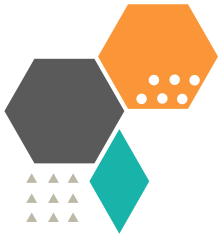
After the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020, many of STAR's legislative priorities for the 2020 Regular Session were put on hold as our elected officials decided to temporarily adjourn as our state was dealing with the impacts of the public health crisis. As a result, few of our legislative priorities were able to make it to the Governor's desk. These included, ACT 272 by Representative Aimee Freeman, which required teachers to receive annual training on mandatory reporter obligations and ACT 269 by Representatives Edmond Jordan and Barry Ivey, which prohibited nonconsensual pelvic or rectal exams. Since so few of our priorities were able to make it to the finish line, we decided it would not be helpful to have a scorecard for the 2020 regular session.

Key House Bills

Louisiana Legislature, 2021 Regular Session



HB 7

Rep. Aimee Adatto Freeman, New Orleans, LA

This bill exempts feminine hygiene products and diapers from state sales taxes. STAR supported HB 7.

Status: Signed by the Governor

HB 379

Rep. Ed Larvadain, III Alexandria, LA

This bill allow punitive damages for sexual assault that occurs in the workplace. STAR supported HB 379.

Status: Signed by the Governor

HB 12

Rep. Malinda White, Bogalusa, LA

This bill would allow people to donate a portion of their state income tax return to Sexual Trauma Awareness and Response (STAR) organization. STAR supported HB 7.

Status: Signed by the Governor

HB 382

Rep. Candace N. Newell, New Orleans, LA

This bill would prohibit discrimination in education, employment, public accommodations, and housing based on natural and protective hairstyles. STAR supported HB 382.

Status: Failed House Final Passage

HB 55

Rep. Aimee Adatto Freeman, New Orleans, LA

This bill allows survivors to apply for protection orders by written affirmation rather than an affidavit, which requires a notary. STAR supported HB 55.

Status: Signed by the Governor

HB 439

Rep. Candace N. Newell, New Orleans, LA

This bill would prohibit employers from requiring employees to sign a contract mandating forced arbitration for sexual harassment before any claim would arise. STAR supported HB 439.

Status: Failed Committee

HB 234

Rep. Barbara Carpenter, Baton Rouge, LA

This bill appoints a member of STAR to the Louisiana Sexual Assault Oversight Commission. STAR supported HB 234.

Status: Signed by the Governor

HB 492

Rep. Jason Hughes, New Orleans, LA

This bill eliminates the prescriptive period to file civil claims for sexual abuse of a minor. It also opened up a three year period to file civil claims for minors that have previously prescribed. STAR supported HB 492.

Status: Signed by the Governor

HB 375

Rep. Aimee Adatto Freeman, New Orleans, LA

This bill allow sexual assault to be included as a reason for early lease termination. STAR supported HB 375.

Status: Signed by the Governor

HR 148

Rep. Barry Ivey, Baton Rouge, LA

This resolution requested the Louisiana Sexual Assault Oversight Commission to study and make recommendations concerning access by adult survivors of sexual assault to their records related to forensic medical examinations. STAR supported HR 148.

Status: Signed by the Speaker of the House



Key Senate Bills

Louisiana Legislature, 2021 Regular Session



SB 61

Sen. Troy Carter, New Orleans, LA

This bill would prohibit discrimination in employment based on natural and protective hairstyles. STAR supported SB 61.

Status: *Pending House Final Passage*

SB 156

Sen. Beth Mizell, Franklinton, LA

This bill would prohibit transgender students from playing on sports teams that matches their gender. The bill also set up a way for people to enforce the law by "challenging" an individual's gender. STAR opposed SB 156.

Status: *Vetoed by the Governor, House failed to override the Governor's veto*

SB 211

Sen. Katrina Jackson, Monroe, LA

This bill requires in-service training for teachers and certain other school personnel on adverse childhood experiences and trauma-informed education. STAR supported SB 211.

Status: *Signed by the Governor*

SB 230/HB 409

**Sen. Beth Mizell, Franklinton, LA/
Rep. Aimee Adatto Freeman, New Orleans, LA**

These bills specifically define who is required to report power-based violence on university campuses and mandate discipline for those who must report but fail to do so. It would also require annual reports for power-based abuse incidents on campus and provide further compliance measures. STAR supported SB 230 and HB 409.

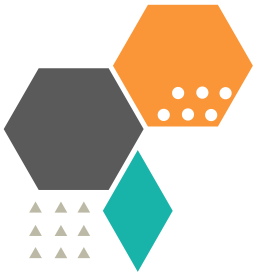
Status: *Signed by the Governor*

SB 232

Sen. Regina Barrow, Baton Rouge, LA

This bill creates the LA Power-Based Violence Review Board to serve as an advisory board to higher education institutions in issues related to Title IX. STAR supported SB 232.

