- 8. Multiple page entries must be stapled in the top left hand corner.
- 9. One copy of this entry form must be filled in and stapled to each entry.
- 10. The signed declaration testifying to the authenticity of the work and *The Advertiser's* right to publish the entry must accompany the piece.
