HB 1620: SUPPORT - Elections, State Board of; membership, appointment of Commissioner of Elections. (identical to SB 1455) Reorganization of BOE. Vetoes - Senate vote 2/22/19

HB 1934: OPPOSE - Electric vehicle charging stations; operation by certain state agencies. Allows certain state agencies to locate and operate a retail fee-based electric vehicle charging station. [We oppose state owned businesses] - Senate vote 2/20/19

[HB 1970](#): SUPPORT - Telemedicine services; payment and coverage of services.(Identical to SB 1221) - Senate vote 2/11/19

[HB 2107](#): SUPPORT - Public schools; provides for parental review of certain anti-bullying and suicide prevention materials. [Parents' Rights] - Senate vote 2/18/19

[HB 2260](#): SUPPORT - Health insurance; catastrophic health plan. (identical to SB 1027) Vetoed - Senate vote 2/15/19

[HB 2269](#): SUPPORT - Regional transportation sector emissions programs; participation by Commonwealth. The bill provides that the Commonwealth shall be allowed to participate in such a regional transportation sector emission program if the House of Delegates and the Senate of Virginia each adopt a resolution by two-thirds vote that specifically references and approves the regulatory text proposed for adoption by a state agency. [TCI - The 'Transportation and Climate Initiative' establishes a carbon fuel tax] The bill was vetoed, but language was inserted (and approved) in the budget. Vetoed - Senate vote 2/12/19

[HB 2270](#): SUPPORT - Incarcerated aliens, certain; release from jail, requires notice to Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE). Vetoed - Senate vote 2/18/19

[HB 2441](#): OPPOSE - Special DMV identification card without a photograph; fee, confidentiality, penalties. (Unacceptable religious exception and could put Photo ID required to vote at risk in the future) - Senate vote 2/13/19

[HB 2457](#): SUPPORT - Medicine, osteopathy, podiatry, or chiropractic, practitioners of; inactive license, charity care. - Senate vote 2/18/19

[HB 2611](#): SUPPORT - Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative; (RGGI- a cap and trade tax scheme) Prohibition on participation by Commonwealth without GA approval. The bill was vetoed, but language was inserted (and approved) as part of the budget. Vetoed - Senate vote 2/13/19

[SB 999](#): (Senate only) - OPPOSE - Virginia Grocery Investment Program and Fund; created, report, effective clause. (VA Taxpayers are not a bank) - Senate vote 1/21/19

[SB 1079](#): OPPOSE - Minimum wage; exemptions. Eliminates the exemptions to Virginia's minimum wage requirements for newsboys, shoe-shine boys, babysitters who work 10 hours or more per week, ushers, doormen, concession attendants, and cashiers in theaters. The measure contains technical amendments. [A minimum wage increase] This bill is identical to HB 2473. - Senate vote 1/18/19

[SB 1156](#): SUPPORT - Sanctuary policies; policies prohibited that restrict enforcement of federal immigration laws. Vetoed - Senate vote 1/17/19

[SB 1200](#): (Senate only) - OPPOSE - Minimum wage increases to \$15 per hr. - Senate vote 1/21/19

[SB 1236](#): (Senate only) - SUPPORT - Public schools; teachers equal access to all education employee associations, etc (Teachers choice) - Senate vote 1/22/19

[SB 1256](#): SUPPORT - Income tax, state; subtraction for gain from taking by eminent domain. - Senate vote 1/30/19

[SB 1496](#): (Senate only) - OPPOSE - Installed Solar Energy Equipment Program Grant Fund; created. - Senate vote 2/5/19

[SB 1717](#): (Senate only) - OPPOSE - Commonwealth Care Health Benefits Program; association health plans for individual market. New state run HC program - Senate vote 2/5/19

[SJ 284](#): (Senate only) - OPPOSE - United States Constitution; ratifies Equal Rights Amendment. Senate vote - 1/15/19