Status: *Signed by the Governor*

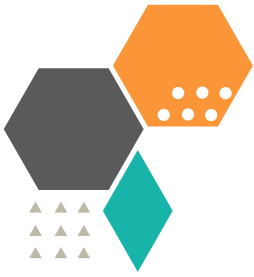


Legislative Champions



REPRESENTATIVE AIMEE ADATTO FREEMAN

Representative Aimee Adatto Freeman serves District 98 in the Louisiana House of Representatives. During the three legislative sessions of 2020 and two legislative sessions of 2021, Representative Freeman has passed multiple bills to serve the women and children of Louisiana. Her notable legislation includes Act 449 and Act 138 to end the Pink Tax on menstrual products and children and adult diapers. Her legislation also serves survivors of sexual assault and domestic violence, including Act 1 of the 2021 regular session (HB 375) to allow survivors of sexual assault to break their leases early due to sexual assault, Act 409 to reform college Title IX reporting, and Act 394 to allow victims of violence easier access to temporary restraining orders. Aimee is dedicated to addressing the needs of her community and has been a tireless advocate for survivors in our state. For all of her work to prevent sexual violence and support survivors, STAR is awarding Representative Freeman with the Legislative Champion Award.



Legislative Champions



REPRESENTATIVE JASON HUGHES

Representative Jason Hughes serves as a member of the Louisiana House of Representatives representing House District 100 in New Orleans. Throughout his career, he has been cited as a pragmatic, strategic thinker and consensus builder, with a keen ability to build strong, effective bipartisan relationships and is considered an expert public policy researcher and legislative strategist. Representative Hughes is a strong advocate for education and is committed to early childhood, K-12, and higher education and student success. His notable legislation includes HB 411 which provided a comprehensive revision of student disciplinary measures, HCR 20, which urged and requested the Governor to appoint more women to public postsecondary education boards, and HB 492, which eliminated the prescriptive period for civil actions for sexual abuse of minors. Representative Hughes serves on numerous boards and commissions and is an active member of several international organizations. For all of his work to support survivors and his effort to pass HB 492, STAR is awarding Representative Hughes with the Legislative Champion Award.

Senator Peacock (SP): So verbal...someone using locker room talk...would that...

Morgan Lamandre (ML): I don't know what locker room talk is, so you are going to have to be specific. ...

SP: We have a motion by Senator Fields to report HB 379 favorable, which I am going to offer a substitute motion to defer and the reason why is that I don't want to see our state go into punitive damages.

ML: We have punitive damages, with all due respect, for quite a number of things...

On HB 379 in the Senate Committee on Judiciary A
June 1, 2021

This bill, is to give some sense of justice and closure to children that have been maliciously and heinously robbed of their innocence. PERIOD. That is all I am trying to do. They were robbed of their voice. I did not seek this bill. In many ways it sought me. And members, all I am seeking to do is give the voiceless some sense of justice...some sense of closure. ... Members, this bill is on behalf of every victim and survivor of child sexual abuse. We owe it to them, and I would ask you to concur in the senate amendments.

Survivor Advocacy Day

June 1, 2021



More than 50 survivors of interpersonal and systemic violence, victims' loved ones, allies, and representatives of victim advocacy organizations gathered in Baton Rouge for the first Louisiana Survivors of Violence Lobby Day. Thank you to Louisiana Survivors for Reform for coordinating all our organizations to connect with lawmakers about ways to invest in crime prevention strategies, resources for directly impacted communities, and how to make Louisiana's Capitol a more trauma-informed and welcoming place to share their stories. STAR was one of many organizations to participate in the event. Also, thank you to Katie Hunter-Lowrey for sharing your photos for STAR's legislative scorecard.



Louisiana State Senate

STAR counted floor votes of legislators present on final passage in the regular session for all of the bills factored in the scorecard with the exception of SB 156. For SB 156, we only counted the vote during the veto session. For SB 230 and HB 409, we counted both votes as one. So, if a senator was at least present and voting in support of either SB 230 or HB 409, then they were given the points for that score. There was only one senator absent during final passage for both SB 230 and HB 409, so that was marked as an absence. If a senator scored 100% on the scorecard, was present during the veto session, and did not vote for SB 156 during the regular session, then they were designated a Rock STAR. If a senator scored 100% on the scorecard, but voted for SB 156 during the regular session, then they were designated a Shining STAR. If a senator scored 100%, but was absent for both the regular and veto sessions for SB 156, then they were designated a Shining STAR. If a senator scored between 90-99%, then they were designated a Rising STAR.

Louisiana House of Representatives

STAR counted floor votes of legislators present on final passage for the majority of the bills factored in the scorecard with the exceptions of SB 156, HB 439, and HB 492. For SB 156, we only counted the vote during the veto session. For SB 230 and HB 409, we counted both votes as one. So, if a representative was at least present and voting in support of either SB 230 or HB 409, then they were given the points for that score. For HB 7, we used the votes during final passage and to adopt the conference committee report as one vote. Representatives that voted against HB 7 during one of those votes were not given credit as being in support even if they did vote in support during one of those votes. For HB 379, we counted the vote on final passage and to adopt the conference committee report. The House Labor and Industrial Relations Committee votes on HB 439 were factored into the overall score of those members present and voting during the committee hearing since the bill was not reported favorably. For HB 492, we only counted the vote to suspend the rules to take up and consider the conference committee report on the same day it was received. We know that this vote was likely political in nature and not an accurate reflection of how legislators truly felt about the issue. However, since the vote was so close and it realistically could have killed the bill, we felt it was necessary to showcase this vote rather than the votes on final passage or to adopt the conference committee report. If a representative scored 100% on the scorecard, was present during the veto session, and did not vote for SB 156 during the regular session, then they were designated a Rock STAR. If a representative scored 100% on the scorecard, but voted for SB 156 during the regular session, then they were designated a Shining STAR. If a representative scored between 90-99%, then they were designated a Rising STAR.
