 people free vaccinations.

### What did PPWC work to support in particular in 2023? Is there a standout moment of giving back to highlight?

All of the money we raise is given away to local organizations, and we try to spread it around in a meaningful way. In 2023 we resumed having an in-person grant night and were able to hand out checks to 25 organizations—everyone that applied. This was definitely a highlight and set the tone to begin raising funds for 2024.

The board was challenged with the task of raising even more funds than last year. Our directors of fundraising and events have been extremely creative in planning new events that suit their style and creativity. Such as the silent auction that Bruce Lurie Gallery generously hosted for us, and the Holiday Gift Bazaar that had a unique and sophisticated group of vendors—definitely not your Grandma's holiday boutique.

### How can people in the community support PPWC?

Well, if you are a woman, then we invite you to join us. We have a great time together doing all of these wonderful events together and more.

I would like to ask the community to please help in supporting our fundraisers if they are able. If you are unable to attend, we welcome any donations as well.

#### **RESILIENT PALISADES**

### What is Resilient Palisades and what is some of the work that it does?

Resilient Palisades is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit embodying a local, neighborhood response to the climate crisis. We bring neighbors together to work in teams on the climate issues we care about. We work with students, local businesses and institutions, and other community members to help Pacific Palisades reduce our collective ecological footprint and promote sustainable ways of living.

Currently, we have six teams: Clean Energy (group purchasing of solar and battery storage), Vegan Solutions, Zero-Waste, Clean Air and Water - Green Gardens (working on reducing gas leaf blowers in our community), Water Sages, and Green Banking.

### What did Resilient Palisades work to support in particular in 2023? Is there a standout moment of giving back to highlight?

This year we would like to highlight the incredible work of our Clean Air and Water -Green Gardens team, led by

Janice Crystal, Susan Fairbairn, Susie Fitzgerald, Sheda Morshed and Gail Wirth, who partnered with local gardeners to reduce the number gas leaf blowers in the Palisades.

In 2023 the team funded and purchased the highest quality commercial gas-free leaf blowers and batteries for 45 Palisades gardeners. Upward of 800 families and their neighbors will be positively impacted by healthier and quieter yard work.

This was accomplished through generous angel donors, our fundraising campaign that connected Palisades gardeners with their homeowners, and painstakingly enrolling each gardener in the state's CORE voucher program. Many of





the gardeners were able to purchase additional batterypowered equipment on their own, such as hedge trimmers and lawn mowers, because of

the voucher program.





towels, full-sized toiletries, socks, T-shirts, etc.





# Comfort and Joy: Four Holiday Pizzettas

Palisadian Ruth Laurent-Kocher gives "inspiration for creating healthy home-cooked food every day," including holidays.

retty much anything can work on a flatbread-or as I call it, a pizzetta—but for a holiday theme, I wanted to bring together a range of colors and flavors that celebrate the season and feel a little more indulgent than everyday food.

These four delicious pizzettas are fabulous, festive food to serve your friends or family at a holiday party or as a fun pass-around appetizer pre-dinner. Each treats us with a different tasty cheese, seasonal fruit, nuts and toppings—a range of sweet and savory to celebrate that will bring a little comfort and joy.

They are super easy to make and quick to cook; just be sure to give yourself the time to prepare everything. I would put 45 minutes to one hour aside to prep and assemble (pop on some holiday music and pour yourself a drink) and 15 minutes to cook. The great thing is they can be pre-prepared earlier in the day, and assembled and cooked as needed.

You can quickly adapt to your tastes or diets, too. I have included one using prosciutto, but this could easily be substituted with thin slices of mushrooms for a full menu of vegetarian pizzettas. Gluten-free adaptations work, too, if you know where to buy a good gluten-free pizza or flatbread base.

The ingredients listed below make one large pizza base or two small ones for each type of pizzetta and serve six to eight people—double up for more significant numbers.

### Prepare:

- 1. Preheat oven to 400 degrees and make the only two items that need to be cooked in preparation. First, the Roasted Cranberries: place the six ingredients listed below in a baking dish, and bake for 15 to 20 minutes until soft and sticky. As they bake, cook the Caramelized Pears. Slice the pears and red onion, and sauté with the thyme in a shallow frying pan for five minutes. When ready, take the cranberries out of the oven and stir well, then take the pears off the heat and put both to one side.
- Take four large plates or serving dishes/platters, and lay out the ingredients and the garnishes you will use for each pizzetta, as detailed below. (This may seem unnecessary at first, but it really helps an efficient assembly.)

4 large (or 8 small) precooked pizza bases, flatbreads or naan breads

### Roasted Cranberry, Almond and Goat Cheese

- Roasted Cranberry (bake in oven in dish)
  - 1 cup fresh cranberries
  - 2 tsp maple syrup
  - 1 chopped leek, white part
  - 1 tsp balsamic vinegar

- ½ tsp dried thyme
- ○¼ tsp ground salt
- 4 oz plain goat's cheese
- 1 cup of sliced almonds Garnish before serving with a few fresh arugula leaves and pomegranate arils/seeds.

### Caramelized Pear, Walnut and Gorgonzola

- Caramelized Pears (sauté in a pan)
  - 2 tbsp butter
  - $\circ$  1 pear, cored and thinly sliced
  - ½ red onion, very thinly sliced
  - ½ tsp fresh or dried thyme
- ½ pack gorgonzola/blue cheese, crumbled or sliced thinly
- ¼ cup coarsely chopped walnuts
- Drizzle of honey and olive oil Garnish before serving with a few fresh arugula leaves and a squeeze of lemon.

### Raspberry, Pecan and Baked Brie

- 4 oz brie cheese, thinly sliced and rind removed
- 1/3 cup raspberry jam or preserves
- 1 cup fresh raspberries
- 1 tsp dried rosemary, chopped
- 1 cup pecans, halves or pieces
- Shake of ground cinnamon Garnish before serving with a drizzle

of honey.

### Fig, Prosciutto and Melted Mozzarella

- 4 oz fresh mozzarella cheese, sliced into thin rounds
- 5-6 fresh figs, sliced into thin rounds
- 6-8 thin slices (one packet) prosciutto
- Salt and freshly ground pepper Garnish before serving with fresh basil leaves and a drizzle of thick balsamic syrup.

### **Directions:**

- 1. Heat the oven to 400 degrees and lightly oil the bases, flatbreads or gluten-free alternatives, and arrange the toppings on each pizzetta.
- Bake on a tray for 10 to 15 minutes. Check to make sure the bases of the pizzas do not burn; the top should be starting to brown or bubble.
- Take out of the oven, add garnish to each one.
- 4. Use a pizza slicer to cut into slices, strips or bite-size pieces, and serve.



Other items that can be used for gift wrapping include magazines and maps, as well as reused wrapping paper.

### **MEAT-FREE SIDE DISHES**

Depending on who will be sitting around the table, the holidays might not be the time to go full vegan—but you don't have to go all or nothing to still create a more sustainable tablescape.

According to the U.S. Department of Agriculture, more than 46 million turkeys are eaten on Thanksgiving Day alone, while, according to a report by The Washington Post, nearly 25 million pounds of ham are consumed.

The effects eating meat has on the environment are widely reported, including directly producing greenhouse gas emissions and requiring more land and/or resources than other plant-based foods.

This year, my family will be partaking in a semi-vegetarian Thanksgiving: Our menu includes a turkey, but we will have vegetarian options, including a vegetable pot pie, figs in a blanket, butternut squash soup and stuffing.
